

## TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME AUTHORITY AS SERVICE

Since we are in college football season, I wanted to start this weekend's reflection with a story about children and the games they play in today's world. In his book *Hide or Seek*, James Dobson tells of a time when John McKay, the great football coach at the University of Southern California, was interviewed on television about his son's athletic talent. His son John was a successful player on his dad's own team. Coach McKay was asked to comment on the pride he felt over his son's accomplishments on the field. His answer was most impressive: "Yes, I'm pleased that John had a good season last year. He does a fine job, and I'm proud of him. But I would be just as proud if he had never played the game at all." Dr. Dobson goes on to say, "Coach McKay was saying, in effect, that John's football talent was recognized and appreciated, but his human worth did not depend upon his ability to play football. Thus, his son had his respect if the next season brought failure and disappointment. John's place in his dad's heart was secure, independent of his performance. I wish every child could say the same. (William J. Vamos, First Presbyterian Church, Elkhart, Indiana: "What Happens When You're Not Number One?" *Pulpit Digest*, p. 2117).

The problem is that our society doesn't function the way Coach McKay would have us function. Another college coach story is more typical. His team had won every game of the season thus far – five straight – he was savoring every word of praise coming from the college president. "Would you like me as much if we didn't win?" "I'd like you as much," said the president, "I'd just miss having you around."

Unfortunately, human worth in our society is carefully reserved for those who are winners. One of the beautiful things that has happened in parenting, and the resources that are available for parents, is an emphasis on self-esteem. Parents need to learn how to value a child, not in terms of performance but to value the child for who he or she is. We're being taught in modern parenting not to say to a child, "bad, bad boy" or "good, good girl" because they've done something bad or good, but rather to talk about the fact that we're disappointed or happy about what they've done.

The idea is that we do not connect performance so intimately with the child, making the child feel that worth is lodged in his or her performance. We've come to a place in our society when people believe that it is unacceptable not to be Number One. Good people are, by definition, those who have succeeded — and bad people are defined as those who have failed. So success becomes the ideal and failure the manifestation of moral inadequacy." (William J. Vamos, *Ibid.*)

But this is no new problem. It started a long time ago. In our Gospel lesson, Mark tells the story of James and John seeking places of honor in the fellowship of Jesus. The request was, "Grant us to sit, one at Your right hand, and one at Your left, in Your glory." In this Gospel, we see how far the apostles are from this spirit of self-sacrifice. James and John want the top places in Jesus' kingdom. Obviously, they thought that His kingdom would be modelled on worldly kingdoms, where

those in high places enjoy honor, power, and glory. But Jesus tells them that His disciples are not to imitate the Gentiles, whose rulers lord it over people. In His kingdom, service is what makes one great. He would set the example Himself. He came "not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many," which is a reference to His saving death on the cross.

John and James, in the Gospel today, show us an expression of blatant ambition! These two disciples wanted to be Jesus' chief ministers of state—maybe their ambition was kindled because more than once Jesus had made them part of his inner circle, the chosen three. You remember that He had taken James and John with Him, along with Peter, up on the mountain of transfiguration. He would also take them into the Garden of Gethsemane and asked them to share with Him that most crucial of all nights. Maybe they were a little better off than the others. We learn from the early part of Mark's Gospel (1:20) that James and John's father was well enough off to employ hired servants, so it may be that they rather snobbishly thought that their social superiority entitled them to this first place. In any event, they show themselves as men in whose hearts there was ambition for the first place in an earthly kingdom. (William Barclay, *The Gospel of Mark*, pp. 266)

It's interesting that Matthew tells this story in a different way than Mark does. In Matthew, the request for the first place is not made by James and John, but by their mother, Salome. Could it have been that Matthew felt that such a request — such blatant ambition — was unworthy of an apostle? So to save the reputation of James and John, he attributed the request to the natural ambition of their mother? Let's nail down the fact that there is nothing wrong with ambition; it is blind ambition that ruins our lives. There's nothing wrong with ambition. In fact, some of us need more of it. But if you are Christian, ambition can blind you to another person's need. We live in an age in which ambition has been raised to the highest virtue, and all other things are sacrificed to it.

