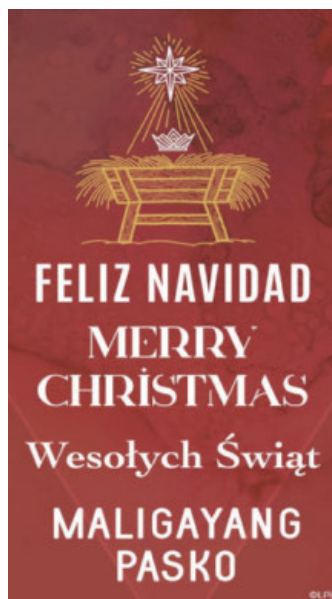

### 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT





**DO NOT BE AFRAID!  
FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT**

Merry Christmas to all of you dear sisters and brothers; I also wish you a prosperous new year 2024 coming up soon. Let us have no fear as God calls us each day, for nothing is impossible for God.

Despite the clear text for this weekend (Lk 1: 26-36), centuries of art have done us in. There it is in a thousand paintings: Mary, with a peaceful smile on her face, looking pious and serene toward a warm light of unknown origin, seemingly on the verge of spiritual ecstasy. So why is the angel saying, "Do not be afraid?" Why doesn't he say, "Enjoy," or add the modern conceit, "You've earned it?"

The angel greeted her with "Hail," or rejoice. That was all right. So far, so good. It was the rest that got her. "You have found favor with God." In those days—as in these, if you would but think about it—to "find favor with God" was definitely not always something necessarily to rejoice over. To be sure, "to find favor with God" meant that God had noticed you and loved you deeply—that was a plus—but it also implied that God had a great task for you, a task that sometimes, maybe often, meant sacrifice and suffering.

That's why you really didn't want God to notice you any more than a rookie wants the top sergeant to notice him for a dangerous mission. Moses tried to duck God's call by protesting that he wasn't a good leader or speaker, and would Yahweh consider sending his brother, Aaron, instead, and let him off the hook? No sale. The prophet Isaiah, suddenly finding favor with Yahweh, said, "No, don't notice me, please; don't send me, I stutter." And God said, "No problem" and sent angels with burning coals to correct his impediment, leaving Isaiah struggling to come up with another excuse.

I make a point of all this to remind you that at one time, perhaps long ago, each of us had his or her own annunciation. That annunciation is called baptism, when we, having found favor with God, were called, chosen. Perhaps, like the others we mentioned, had we been of age or had our parents fully realized what all this meant, we, too, would have been afraid and asked for an extension, like some of the early Christians who put off baptism because they felt they were not quite ready for all that it entailed. The fact is, to say yes to the mighty and wonderful God is both liberating and fearful, but we treat it so lightly. Today, because familiarity breeds contempt, the call and response of baptism are taken on easily, almost casually. The transaction has become merely an ethnic or social affair separated from commitment.

This commitment is to be fulfilled with love and not fear because He is with us.

The Fourth Sunday of Advent, falling on December 24, holds a special significance as it marks the final moments of anticipation before the arrival of Christmas. This day is a time to reflect on the journey we have taken throughout Advent and to prepare our hearts for the birth of Jesus.

As we light the fourth candle on the Advent wreath, we are reminded of the themes of hope, peace, joy, and love that have guided us throughout this season. Each candle represents a different aspect of the Advent journey, and on this day, we focus on the candle of love. Love is at the core of the Christmas story. It is the love of God that brings forth the miracle of the Incarnation, the birth of Jesus Christ. This love is not limited to a specific time or place but is a universal gift that is offered to all humanity.

On this Fourth Sunday of Advent, we are called to reflect on the love that God has shown us and to share that love with one another. It is a time to reach out to those in need, to offer a helping hand, and to spread kindness and compassion. In doing so, we become vessels of God's love, shining a light in the darkness, and bringing hope to those around us.

