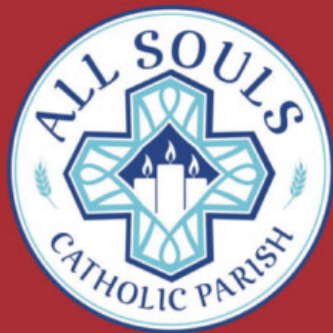

For Troubled Hearts, John 14:1-4 JESUS, THE WAY, THE TRUTH, AND THE LIFE

There is a story about a couple who were on their honeymoon. They were staying at the Watergate Hotel, made famous by White House shenanigans during the Nixon Administration. Remembering what happened in that dark time, the new bride was concerned and asked, "What if the place is still bugged?" The groom said, "Hmm . . . Good point. I'll look for a bug." He looked behind the drapes, behind the pictures, under the rug. "AHA!" he shouted! Sure enough, under the rug was a small disc shaped plate, with four screws. He got his Swiss army knife, unscrewed the screws, and threw the screws and the plate out the window.

The next morning, the hotel manager asked the newlyweds, "How was your room? How was the service? How was your stay at the Watergate Hotel?" Curious, the groom said, "Why, sir, are you asking me all of these questions?" The hotel manager said, "Well, the room under yours complained of the chandelier falling on them!" It's a dumb story. However, it does illustrate the fact that fear makes us do ridiculous things sometimes. In fact, as we've noted before, fear is at the base of most of our problems. Jesus says in our lesson for today, "Do not let your hearts be troubled . . ." He could have said, "Do not let them be afraid . . ." Have you ever known anyone with a troubled heart? Obviously, the young couple staying at the Watergate had troubled hearts. They were afraid that their room was bugged. They went to extraordinary lengths to calm their fears, much to the chagrin of the folks staying in the room beneath theirs.

It's like the patient in a mental hospital who was holding his ear close to the wall, listening intently. The attendant finally approached. "Shh!" whispered the patient, beckoning him over. The attendant pressed his ear to the wall for a long time. "I can't hear a thing," he whispered. "I know," replied the patient, "it's been like that all day!"

If I asked you to describe a troubled heart, what are the words you would use? Fearful? Angry? Envious? Stressed out? Bitter? The list could go on and on. A heart may be troubled by many things. My guess is that most of them could be boiled down to one word, though: fear. What is envy, but the fear that we don't measure up because we do not have what someone else has? What is greed, but the fear that what we have is not enough, that somehow, we are incomplete? Our basic problem is fear. Think how many times our Lord says to us, "Don't be afraid." That's what He is saying to us here: "Do not let your hearts be afraid. You believe in God; believe also in me . . ."

A story is told of the emperor Augustus. Augustus was a man with a troubled heart for a variety of reasons. The

empire was continually at war. Constant intrigue stalked the halls of government. (Hmm . . . sounds like our country today.) Augustus, this troubled emperor, heard about a man in Rome who was heavily in debt, yet despite his financial woes, this man slept peacefully. So impressed was Augustus when he heard about this man that Augustus went to the man . . . and offered to buy his bed. Think about that. Augustus thought he would sleep better if he changed beds.

I've known people like that. "My life will be completely better if I just change jobs, if I move to a better community, I should leave this church, if I just had a different spouse." And they find out that nothing really changes. Happiness is an inside job. There is nothing on the outside that can ease a troubled heart. Only from within can come the help we need, whether we are head of a mighty empire or simply an average person trying to come to grips with an unhappy life.

Of course, some of us have legitimate problems, including legitimate fears about our health, about our family, about our future. But there are some of us who are troubled far beyond what we need to be. We need to open ourselves to the Great Physician (God) and ask Him to change our attitude toward life. Jesus said to His followers, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me . . ."

Jesus is giving us the big, big picture of our lives which are overwhelmed with fear. He ends this short teaching at the Last Supper urging all of us, His disciples, to have faith in Him. He knew how devastating it would be to be His disciples in the untrusting world. He had faced fierce opposition and His true followers were not to be different. Yet He tells them to not let their hearts be troubled. They must have faith — Faith in God and in Him. Despite all those tribulations we might face here on earth, we hear the most consoling and comforting message, probably the loveliest words in the Gospel: "There are many rooms in My Father's house. I am going to prepare a place for you. I shall return to take you with Me; so that where I am you also may be." This means that we have an eternal home to go to, namely the Father's house.

This passage is truly very comforting to people when they lose a loved one. I have read and preached on it hundreds of times, and many have heard it from other preachers from all Christian denominations. All in all, our ultimate purpose, our everlasting goal, is enjoying eternal life with our Lord and God. It's the big picture. It's the purpose of our creation. It's the reason He died on the cross. It's the hope we celebrate whenever we gather each time around the table of the Lord, trusting in God's love and uniting ourselves with Jesus in sacrifice of love for us. Amen.

