## Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time: JESUS' RESPONSE TO SUFFERING

Next week is Commitment Sunday for the 2024 Annual Catholic Appeal in the Archdiocese of Chicago. This year's theme is "Together at the table." The theme draws together three important movements at work in the Church today: the call to synodality or walking together on the road with Jesus and each other, the call to the national Eucharistic Revival or coming to the table and altar of the Lord's sacrifice, and—finally—the call to continue fostering together the spiritual revitalization of our parishes. The ministry of Jesus and His saving death and resurrection were directed to bringing us together at the table of His heavenly Father in the Kingdom. That movement of His mission and ministry is evident in today's Gospel from Mark's gospel, which is drawn from chapter one and describes in a snapshot a typical day in the life of Jesus.

All our readings today remind us that Christ came to serve. The world often encourages us to look inward — for ways that someone or something can better serve us. Countering this typical mindset, Jesus' entire life was focused on others. He came to fulfill His Father's mission — the salvation of mankind. He labored for this mission by becoming the humblest of servants. This is made evident in our Gospel today. Let us recall that as disciples of Christ, we are called to be imitators — to labor for our Father's mission by becoming humble servant.

In the Gospel, we see Jesus' deep compassion for the suffering. He heals Simon's mother-in-law and many others who were brought to Him. This act reminds us of the importance of reaching out to those in need, both physically and spiritually. As followers of Christ, we are called to emulate His compassion and extend a helping hand to those who are hurting. After a long day of healing and preaching, Jesus retreats to a solitary place to pray, highlighting the significance of finding moments of solitude and communion with God in our own lives. Amid our busy schedules, we need to make time for prayer, reflection, and rejuvenation. It is through this connection with God that we can find strength, guidance, and renewal to continue our mission.

Jesus recognizes that His purpose is not solely to heal and preach in one place but to spread the Good News to other towns as well. He tells His disciples, "Let us go on to the neighboring towns so that I may proclaim the message there also, for that is what I came out to do." This challenges us to broaden our horizons and extend our service beyond our comfort zones. We are called to share the Gospel and bring God's love to all people, regardless of their background or circumstances.

As Christian stewards, we too are called to be humble servants who labor for our father's mission. We should strive to imitate Christ — the Perfect Steward — who was

constantly aware of the needs of those around Him and put His gifts to good use. For us, this begins right here in our home, parish, and community. It doesn't need to be complex, but rather, very simple — to live each moment in awareness of our Father's mission and in gratitude for all He has given us. When we intentionally live each moment for Christ, even the ordinary moments are made significant.

In our second reading, St. Paul exemplifies becoming a humble servant for Christ. He says, "I have made myself a slave to all so as to win over as many as possible. To the weak I became weak, to win over the weak... All this I do for the sake of the gospel." He, like Christ, handed his life over to God in service to the salvation of mankind. He has become an imitator of Christ. And he tells the people of Corinth, "If I preach the gospel, this is no reason for me to boast." This mission has been entrusted to him and it is by God that it is made possible.

And how might we live in awareness of our Father's mission? Jesus tells us that the way to be attentive is through prayer. Before Jesus made the decision to "go on to the nearby villages" so that He might preach there too, He first "went off to a deserted place, where He prayed." It is through prayer that Jesus could hear what His Father was asking of Him so that He could perfectly accomplish His will. We, too, are called to spend time in daily prayer — we will then become aware of the opportunities to serve the Lord. We will also recognize that it is He who gives us the strength as a steward — therefore, He should receive every ounce of gratitude.

Let us commit to finding some quiet time this week to pray. Let us ask the Lord — how can I serve You better throughout my days? How can I make more time for You so that I may better know your plans for me? And let us pray, "Make me humble, Lord."




