

Dear Family of Faith:

The sale of the St. John property in Glenwood, IL closed on April 19, 2023, at a final price of \$900,000. After fees, closing costs and bills, All Souls Catholic Parish received \$780,897.64. We used \$117,445.65 of these funds to pay off the remainder of our Archdiocese bill for Fiscal



Year 2023, a feat which we have not accomplished in many, many years. This annual expense costs us in the neighborhood of \$24,000 per month, so you can see that it is often difficult to achieve.

The parish promises to be good stewards of the remaining proceeds, which will go directly into the Building Fund for savings. We have not had an emergency reserve for some time now, so it is nice to breathe a little easier with that security. Our ultimate goal is to operate the church with the moneys we receive from weekly, holiday, and special collections, fundraisers, and other donations made through the generosity of our parishioners and friends, while keeping the emergency reserve for just that—emergencies.

I want to thank you wholeheartedly for all you do for this great community of All Souls Parish. As a family we always have needs to make our home a safe and suitable place in which to live. Therefore, I want to introduce to you the current and urgent needs that we are facing.

We need to replace the ailing furnace in our church building. The two huge units located outside the north end of the church have served the role of heating and cooling the entire structure since it was built over 30 years ago, and they are now aged and failing. Another essential item is the boiler in the St. Ann school building, which is of course home to our religious education program, where our community children gather for their faith formation. The school building is also slated to be a source of revenue, but we cannot rent it without installing the boiler piece that has worn out after over 70 years of serving this building.

We will soon itemize the cost of each of those items mentioned here above. I count on your generosity, the same generosity you have displayed over the years, so that we will not have to tap into the emergency reserve. We hope to do different types of fundraising, and I appeal here for a generous increase from each one of us in our weekly donations. If every parishioner decided to increase at least 10% in their weekly contributions, we could make our goal in a timely manner.

I pray that as God's stewards we put all our energy, all our time, our talents, and our treasure into trusting this great God and using all that we are and all that He has given us to bring Him glory.

May the Good Lord continue to bless the work of your hands.



PreCana is a required course for couples getting married in the Archdiocese of Chicago. At the completion of the course, couples will receive a certificate of attendance to present to their pastor prior to their wedding day.

- The fee for a PreCana course is \$150 per couple for a virtual session (\$195 for in-person at a parish).
- Each PreCana course is 6 to 7 hours featuring live instruction, prayer, and discussion with your engaged partner.
- PreCana is currently offered in-person at a parish or virtually over Zoom. You can participate in either a fullday course (select Saturdays) or over the duration of two evenings (select Mon/Weds or Tues/Thurs).
- If you are getting married outside of the Archdiocese of Chicago, please make sure you complete the prenuptial file at your home parish here in Chicago for them to send it to the Archdiocese of Chicago Canonical Affairs Office. This Office will then review, approve and send your file to your destination arch/diocese where your marriage will take place.