Faith Formation

The Easter season we celebrate invites us to reflect on the resurrection of Jesus, and the promise of life God extends to us. We see God's gift of life in many ways. Among the ways we experience God's life and goodness is in the sacraments of the church. Next weekend, on Saturday May 13 at 10:00 a.m., we will celebrate First Communion with many of our young people. Please keep all of them in your thoughts and prayers as they prepare for this special day.

There is nothing like First Communion Day in a parish. The First Communicants come to church dressed in special clothes, and smiles abound for the kids and all of their families. It is a day to remember, and for adults who participate in communion, it recalls memories of their own first communion.

The celebration of First Communion is also a time for all of us to think about the Eucharist we share at each and every Mass. It is a time for us to pause and think about how we receive the presence of Jesus under the form of consecrated bread and wine, as well as the witness we give to those around us. As the priest or minister presents the consecrated bread or wine, he says, "The Body of Christ." Our response should be a wholehearted, "Amen!" to what we receive and what we are called to be as we go forth to "love and serve the Lord" rather than mumbled or unrecognizable words. Our "Amen!" is our joyful assent of faith in the real presence of Jesus Christ!

Prior to receiving communion, the church still asks that people fast for one hour as a means of remembering what we receive in communion. It is important to also remember that this fast does not include water and applies to ordinary situations as opposed to those who are homebound, hospitalized, or for whom it would involve an unnecessary medical burden. The fast is not about watching the clock and calculating minutes, instead it is about respect for the Eucharist and our reception of the Body of Jesus.

In the religious education program at All Souls Parish, another year of faith formation is coming to an end, but much was accomplished due to all your hard work and cooperation. I appreciate everyone's effort in making our program successful and faith filled. Thank you for a wonderful year teaching your children the importance of their faith. Fr. Mark, our Catechetical team, our whole community of faith, parents, and students, our combined efforts were amazing this year. It is very apparent how much we love God and our students.

I am looking forward to another wonderful fall but in the meantime, have a great summer!

Formación en la Fe

El tiempo pascual que celebramos nos invita a reflexionar sobre la resurrección de Jesús y la promesa de vida que Dios nos extiende. Vemos el regalo de Dios de la vida de muchas maneras. Entre las formas en que experimentamos la vida y la bondad de Dios está en los sacramentos de la iglesia. El próximo fin de semana, el sábado a las 10:00, celebraremos la Primera Comunión con muchos de nuestros jóvenes. Tenga a todos estos jóvenes en sus pensamientos y oraciones mientras se preparan para este día especial.

No hay nada como el Día de la Primera Comunión en una parroquia. Para los que reciben su primera comunión, vienen a la iglesia vestidos con ropa especial y las sonrisas abundan para los niños y toda su familia. Es un día para recordar, y para los adultos que participan en la comunión, trae recuerdos de su propia primera comunión.

La celebración de la primera comunión es también un momento para que todos pensemos en la comunión que compartimos en todas y cada una de las Misas. Es un momento para que hagamos una pausa y pensemos en cómo recibimos la presencia de Jesús bajo la forma de pan consagrado, y el vino, así como el testimonio que damos a quienes nos rodean. Cuando el sacerdote o ministro presenta el pan o el vino consagrados, dicen: "El Cuerpo de Cristo". Nuestra respuesta debe ser un "¡Amén!" de todo corazón, a lo que recibimos y a lo que estamos llamados a ser a medida que avanzamos para "amar y servir al Señor" en lugar de balbucear palabras irreconocibles. Nuestro "¡Amén!" es nuestro gozoso asentimiento de fe en la presencia real de Jesucristo!

Antes de recibir la comunión, la iglesia aún pide que las personas ayunen durante una hora como medio para recordar lo que recibimos en la comunión. Es importante recordar también que este ayuno no incluye agua y se aplica a situaciones ordinarias a diferencia de aquellos que están confinados en casa, hospitalizados o para quienes implicaría una carga médica innecesaria. El ayuno no se trata de mirar el reloj y calcular los minutos, sino de respetar la Eucaristía y nuestra recepción del Cuerpo de Jesús.

En el programa de educación religiosa en All Souls Parish, otro año de formación en la fe está llegando a su fin, pero se logró mucho gracias a su arduo trabajo y cooperación. Aprecio el esfuerzo de todos para hacer que nuestro programa sea exitoso y lleno de fe. Gracias por un año maravilloso enseñando a sus hijos la importancia de su fe. Padre Mark, nuestro equipo de catequesis, toda nuestra comunidad de fe, padres y estudiantes, nuestros esfuerzos combinados fueron increíbles este año.
