# SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER: DIVINE MERCY What is essential is invisible: Community Life (John 20:19-31)

On this Second Sunday of Easter, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday today since God's mercy was shared with us through the resurrection of Jesus. The access to Divine Mercy has been with us since that time. Many centuries later in 1931, Jesus revealed specific instructions to a nun named Sr. Faustina to help further spread the message of His Divine Mercy. To put it simply, today, we are celebrating Jesus' merciful love for us and how we can partake in it.

No matter where we are on our journey as a disciple of Christ, we are all in need of God's merciful love. There are countless times throughout our day when we miss the mark. For instance, we might fail to respond kindly to our spouse or kids, fall into gossip in our workday, or even forget to think positively of others. These shortcomings call us to humble ourselves and receive the unwavering mercy of God.

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we are presented with a community of believers who lived in harmony and unity, sharing everything they had with one another. This passage reminds us of the

importance of living in communion with one another, supporting and caring for one another in times of need. It is a powerful example of how we are called to embody the mercy of God in our own lives by being generous and compassionate towards others.

In the First Letter of John, we are reminded of the victory of faith over the world. Through our faith in Jesus Christ, we can overcome challenges and temptations and live in the light of God's love and mercy. This passage encourages us to deepen our faith and trust in God, knowing that through Him, we can find true peace and fulfillment.

In the Gospel of John, we encounter the story of Thomas, who doubted the resurrection of Jesus until he saw and touched the wounds of the risen Lord. Jesus, in His infinite mercy, appeared to Thomas and invited him to believe. Through this encounter, we are reminded that God's mercy is always available to us, even in our moments of doubt and disbelief. Like Thomas, we are called to open our hearts to the mercy of God and to trust in His presence in our lives.


Jesus is Mercy itself. He was born into time to save us from sin. And to ensure His Mercy was always available to us, He gave us

the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In our Gospel, Jesus encounters the apostles after the resurrection and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Jesus gave us the gift of this sacrament because He wants to help us reach eternal life. He knows we cannot do it without His merciful love, and a resolve to do better and to follow Him more faithfully. It starts with an awareness of our sins and a humble heart.

As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, let us remember that God's mercy knows no bounds. It is offered to all who seek it, no matter their past mistakes or doubts. Let us strive to live out this mercy in our own

lives, showing compassion and forgiveness to those around us. May we be inspired to be agents of God's mercy in the world by the examples of the early Christian community, the victory of faith in Christ, and the encounter of Thomas with the risen Lord. Amen.


