



The great feast of Easter has begun, Christian stewards. Let us rejoice and be glad! Just as we embraced the discipline and fasting of Lent, let us fully embrace the joy and feasting that the next 50 days offer. We are called to be good stewards of the Easter season by sharing the good news of the resurrection with one another.

In today's Gospel, Mary of Magdala and the other apostles see only hints of the resurrection. Mt. 28:1-10. Mary is left for now to put the pieces together for herself. And yet our sequence puts the most confident words in her mouth: "Yes, Christ my hope is arisen!" Amid loss and confusion, Mary still witnesses to what she has seen. She picks up the pieces of resurrection around her. She declares the truth of life to us.

Like Mary, we are called today to look around us for clues of the resurrection. Even all these years later, the church is still at work piecing together these clues. Easter invites us to train our eyes so that we see the empty tomb not as a void but as a promise. Our understanding is still unfolding. And even as it unfolds, Easter demands that we serve as witnesses to what we have seen. As we ask Mary of Magdala to witness, so must we as church declare confidently with her: "Yes Christ, my hope, is arisen."

out of there. The stone had to be removed for us that we could see the tomb was empty; so, we could say that death had been robbed of its power; so we could set that a new world order had begun; so we could see the truth in Jesus' words: "I am the resurrection and the life."

At Easter we see lilies, Easter baskets, colored eggs, Easter bunnies, new outfits, etc., but the main symbol is the empty tomb, now in the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem. We've all seen artistic interpretations of the resurrection, but no one except the Roman guards were there when it happened, and they reported it only to the high priests. The only evidence we have of the resurrection is an empty tomb and man's eyewitness accounts of people who saw Jesus after His resurrection, people who were willing to go to their death to witness that He was alive, and they indeed did see Him.

Those who saw Him knew that what they were seeing was entirely different than anything they had ever seen before. Jesus was not just a dead man who had come back again to live the life He had before. He came back to a new kind of life, one that is beyond our ability to relate to so it is shrouded in mystery for us, and yet it is very real. He could be seen and touched, He could eat food with His friends, He could move from one place to another effortlessly, walls and locked doors could not keep Him in or out, and those who saw Him reported He even looked different. Yet when they saw Him they knew it was no one else but the Lord.




