

Fifteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time: The Sower

A newly ordained priest was having a difficult time getting started preparing his first sermon. He asked his pastor for a suggestion and his pastor told him, "Start with something that's certain to grab their attention. For example, you might say, 'Some of the best years of my life were spent in the arms of a woman who was someone else's wife." The pastor smiled at the young priest's shocked expression, then added, "She was my mother." That Sunday the nervous young priest ascended the pulpit, sweating and shaking. Finally, he said, "The pastor told me some of the best years of his life were spent in the arms of a woman who was someone else's wife." He was pleased to grab everyone's attention, but his nervousness overtook him, his mind went blank and he just blurted out, "For the life of me, I can't remember if he said who she was." (Reader's Digest)

I thought that might be an appropriate start for today's parable about growth. As infants we all spent a lot of time in someone's arms, most probably our parents. But somehow, we grew up, started walking, talking, going to school, then eventually driving, working, getting married perhaps, others becoming priests or nuns, and getting older. When we were young, we couldn't grow up fast enough; now time goes by too fast.

Counting this Sunday's parable, we're going to have three weeks of parables about God's kingdom (or as Matthew likes to call it "the kingdom of heaven"). Actually, today's parable is hardly a parable. A parable usually has an unexpected ending. Today's parable is entirely predictable. If we throw seed on the ground, some of it will grow if the climate is agreeable and there is enough sun and moisture. If we were reading Matthew's Gospel from beginning to end, we would see that it describes the various ways people had been responding to Jesus up to this point in His ministry. He was accused of being possessed, of being a breaker of divine law, and a blasphemer. Some people thought He was a great healer, and having made them well, they went happily on about their business and didn't think any more about Him. Some enjoyed His stories and were entertained as long as He was willing to entertain them, but if He asked something difficult of them, they sought other kinds of entertainment. Then there were some who thought He had something worthwhile to say, and they continued to listen to Him and learn from Him. Jesus was like the farmer sowing the seed. Although He didn't touch all hearts, those whose hearts He touched grew and produced good fruit; that is, their lives were virtuous and pleasing to God.

We can have many reactions to today's parable. We can imagine we are the good soil. We do everything right, we come to Church, we pray. We can think of lots of people who are not as good as we are. On the other hand, this parable might trigger a bout of self-blame when we think of all our faults and why we are making little or no progress in

our Christian life. There are other ways to interpret this parable. Without mentioning all the ways by which it can be understood, I will give one other interpretation which scholars believe is the way Jesus meant it to be interpreted when He spoke it. It is to look on it like a farmer might. The farmer threw the seed in every direction.

The seed stands for God's word and Jesus' teachings. There were lots of reasons why some of the seed did not take root or, if it did, it did not survive. A farmer would know that a normal harvest would produce about seven-fold and a good harvest would produce about 10-fold. For the harvest to be greater than that, a miracle would be needed. Jesus tells us what did fall on good ground produced 30 or 60 or 100 fold. Basically, Jesus is telling us that His word, even though it created problems for some people or was not productive for others, would produce abundantly. His word would have power like the rain and snow. Nothing could prevent God's word from taking hold. That is a much more positive way of looking at the parable of the Sower.

When we look at the world today, with all its problems, we can get quite discouraged. Jesus is telling us God's kingdom will emerge triumphant in the end (and we want to share in His victory and that's all good). God's kingdom has always had to struggle, but it will continue to grow. Jesus could see His preaching and teaching ministry would thrive despite all the forces against it. Jesus might well have said to those who see only doom and gloom, "O you of little faith." The prophet Habakkuk had the right attitude when he prayed, "for though the fig tree blossom not nor fruit be on the vines, though the yield of the olive fails and the terraces produce no nourishment, though the flocks disappear from the fold and there be no herd in the stalls, yet will I rejoice in the Lord and exult in my saving God."