As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus, let us remember the true meaning of Christmas. It is not just about the presents, the decorations, or the festivities, but about the love that came down to earth on that holy night. May this love fill our hearts and guide us in all that we do, not just on this Fourth Sunday of Advent, but throughout the year. Amen

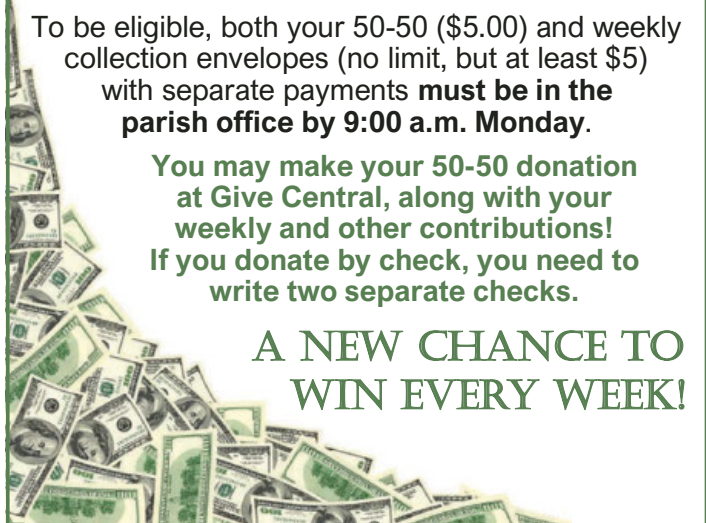

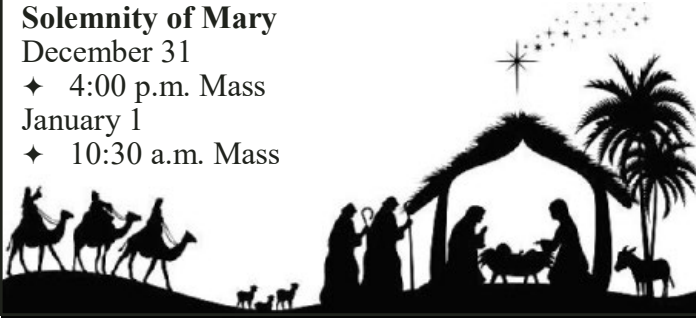

## ALL SOULS PARISH 2023 FURNACE FUND

We are proud to warm the more than 800 souls in our parish community by keeping the flame of faith burning. But we need to keep our bodies warm (and cool!) as well.

The HVAC system in the church was installed when it was built in 1997. The furnace and a/c unit servicing the west side of the church has failed and is obsolete. We must replace the west unit entirely in order to keep our congregation comfy year-round.

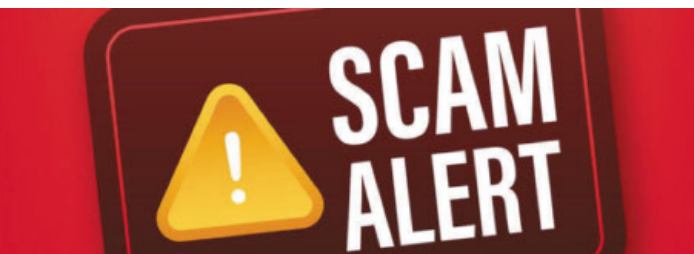

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we celebrate the birth of Jesus, we also celebrate the birth of our hope. When he came among us as one like us in all things but sin, he lifted us up to new and transformed life. In fact, he opened for us the way to share in the very life of God. One of the prayers of the Mass gives us these words: "...may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity."



As I celebrate the Eucharist, I will remember you and pray that you will have a living sense of the Lord among us, the one who walks with us and draws us forward into the fullness of his life.

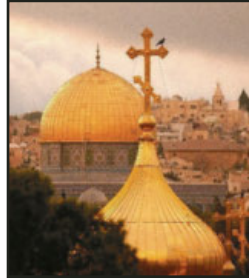
