

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME TREASURES: MATTHEW 13:44-52

Buried treasure, a pearl of great price, a storeroom full of choices—these are the themes of today's Gospel that I would like to explore with you in several stories. Straightforwardly, I use these figures of speech to represent the beginnings of morality, of character, and the critical part you play in the making of moral people, of which we seem to be in short supply these days.

Wisdom is the most precious gift a person can have. It is a real treasure. Without it, all other things are useless because we won't know how to use them. On being told that he could have anything he wanted from God, Solomon asked for the gift of wisdom. God was pleased with his request and granted it to him. However, this doesn't mean that wisdom was handed to him on a plate, so to speak. That does not and cannot happen.

Wisdom is not acquired overnight. If acquired at all, it is acquired gradually and often painfully. It is the task of a lifetime. Wisdom is like dew; it comes to us in tiny droplets without our knowing it. However, there can be experiences which enable us to take a giant step forward. Sometimes it takes a crisis to teach a person a little wisdom. Then the words of St Paul come true, namely, that in His mercy, God can make all things work for our benefit. (Second Reading).

Recently I heard a story about a woman who went shopping one day and, in the process, she ran into a store "for just a second." She had a baby (her niece) with her and thought the baby would be all right for just a minute while she got what she needed. Of course, the little stop took more than a couple of minutes and the hot sun on this summer day really heated up the car. Accidentally, in her haste, she left the keys in the car. She panicked. All the doors were locked. Could she call AAA? If she had a hanger, maybe she could get the door open with it. Meanwhile the baby was looking worse. Fortunately, a man came driving by, saw the situation and took a tool to break a window so the baby could be saved. The aunt, who now had a broken car window, was not grateful. She didn't like that her window was broken. The man who broke the window said simply, "What was more important, the baby or the window?" It's a story that causes us to ask ourselves what's important in our own lives?

Here is another story to help us think more deeply about treasure, the theme of our Gospel this weekend. A lady wrote this story about herself. She recalled that when she was a child, her wealthy parents would take an extended vacation every summer and they would leave their child in the care of a babysitter. When the girl was 11, the sitter quit right before the parents were to go on vacation, but the parents were able to hire a substitute. The girl came upon her mother wrapping up and hiding all the family jewels and silverware. The little girl asked why, since her mother had never done that before. Her mother explained she $_{4}$

could not trust the new sitter with the family valuables. You can imagine how the little girl interpreted this remark. The parents were trusting the sitter with their daughter but not with anything that had material value. Was she not a "family valuable" of greater importance than knives and forks?

That remark did not make the little girl feel valued. I am sure her parents would have protested that they greatly valued their daughter. The point I am making is that we can all say we value something or someone. But sometimes the things or people we value most are taken for granted. Jesus is telling us today that the kingdom of God and living in God's good grace is of the highest value to us. Going to Mass, prayer, keeping the Commandments, loving God and each other are not just forms of insurance that we will be happy in the next life. These are things that we make part of our lives.

The man who found the treasure was lucky, but the treasure wasn't legally and fully his until he sacrificed his possessions to buy the field. The man who wanted the pearl had to do the same. The kingdom of heaven doesn't come automatically. We must invest in it to really possess it, or rather I should say, to have it possess us. The most important thing we invest is our time: time to pray and to reflect on the Scriptures, to serve God in the Church with some of our gifts and talents. But it also requires an investment of our will, choosing to guide our lives by Christ's teachings rather than making up our own rules about what's good or bad. It even takes an investment of our finances, since if we value our faith, we will adequately support it.

When this life is over, we will have to leave behind most of our treasures. But we will take with us our good works and our love for God and others; these will be our joy for all eternity. A life of holiness and goodness is a treasure that will not fail. Amen.






Our Next Children's Liturgy is Sunday, August 6 at the 10:30 a.m. Mass

National Eucharistic Revival Supplement – July 2023

BROTHERS AND SISTERS, OUR NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL IS NOW BEGINNING THE YEAR OF PARISH REVIVAL!

...And there is no better time to start it than in July, the month in our church calendar dedicated to the **Precious Blood of Jesus Christ**, the saving source of life that flowed from His Eucharistic heart on the Cross (John 19:34).

Back to Basics



The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC, 1339-1340) reminds us that the Eucharist is rooted in God's self-revelation to His chosen people. It is the **fulfillment of all the ancient symbols** of God's favor in the Old Testament:

- The Manna in the desert (Exodus 16)
- The showbread in the Temple, also called the Bread of the Presence in Exodus 25, and
- The Passover meal, with particular emphasis on the Paschal Lamb in Exodus 12.

The Fathers Know Best

The Fathers of the Church picked up on this connection very easily and drew amazing analogies between the Passover and the Eucharist. St. Jerome is just one good example of so many:

"After the symbol had been fulfilled by the Passover meal and He had eaten the flesh of the lamb with His Apostles, [Jesus] takes bread which strengthens the heart of man, and goes on to the true Sacrament of the Passover. Just as Melchisedech, the priest of the Most High God, in prefiguring Him, made bread and wine an offering, He too makes Himself manifest in the reality of His own Body and Blood." (~ St. Jerome, Commentary on Matthew's Gospel)

Liturgy and Truth

It is amazing how much solid theology of the Eucharist is contained in our Sunday liturgy, if only we have hearts attentive to the words of our Eucharistic Prayers!

"Be pleased to look upon these offerings with a serene and kindly countenance, as once you were pleased to accept the gifts of your servant Abel the just, the sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith, and the offering of your high priest Melchizedek, a holy sacrifice, a spotless victim." (From Eucharistic Prayer 1, the Roman Canon)

"There are two things the devil is deadly afraid of: fervent Communions and frequent visits to the Blessed Sacrament." ~ Saint John Bosco

Eucharistic Revival Updates
