

Third Sunday of Easter: Luke 24,35-48

On this Third Sunday of Easter, we continue to gather in the joyous light of the Resurrection, reflecting on the powerful messages in the readings from Acts, 1 John, and Luke A mother proudly told her pastor: "My teenage son has finally learned one bible verse. It's Luke 24, Verse 41, where Jesus asks His disciples (as we just heard in today's Gospel) "Do you have anything here to eat?"

In our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we are reminded God's divine plan, that even though Jesus was denied and killed, God raised Him from the dead. Peter, in his speech, encourages the people to repent and convert, so that their sins may be wiped away. This is a call to us, too. It is an invitation to recognize our own failings, to seek forgiveness, and to embrace the transformative power of God's mercy.

Our second reading, from the First Letter of John, reinforces this message of repentance and conversion. It reminds us that Jesus is our advocate with the Father, the One who pleads our cause. He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only, but also for those of the whole world. This reading calls us to obedience, to live out the commandments of God, not out of obligation, but out of love for Him who first loved us.

Finally, in our Gospel reading from Luke, we encounter the risen Christ appearing to His disciples, offering them peace and opening their minds to understand the Scriptures. Jesus shows them His hands and feet, tangible proof of His suffering, death, and resurrection. He then commissions them to be witnesses of these things to all nations. This is a reminder to us that we, too, are called to be witnesses of Christ's resurrection in our own lives.

We can learn a valuable lesson from these disciples. To recognize Jesus' appearances in our lives, we need to know Him. And the best way to know the Lord is to spend

It can start with just ten minutes of quiet prayer a day, increasing that time week by week. We might begin by reading Scripture, the lives of the Saints, or even a decade of the Rosary. Yet the goal should be to carve out specific time each day, in a quiet space, for just you and the Lord. As these disciples spent time with Jesus, "He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures." Through building a routine of prayer and intentionally working on our relationship with Jesus, God will help us better understand His Word and all that He is calling us to do.

As the disciples mentioned in our Gospel, they recognized it was Jesus in the breaking of the bread. We can also know the Lord better through the sacraments, most especially the Holy Mass. The Eucharist is Jesus Himself — Body, Blood Soul, and Divinity. What better way to grow in intimacy with Christ than to receive Him as frequently as possible or to go into the church and talk to Him in front of the Blessed Sacrament? As we make Jesus the center of our lives — through prayer and the sacraments — we will be able to recognize Him in day-to-day moments.

All three readings this weekend collectively remind us of the transformative power of Christ's resurrection. We are called to repentance, to turn away from our sins and towards the love of God. We are reminded that Jesus is our advocate, our atoning sacrifice, who bridges the gap between us and the Father. And we are commissioned to be witnesses of these truths in our own lives. As we continue to celebrate the joy of Easter, let us strive to live out these readings in our daily lives. Let us seek to turn away from sin and towards God's mercy. And let us strive to be witnesses of Christ's resurrection, living out the Gospel in our words and actions.

May the joy of the Resurrection fill your hearts and may the peace of the risen Christ be with you always. Amen.


