3D SUNDAY OF LENT





The Third Sunday of Lent: CLEANSING OF THE TEMPLE (John 2:13-25)

My dear family of faith, I invite you on this Third Sunday of Lent to reflect on the powerful and transformative encounter between Jesus and the money changers in the temple, as recounted in the Gospel of John.

In this sacred story of this weekend, we witness Jesus entering the temple and being filled with righteous anger at the sight of the commercial activities taking place within its walls. He overturns the tables of the money changers and drives out those who are buying and selling, declaring, "Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!"

In this dramatic moment, Jesus reveals to us the importance of reverence and respect for the sacred. The temple, as the dwelling place of God, is meant to be a place of prayer, worship, and encounter with the divine. It is not to be desecrated by greed, exploitation, or the pursuit of material gain.

But beyond the physical temple, Jesus also speaks to the temple of our own hearts. Just as He cleansed the physical temple, He invites us to allow Him to cleanse our hearts of anything that separates us from God. He calls us to remove the barriers of sin, selfishness, and distraction that prevent us from fully experiencing His love and grace.

As we journey through this season of Lent, let us take this opportunity to examine our own hearts and lives. Are there areas where we have allowed greed, pride, or worldly concerns to take precedence over our relationship with God? Are there tables in our hearts that need to be overturned so that we may make room for the presence of Christ?

Today's Readings

First Reading: In those days, God delivered all these commandments: "I, the LORD am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery. You shall not have other gods besides me." (Ex 20:1-3)

Psalm: Lord, you have the words of everlasting life. (Ps 19)

Second Reading: We proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, Jews and Greeks alike, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. (1 Cor 1:23-24)

Gospel: Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." (Jn 2:19)

Let us follow the example of Jesus in driving out anything that hinders our union with God, so that we may experience the true freedom and joy that comes from living in his love. May we open our hearts to His cleansing and transforming power, allowing Him to make us temples of His Holy Spirit, shining with the light of His truth and love.

We have our special Lenten Mission this week; Monday, March 4 and Tuesday, March 5. We gather on both days at 4:30pm. I want to invite you to these two days with the Very Rev. Fr. John Balluff from the Joliet diocese, who will guide us on the theme of discipleship. We certainly have heard about discipleship more than once here at All souls Parish, especially in relation to evangelization, which is much talked about as we journey through this new reality within the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Discipleship, in connection with evangelization involves following Jesus as a dedicated and committed disciple, while also sharing the Good News of the Gospel with others. It means living out the teachings of Jesus in our own lives and being a witness to His love, mercy, and truth through our words and actions.

Discipleship calls us to not only deepen our own relationship with Christ but also to invite and lead others to encounter Him as well. In essence, discipleship and evangelization go hand in hand, as we grow in our faith and share it with others, helping to spread the message of salvation and bring others closer to God.

This season of Lent is only halfway done — there is still time to work through our shortcomings and purify our hearts for the glorious Easter morning. Let us not waste another moment. Let us commit to living more faithfully God's commandments, let us seek God's mercy, and let us invite God to transform our hearts. Amen.

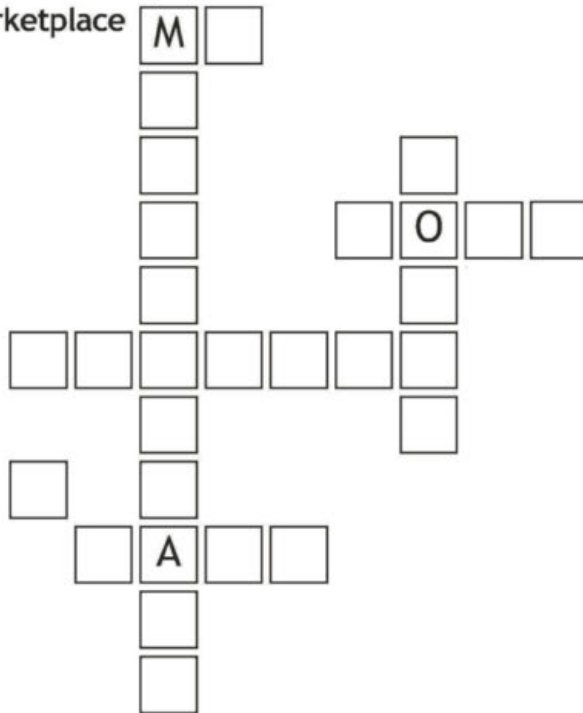
