#### 12<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Witnessing Despite Fear: Facing Our Fears with Faith Matthew 10: 26-33

Today's readings call us to tackle the challenging issues of fear and trust—two concepts on opposite sides of the same coin. They must be confronted and dealt with by all of us who wish to live the stewardship way of life: freely sharing the gifts that God gives us. In our first reading from Jeremiah, the prophet expresses sentiments we have all felt at some point in our lives when he says, "I hear the whispering of many: 'Terror on every side!" Perhaps this "whispering" comes from the culture that insists we must think of ourselves, our own interests, our financial comfort first. Only when we are certain that our own needs are met can we think of serving God and sharing with others. Perhaps when we consider stepping out of our comfort zones, the fear-inducing whispers come from within us. "You're too weak, too selfish, too broken to really live as Christ's disciple." Yet, just when Jeremiah is nearly overcome with fear, he remembers the truth, and it is just as true for us today. "The Lord is with me, like a mighty champion.

Pope John Paul II had as his motto: "Be not afraid." Of course, he was quoting our Lord whom we just heard give the same mandate to His apostles in today's Gospel, "Do not be afraid." Since God knows how many hairs are on our head and is aware when even a little sparrow dies,

then He's aware of every detail of our own lives. hough He is aware and cares, He does not guarantee us that bad things will not happen to us. Ups and downs are part of our existence and they even happened to God's holy prophets and to Jesus himself. Because God is aware and He cares, He tells us not to fear, for He is in control and will make everything turn out right for those who are faithful to Him. "Be not afraid." Sometimes that's easier said than done. Fear is built into us, and we feel it when we feel threatened. If fear were not a part of our nature, we wouldn't even exist today, because long ago our ancestors would not have had sense to get out of the way of charging wild animals or strike poisonous snakes. Nor would we be moved to get out of the way of cars and trucks coming at us at 50 miles an hour. Fear enables us to survive, to know when to fight, to know when to run. But sometimes it gets out of control and takes over our life, whether that fear comes from a real threat or an imagined one. Faith is a big help to deal with fear, and sharing our fears with a trusted friend can be helpful. But sometimes fear is so controlling that counseling or medication is required.

I think when Jesus tells us not to fear, He's not talking about the spontaneous reaction we feel when

we are threatened. He's telling us not to worry and to put our trust in Him that things will come out alright in the end. The words of St. Paul, "We know that all things work for good for those who love God" (Rom 8, 28), have been a constant help to me to stay together during very trying times.

One thing Jesus does tell us to fear is God! "Do not be afraid of those who can kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." In Old Testament times Gehenna was a place of human sacrifice to pagan idols. At the time of Jesus, it was a garbage dump, which was constantly burning. Thus, Gehenna became the symbol of evil and hell. Jesus' words confuse some people! Aren't we supposed to love God, but if we fear Him, how can we love Him? Doesn't St. John tell us "Perfect love casts out fear?" All of that is true. For those who have a "reward and punishment" view of life, a little fear might help them stay on the straight and narrow. For those who have moved beyond the "reward and punishment" stage, this fear that Jesus talks about is the fear of being unfaithful to God or having a sense of awe, respect and reverence when we approach God. Those who fear God in this way will approach Him with awe, respect and reverence frequently. In either case, a little healthy fear of God will greatly reduce our fear of other things in life, including death itself. I know from many years of dealing with people that if we are at peace with God and know the Lord is with us, there will be fewer things in life that can upset us or frighten us. Amen.







hen Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022, a humanitarian crisis began for Ukrainians, whose lives were shattered by the violence of war. Many left their homes in eastern cities in Ukraine for cities in the west, such as Lviv, farther from the most intense fighting. From the beginning of the war, the Holy Father pleaded for an end to the violence and expressed his love and concern for the Ukrainian people who were its victims. He first visited the cities of Rivne and Zhovka and other regions directly affected by the early conflict. He returned to Ukraine to celebrate Mass in the cathedral in Lviv and to deliver an ambulance donated by the Holy Father to the Center for Mother and Child Health to assist children displaced by

The Holy Father's charitable outreach to victims of war, migrants and refugees, and the poor affected by illness and natural disasters is supported by contributions to the Peter's Pence Collection. When you participate in the collection, you join Catholics across the globe in supporting the pope's mission of mercy as well as the activities of the Holy See's dicasteries that assist his ministry.

Support for such papal efforts is rooted in the scriptural message to take care of the poor and expresses unity with

PreCana is a required course for couples getting married in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

At the completion of the course, couples will receive a certificate of attendance to present to their pastor prior to their wedding day.

- The fee for a PreCana course is \$150 per couple for a virtual session (\$195 for in-person at a parish).
- Each PreCana course is 6 to 7 hours featuring live instruction, prayer, and discussion with your engaged partner.
- PreCana is currently offered in-person at a parish or virtually over Zoom. You can participate in either a full-day course (select Saturdays) or over the duration of two evenings (select Mon/Weds or Tues/Thurs).
- If you are getting married outside of the Archdiocese of Chicago, please make sure you complete the prenuptial file at your home parish here in Chicago for them to send it to the Archdiocese of Chicago Canonical Affairs Office. This Office will then review, approve and send your file to your destination arch/diocese where your marriage will take place.
