EASTER SUNDAY: MOMENTS OF DEATH AND RESURRECTION (Jn 20:1-9 & Mk 16:1-7)

My dear brothers and sisters, happy Easter to all of you! He is risen as He promised, Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

On this glorious Easter Sunday, we celebrate the most profound and transformative event in human history - the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. This event is the greatest event in our Catholic faith. It is through the resurrection that Christ defeated sin and death and opened for us the gates to eternal life. All of God's promises are fulfilled through this glorious event. We have been preparing for 40 long days, through prayer and penance, so that we might be better prepared to receive Christ this day, and to

better prepare our hearts to one day rise with Christ in eternal life. Today, we do not fast, but rather, celebrate and rejoice because of our great and merciful God!

The meaning and joy of Easter is not just a "one-day" affair but is an essential element of our Catholic faith. We are called to live out the joy of Easter all year long. Our readings today reveal how we can do this here and now in our day-to-day lives.

The Gospel of Mark, from which we read during the Easter Vigil Mass, recounts the moment when the women approached the tomb, wondering who will roll back the stone for them. Little did they know that the stone had already been rolled away, revealing an empty tomb and the promise of new life.

The image of the stone being rolled away serves as a powerful symbol of the obstacles and challenges we face in our own lives. Just as the women were initially concerned

about the stone blocking their way, we too may encounter barriers that seem insurmountable. But the resurrection of Jesus reminds us that God's power is greater than any obstacle, and His love conquers even death itself.

The empty tomb is a testament to the victory of light over darkness, life over death, and hope over despair. It is a reminder that no matter how grave our circumstances may

seem, God is always at work, bringing forth new life and possibilities beyond our imagination.

As we celebrate Easter, let us be filled with joy and gratitude for the gift of salvation that Jesus has won for us through His resurrection. Let us embrace the promise of new beginnings and the hope that comes from knowing that Christ has conquered sin and death once and for all.

Just as the women were greeted by the angel who proclaimed, "He has been raised; he is not

here," may we too be messengers of this good news, sharing the joy of the resurrection with all those we encounter. Let us live our lives as witnesses to the power of God's love and the transformative grace of Easter.

May the light of Christ shine brightly in our hearts and in the world, illuminating the path of faith, hope, and love. May we always remember that the stone has been rolled away, and nothing is impossible with God. Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Amen.



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.




