First Sunday of Lent OUR SPIRITUAL RENEWAL: Mark 1:12–15

Each year the trees give us a lesson in renewal. First the bud, the blossom, and finally the shoot. Spring dresses the trees in a new robe and makes them young again. But this is possible only because they let go of their leaves in autumn, and in between endured a period of nakedness. Lent is the springtime of the spirit. Lord, help us not to be afraid to let go of old habits, and to face our spiritual poverty, in order that you may renew us, and so at Easter we feel young again in our discipleship.

This is the First Sunday of Lent, and the Church gives us the Gospel of Mark 1:12–15, to begin this spiritual renewal. In this passage, we witness Jesus' journey into the wilderness, where He is tempted by Satan for 40 days. It is a powerful and significant moment



in the life of our Lord, and it holds valuable lessons for us as we embark on our own Lenten journey. All our readings this weekend remind us why we partake in this 40-day Lenten journey — to prepare our hearts for the resurrection of Christ on the glorious Easter morning.

Many times throughout Scripture, God presents great blessings after 40 days of purification. We see an example of this in the first reading from Genesis. In the story of Noah and the flood, Noah preserves his family and animals on an ark for 40 days and 40 nights. There is no doubt that this journey was filled with a great deal of sacrifice and prayer as those days dragged on and the earth was swallowed up by waters.

St. Peter reminds us in the second reading of the many blessings we receive from Christ's passion, death, and resurrection. He proclaims, "Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous that He might lead you to God." And again, "[Baptism] is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ." These are the many blessings God has shared with us through the gift of His Son. To receive the blessings more readily from Christ's passion, death, and resurrection, we too are called to endure 40 days "in the desert."

As we enter this season of Lent, we are called to follow Jesus' example and retreat into the wilderness of our hearts. It is a time of introspection, prayer, and self-

examination. Just as Jesus faced temptation, we too are confronted with our own struggles, weaknesses, and temptations. Lent provides us with an opportunity to confront these challenges head-on and grow in our faith. In the wilderness, Jesus was tempted by Satan, who sought to divert him from His mission and purpose. Yet, Jesus remained steadfast, relying on the Word of God and the strength of His relationship with the Father. He teaches us that in the face of temptation, we too can find strength in God's Word and the power of prayer. Lent is a time for us to resist the allure of worldly desires and distractions that may lead us astray. It is a time to refocus our hearts and minds on what truly matters—our relationship with God and our commitment to living a life of holiness. It is a time for us to examine our priorities, to let go of anything that hinders our spiritual growth, and to embrace the path of righteousness.

The Gospel reading also reminds us of the urgency of Jesus' message. He proclaims, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news." Lent is a time for us to repent, to turn away from sin and turn towards God. It is a time to renew our faith, to deepen our trust in God's mercy and love, and to embrace the good news of salvation. As we journey through this season of Lent, let us remember that it is not a time of despair or self-punishment, but rather a time of hope and transformation. It is an invitation to draw closer to God, to seek His forgiveness, and to experience His grace. It is an opportunity for us to grow in holiness and become more like Christ. May this season of Lent be a time of spiritual renewal and growth for each one of us. Let us embrace the wilderness of our hearts, confront our temptations, and rely on the strength of God's Word and the power of prayer. May we emerge from this season of Lent transformed, ready to embrace the good news of salvation and live as faithful disciples of Christ. May God bless us all as we embark on this Lenten journey. Amen.







Inspiring Pastoral Outreach

Join the AWC for one of three Zoom discussions on pastoral approaches to persons in unchangeable positions that put them in conflict with the teachings of the Catholic Church (for example, Catholics who are divorced and re-married without an annulment, who identify as LGBTQIA+, are in inter-religious marriages, whose marriages were not blessed by the Church, etc.).

- Do the Church's current practices towards persons in these situations attract people to or drive them away from the Catholic Church?
- What are some pastoral approaches that you have seen, or would like to see, toward persons who are in these situations? In what ways could we encourage them and help them feel comfortable coming to church?
- Do you or do people you know feel injured or harbor resentment when exceptions are made for people in these situations?
