THE HOLY FAMILY







THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY, AND JOSEPH: LK 2:22-40

Today, as we gather to celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, we are reminded of the profound love, faith, and obedience that characterized their lives. In the Gospel of Luke, we encounter a beautiful account of their presentation of Jesus in the temple, where they encounter Simeon and Anna, two faithful and devout individuals.

In this passage, we witness the fulfillment of the ancient Jewish law, where Jesus, as the firstborn son, is presented to God in the temple. Mary and Joseph, in their unwavering commitment to their faith, obediently follow this tradition. As they enter the temple, they encounter Simeon, a righteous and devout man who had been eagerly awaiting the arrival of the Messiah. Filled with the Holy Spirit, Simeon recognizes Jesus as the fulfillment of God's promise and utters the beautiful words of the Nunc Dimittis, "Now, Master, You may let Your servant go in peace, according to Your word, for my eyes have seen Your salvation."

The encounter with Simeon is a powerful reminder of the faith and hope that sustained the Holy Family. Mary and Joseph, guided by their trust in God, embraced their roles as parents to the Son of God, despite the challenges and uncertainties that lay ahead. They were obedient to God's plan, even when it seemed difficult or unclear.

Additionally, we encounter Anna, a prophetess who spent her days in the temple, worshiping and fasting. Anna, upon seeing Jesus, gives thanks to God and speaks of Him to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem. Her devotion and dedication to God's presence in the temple serve as an example for us to seek God in our own lives, to be vigilant and attentive to His presence.

As we reflect on the Holy Family, we are called to emulate their virtues. We are called to love one another uncon-

ditionally, just as Jesus, Mary, and Joseph loved each other. We are called to be faithful and obedient to God's plan for our lives, even when it may be challenging or unclear. We are called to seek God's presence in our daily lives, to be attentive to His voice and to share the good news of His love and salvation with others.

Our Gospel today says a great deal about trust and surrender to our Lord — three trademark words of a steward.

First and foremost, the Holy Family teaches us about the importance of love. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph deeply loved and cared for one another. Their love was selfless and unconditional, serving as a foundation for their family life. They remind us that love is at the core of any strong and healthy family.

Secondly, the Holy Family teaches us about faith. Mary and Joseph both demonstrated unwavering trust in God's plan for their lives. They faced many challenges and uncertainties, but they never lost faith. Their trust in God's guidance and providence serves as an inspiration for us to trust in God's plan for our own lives.

Lastly, the Holy Family teaches us about the power of unity and cooperation. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph worked together as a team, supporting and helping one another. They faced the challenges of life together and relied on each other's strengths. Their unity reminds us of the importance of working together as a family, supporting one another through thick and thin.

Let us pray for the grace to follow the example of the Holy Family, that we may grow in love, faith, and obedience. May we be strengthened in our family relationships, and may our homes be places of love, peace, and joy. May we, like Simeon and Anna, encounter Jesus in our lives and proclaim His presence to the world.

May the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph intercede for us and guide us in our journey of faith. Amen.


Our Bereavement Ministry is a faith-based group that provides an opportunity for those who have lost a loved