James and John needed their concept of power put into perspective. They thought they understood power, but Jesus shows them that real power resides in humble acts of service. Jesus called the disciples around Him: "Whoever wants to become great among you," He said, "must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many."

In service to all mankind, Jesus was going to offer His life as ransom. It was an explosive idea. A ransom would be paid. You know what a ransom is...a price paid to release someone from captivity. You and I are held in captivity to sin, and we need to be freed. Sin has us trapped. Sin has caused our suffering. Sin has alienated us from God. James and John have misunderstood. *We don't need a new city; we need a new soul. We don't need an insurrection; we need a resurrection. We don't need a coup; we need a cure. Position, power, and prestige won't free us. We need Someone who is willing to serve and heal us. When we, in humility, give ourselves to God, our Lord can do great things through us and for us—greater than we can ever imagine.* Amen.



### The Humanity of Jesus Christ

All three readings today support—each in its own way, of course—a reflection on the humanity of Jesus Christ and how that humanity played a key role in the drama of our salvation. Although not chosen specifically to coordinate with the other two readings, today's second reading does in fact carry forward the theme of Christ's humanity in a remarkable way. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews highlights the solidarity that exists between Jesus and us, precisely because in his human nature Jesus has known the same sufferings and testing that are our own experience. Because he can "sympathize with our weaknesses," we can "approach the throne of grace to receive mercy." For the author of Hebrews, the humanity of Jesus was an essential requirement for his redemptive death, as well as an invitation to us to find in Jesus someone with whom we can identify in our daily struggles. ## THE JOURNEY BEGINS

This past weekend our Confirmation students began their journey of preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. This will be their year to reaffirm their faith and commitment to the Christian Community.

One of the most challenging questions for parents to ask is what it looks like for them to “train” their children in the way they should go (Proverbs 22:6). It is a challenging question because the training referenced here is not for implementation, but for formation. Formation is a process. It takes time and patience. It requires vision and hope. Often, the fruit of formation is slow-grown, not evidenced until the children are adults.

Yet while the fruit of faith formation may not be seen until a child is grown, it is in the soil of childhood that the seeds are planted. Therefore, it matters that, as we work to bring the Gospel to stand in the lives of our teenagers, we also acknowledge the other formative voices that are speaking to them.

Catechists partner with parents to ensure every student has the necessary guidance to complete their Sacramental formation. We both do our best to train these students even though we often don’t see the fruits until later.

We kindly ask the whole community to pray for all our Confirmation students as they walk this journey of preparation.

## 20 MINUTES WITH BISHOP PERRY






### GOOD POPE JOHN



On October 11, we celebrated the memorial of St. Pope John XXIII, the 261st pope of the Catholic Church. He served as pope for only a short time, from 1958 to 1963.

Pope John was born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli in Lombardy in northern Italy on November 25, 1881. He was the fourth child in a family of fourteen. His family were poor sharecroppers, which means that they worked a farm owned by someone else and were paid with a share of what they had grown.

Angelo was elected pope on October 28, 1958, and took the name John. The Roman numerals after the name mean that in the long history of the Church there have been twenty-two other popes also named John. John XXIII was a meek and gentle man who often visited prisons and hospitals. He was the supreme leader of the entire Catholic Church who made time each day to perform corporal and spiritual works of mercy. People around the world recognized his goodness and his likeness to the Good Shepherd. They began to call him "Good Pope John." You can see pictures of him on the Internet.

When Angelo was 14 years old, long before he became pope, he began keeping a diary of his faith life. He wrote his ideas, his good resolutions, his prayers, and his personal thoughts in a notebook. After he died these writings were published as *Journal of a Soul*.

Think about beginning a journal of your own. Each night, perhaps with an adult in your family, write in a small notebook one thing that will help you become more like St. Pope John XXIII. Include your thoughts and good works, prayers that you say, and actions that you would like to practice. Fill it with descriptions of your faith life as it continues to grow stronger and stronger.





