

The Fourth Sunday of Lent: ACCEPTING OR REJECTING THE LIGHT (John 3: 14-2)

Today is what we call Laetare Sunday. Most of us are quite accustomed to the Mass being conducted in our native tongue, and we may have lost track of the fact that Latin is still the official language of the Church. On occasion, Latin reasserts itself. This Sunday is one of those times as Laetare means "Rejoice" in Latin. The Introit to the Mass (the entrance antiphon) begins "Laetare, Jerusalem" (Rejoice, Jerusalem!).

The actual midpoint of Lent occurred this past Thursday, and this day has traditionally been viewed as one of celebration, when we sort of lessen the soberness normally attached to Lent. You may notice some changes in the church itself in terms of environment, and some priests and deacons, when you watch different Masses on your television, they have the option of wearing pink or rose vestments rather than purple or violet. This Sunday has a corresponding day during Advent called Gaudete Sunday. The point of both these days is to provide us with encouragement during our penitential seasons. As part of this more upbeat attitude and approach to our celebrations of Mass this weekend, there is a focus on salvation and redemption, which is the reason we have to "rejoice."

Today's Gospel reading from John invites us to reflect on the profound truth of God's love and mercy. In this passage, we hear the famous words of Jesus, "For God so loved the world that He gave hHis only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life."

These words are a powerful reminder of the depth of God's love for each and every one of us. God's love is not conditional or limited - it is infinite and unconditional. It is a love that knows no bounds and is freely given to all who are willing to receive it.

As we journey through this season of Lent, let us take the time to reflect on the incredible gift of God's love and mercy. Let us open our hearts to receive this gift and allow it to transform us from within. Let us remember that no matter how far we may have strayed or how unworthy we may feel, God's love is always there, waiting for us to turn back to Him.

May we be inspired by the example of Jesus, who gave His life out of love for us, so that we may have eternal life. Let us strive to live our lives in a way that reflects this love to others, showing kindness, compassion, and forgiveness to all we encounter.

May we always remember the words of Jesus in today's Gospe, "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him." Let us embrace this message of salvation and share it with all those we meet.

May God bless you abundantly and fill your hearts with His love and peace. Amen.



God, thank you for sending Jesus to wash away my sins.




Help the boy find Jesus:
