21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



TWENTY FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
Who Do You Say I Am? Matthew 16:13-20

Our readings today reveal beautiful truths about our God, and they challenge us to look at the truth about ourselves as well.

Jesus and His disciples ventured into the District of Caesarea Philippi, an area about 25 miles northeast of the Sea of Galilee. The region had tremendous religious implications. The place was littered with the temples of the Syrian gods. Here also was the elaborate marble temple that had been erected by Herod the Great, father of the then ruling Herod Antipas. Here was the influence of the Greek gods and the worship of Caesar as a God himself. You might say that the world religions were on display in this town. It was with this scene in the background that Jesus chose to ask the most crucial questions of his ministry. He looked at his disciples and in a moment of reflection said: “Who do men say that I am?” The disciples begin sharing with Jesus what they have heard from the people who have been following Jesus: Some say that You are Elijah; others say John the Baptist, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.

It's always been this way, Jesus as seen by the masses is seen in so many ways. You can speak of Jesus as prophet, holy man, teacher, or spiritual leader, and few will object. But speak of Him as Son of God, divine, of the same nature as the Father, and people will line up to express their disapproval. A billion Muslims will say: “Prophet, yes. God, no!” Jews scattered around the world will say, “Teacher, yes. Messiah, no!” Liberal Protestants and religionists of various stripes will say, “Exemplary man, yes. Divine, no!” Who do people say He is? Who do you say He is? And what are we called to do? Let's look at the answers to these three questions.

When Jesus asked the first of these three questions, He did so in His first and only trip outside of Palestine. It was a critical moment in the life of our Lord. He was at the end of His ministry, and it was high time that He be alone with His disciples and assess the last three years of ministry, far from the watchful eyes of the Pharisees, Sadducees, and other religious authorities. Did they now understand who He was? Were all His efforts fruitful or had it all been in vain? It was a critical moment, and critical moments call for critical questions: Who do men say that I am? The disciples responded, “Some say that you are Elijah.”

Now why would people think that Jesus was the long-deceased prophet, Elijah? Elijah was, of course, a highly revered personality in the religious life of the Hebrews. His defeat of the 450 prophets of Baal on the top of Mt. Carmel was a story well known even by the little children. To show you the great importance of Elijah, we must remember that when our Lord was transfigured, two men from the past came back from the grave to speak to him—Moses and Elijah. But there was yet another reason why people thought that Jesus was Elijah. It was a commonly

held belief among the Hebrews that one day Elijah would return and that that would mark the end of the world. In the very last passage in the Old Testament, the book of Malachi contains these words: “Behold I will send you Elijah the prophet before the great and terrible day of the Lord comes.” Clearly Elijah's coming would mark the most important day in the history of the world. Jesus understood this. I believe that is why in Matthew 11 Jesus said to the crowds, “If you are willing to accept it, John the Baptist is Elijah who is to come.” In that one statement, Jesus proclaimed that He was the Messiah and the end had now come, but He knew not many would be able to accept it.

Our Gospel passage from Matthew leads us to take a serious look at whether our lives give God the glory He deserves. It comes in the form of the question that Jesus poses to the disciples: “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” And they offer varying responses. Then, Jesus gets personal with them. “But who do you say that I am?” Peter gets the answer right, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.”

Jesus is getting personal with us today. He poses the same question to each one of us who call ourselves His stewards and modern-day disciples. Surely, we would not hesitate to answer just as Peter did, that Jesus is the Christ, Son of the living God. But do our lives truly reflect this answer? If we really believe that Christ is the Son of God, sent to save us from our sins and lead us to heaven, then we must say so — not just with words, but with our actions. Do my ambitions and priorities in life say that Christ is my Savior and I am His disciple? Does my budget, my family life, my entertainment say so? The gifts and blessings that God has given us — our time, our talents, our material possessions — are meant to be used in a manner that says, “Christ is my Savior and I am His disciple.” The most eloquent praise we can offer Him is a life lived in grateful response to His unfathomable love. This is the beauty and power of a stewardship way of life.

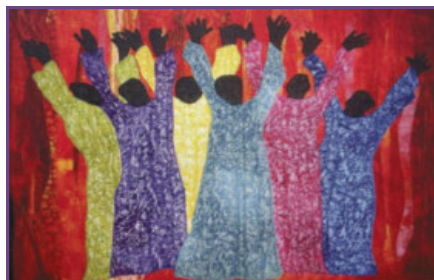

ALL SOULS PARISH 2023 FURNACE FUND



The HVAC system in the church was installed when it was built in 1997. The furnace and a/c unit servicing the west side of the church has failed and is obsolete. We must replace the west unit entirely to keep our congregation comfy year-round.

Replacement Cost: \$40,000

Installation: \$10,000

The school building will soon become a source of rental revenue and houses our 140+ Religious Education students. We have been advised to maintain the current boiler with the following necessary updates.

Burner Unit for Boiler: \$21,500

Replacement Vacuum Unit: \$9,500

Installation: \$20,000



TOTAL OF REPAIRS & REPLACEMENTS: \$100,000
