


OUR VISION

The Fifth Sunday of Lent: THE SEED MUST DIE (John 12:20-33)

My brothers and sisters, as we approach the end of the Lenten season, today's Gospel reading from John, and all the readings of this weekend in fact, present us with a powerful message of transformation and sacrifice. All our readings today remind us of the goodness that our God has to offer us.

In this week's Gospel passage, some Greeks come to Philip and say, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." This simple request serves as a profound moment of revelation, as it signals the beginning of Jesus' journey towards the cross.

Jesus responds by saying, "The hour

has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." He speaks of His impending death and the necessity of His sacrifice for the salvation of all. Jesus uses the image of a grain of wheat falling to the ground and dying to bear much fruit, illustrating the transformative power of His own death and resurrection.

This passage challenges us to reflect on our own lives and the ways in which we are called to die to self to bear fruit for the Kingdom of God. Just as Jesus embraced the cross out of love for us, we too are called to embrace our crosses and follow Him with courage and faith.


We are called to "die" to ourselves by detaching from our own desires and entrusting our lives to all that God has in store for us. Without this practice of self-denial, we might

miss occasions God has given us to produce good fruit. We have been practicing this throughout our Lenten season through fasting. One way to continue this effort after Lent is by taking advantage of the countless opportunities God presents to us to sacrifice our desires for something much greater — whether it be waking up 15 minutes earli-

> er to spend time in prayer with the Lord, fasting from a favorite comfort on a weekly basis, or taking the time to call to check in on a friend or family member instead of turning on the TV, just to name a few. It is important to die to ourselves so that we might continue to make room for God and the good things He wants to produce in us all year long.

> As we journey through these final days of Lent, let us meditate on the example of Jesus and His ultimate act of love on the cross. Let us be willing to let go of our own desires and ambitions, surrendering ourselves completely to God's will. In doing so, we open ourselves up to

the transformative power of God's grace, allowing Him to work in and through us for the glory of His Kingdom.

May we take to heart the words of Jesus in today's Gospel: "Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be." Let us walk with Jesus on the path to Calvary, trusting in His promise of new life and resurrection.

May God bless you abundantly as you continue your Lenten journey, and may His grace sustain you as you strive to follow in the footsteps of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.



THREE THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT THE REAL ST. PATRICK:






HE WAS NOT [1215H] St. Patrick was born in Roman Britain then kidnapped and sold into slavery in Ireland when he was 16.
