Fourth Sunday in Ordinary time: TEACHING WITH AUTHORITY

A wealthy man who rarely went to church was on his deathbed and sent for the pastor. "Pastor," he said, "You know I've never cared much for church matters but I'm about to die, and I want to be sure of my eternal salvation. Do you suppose that if I gave \$1 million to the church, and \$100,000 to you personally, I would go to heaven?" The pastor thought about that idea for a second or two and then replied, "Well, sir, I can't say for sure, but what do you have to lose? It's worth a try!" (*Joyful Noiseletter*, Feb. 2005)


I wonder what immediate answer I would have given him if it was me! I think in all honesty, the pastor's answer was the ideal one. Our Lord expects more from us. Our readings today remind us of God's authority. If we willingly give God authority over our lives and trust in His provision, He will take care of us no matter what.

In all our readings this weekend, we are presented with a message that reminds us of the importance of listening to God's word and living our lives in accordance with His teachings. In the first reading from the book of Deuteronomy, we hear of the promise of a prophet who will speak on behalf of God. This prophet, like Moses, will guide and lead the people, ensuring that they remain faithful to the Lord.

In the second reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians, we are reminded of the value of living a single-hearted life for the Lord. Paul encourages us to be free from anxieties and distractions, so that we may be fully devoted to God's service.

In the Gospel of Mark, we witness Jesus' authority and power as He teaches in the synagogue and drives out an

unclean spirit. The people are amazed at His teaching because He speaks with authority, unlike the scribes. Jesus' words have the power to heal, to transform, and to set us free.



As we reflect on these readings, we are called to examine our own lives and ask ourselves: Are we truly listening to God's word? Are we allowing His teachings to guide our actions and decisions? Are we living a life that is fully devoted to Him? Life can sometimes look like the synagogue in Capernaum. We are living as disciples of Christ when we suddenly recognize evil around us — through events in our lives, temptations we are enduring, or by falling into sin. It can distract us, consume our attention, or even cause us to despair. In these moments of trial, we

must remember the Healer in our Gospel today. Recall His words, "Quiet, come out of Him!" Jesus has the power and authority over evil, for He has conquered sin and death. He also has the power and authority over us. And when we invite Him to have that authority, He will heal us and help us persevere.

In our fast-paced and noisy world, it can be challenging to find moments of silence and stillness to truly listen to God's voice. We are bombarded with distractions, anxieties, and temptations that pull us away from the path of righteousness. But it is in these moments of silence and stillness that we can hear God's voice, guiding us and speaking to our hearts.

Just as the people in the synagogue were amazed at Jesus' teaching, we too should be in awe of His words. His teachings are not just empty words, but they have the power to transform our lives. They have the power to heal our brokenness, to free us from the chains of sin, and to bring us closer to God.

Let us strive to be like Jesus, who spoke with authority and power. Let us allow His teachings to guide our thoughts, words, and actions. Let us be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, who speaks to us in the depths of our hearts.

Let us make a commitment to listen to God's word with open hearts and minds. Let us be attentive to His voice, even in the midst of the noise and distractions of our daily lives. And let us live our lives in a way that reflects the teachings of Jesus, so that others may be inspired and drawn closer to Him. Today, we are reminded that God is in control and that we want Him to be in control. He is the loving Healer who will work miracles in our lives if we give Him the authority to do so.

May the Lord bless us and keep us, and may His word guide us on our journey of faith. Amen






