My Family of Faith,

In this weekend's bulletin, you will find our parish financial report for fiscal year 2022-2023. Our Director of Operations/Business Manager, Janice Summerrise, gives us a concise overview that our church, although sound, is not sailing as well as we want it to be. The one thing that has made this ship (our church) sound and sailing pretty well for many years in the past is YOU and your generosity.

We have always counted on you sharing your time, and talent, and treasure. Being good stewards is what allows us to participate in the creative work of God in His world. It's a very humbling thought - that God takes our small efforts and creates something marvelous from them.

If we read the Gospels carefully, we find generosity in all of them and see that all the great figures that emerge are generous. During this Advent and Christmas season, we hear again and again Mary's response to God when the angel appeared to her—an incredible act of faith, surrender, and generosity. The Magi, traveling from afar with gifts for the Christ Child, were generous. The centurion begging Jesus to cure his servant was generous. The first 12 apostles' leaving everything to follow Jesus was an incredibly generous gesture. And then there is Jesus Himself. His first miracle in Cana was not a miracle of need; it was a miracle of abundance and generosity. Through His life, Jesus served people by teaching them, feeding them, healing them, providing spiritual leadership, and comforting them. Finally, in His suffering and death on the cross, Jesus laid down His life for us in the ultimate act of generosity. The Gospels are a story about the triumph of generosity.

Generosity is at the heart of the Christian life, just as it is at the heart of the Gospel. For it is often through our generosity that we are able to bring the love of God to life for others in very real and tangible ways. God is, by His very nature, generous. God wants to convince us of His generosity, and in turn wants us to live generous lives.

But the world often doesn't see it that way. Not surprisingly, again we stumble here upon the great divide between the way of the world and the life God invites us to live. While God is inviting us to a joyful life of selfless generosity, the world is trying to seduce us into an all-encompassing selfishness. While our financial position is not down the drain, it's not encouraging either. It is sad that only fewer than 30% of those who are registered in our parish contribute to the offertory. Which voice do we hear? That of the world? Or of the Gospel?

I want to use this opportunity to thank all of you for the generous hands and hearts you have shown in paying for repairs to the school boiler and our church furnace. Almost everyone has seen the need for these both items, and I must say that, although we have not come to the finish line, we are really doing well. Thank you.

God invites us to a life of gratitude while the world fosters discontent. God proposes trust; the world arouses fear. God promotes giving; the world promotes getting. God invites us to cooperate with His providence while the world rallies behind self-determination. God appoints us to stewardship while the world pushes for ownership. The world encourages entitlement, when everything is a gift from God. God invites us to look out for our neighbor; the world tells us to look out for ourselves. God operates from abundance, the world from a place of scarcity. God created us out of generosity to live generous lives; the world encourages us to live a small, selfish life.

Generosity begins with gratitude. Are we grateful for all the blessings God has poured out upon each one of us? We are at our best when we are grateful, and gratitude is one of the leading indicators of good spiritual health. The world draws us into a conversation about all that we don't have, but God invites us into a conversation about all that we do have.

Thank you again to each and every one of you for all you do. May the good loving God continue to bless the work of your hands.

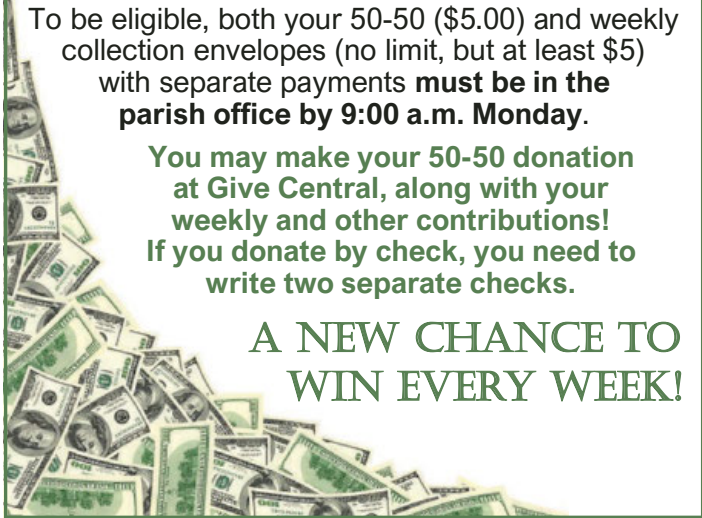

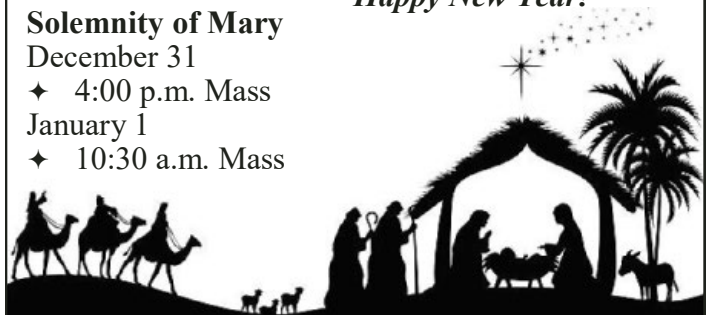

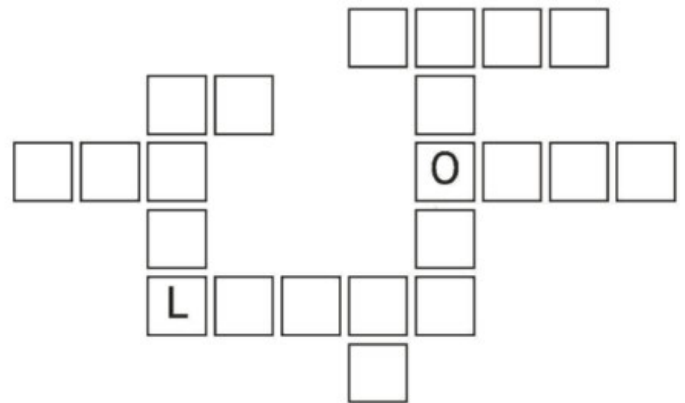

ALL SOULS PARISH 2023 FURNACE FUND

We are proud to warm the more than 800 souls in our parish community by keeping the flame of faith burning. But we need to keep our bodies warm (and cool!) as well.

The HVAC system in the church was installed when it was built in 1997. The furnace and a/c unit servicing the west side of the church has failed and is obsolete. We must replace the west unit entirely in order to keep our congregation comfy year-round.

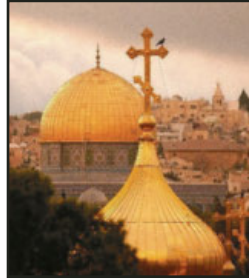

Question: *Why is it so important that we register at All Souls? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?*

Answer: *Registration is the official way we join a parish community.* Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering at All Souls is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
