


OUR VISION

The Good Shepherd and the Hireling: John 10:11-18

Today, on this Fourth Sunday of Easter, we reflect on the Gospel of John, where Jesus presents Himself as the Good Shepherd. This Sunday, apart from being known as Good Shepherd Sunday, is also referred to as "Vocations Sunday." For Christians, all vocations are vocations to love.

Jesus says, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down His life for the sheep." (John 10:11) In these words, Jesus is not merely describing a pastoral scene, nor is He simply comparing Himself to a shepherd. He reveals to us the very heart of His mission and His relationship with us. He is the Good Shepherd who knows His sheep, cares for them, and ultimately lays down His life for them. So what is the difference between the Good Shepherd and the Hireling? It is the contrasting attitudes they bring to the work of shepherding. The hireling does it because he has to. For him it's just a job; his heart is not in it. The good shepherd does it because he wants to. His heart is in it.

In our lives, we encounter many voices and many influences that can lead us astray. These are the thieves and robbers that Jesus mentions, who come only to steal, kill, and destroy. But Jesus, the Good Shepherd, offers us a different way. He offers us life, and life in abundance. Jesus knows us intimately, just as a shepherd knows his sheep. He knows our joys and sorrows, our strengths and weaknesses, our hopes and fears. And He loves us with an unfathomable love, a love so profound that He was willing to lay down His life for us on the cross. The Good Shepherd does not run away when the wolf comes. He does not abandon us in times of danger or difficulty. Instead, He remains with us, guiding us, protecting us, and leading us to green pastures and still waters.

We can compare Jesus' relationship with us as to that of a loving parent to their child. The parent does not receive payment for nurturing and guiding their child. They constantly give without much in return. And if any evil comes

near the child, the parent will do anything, even lay down their life for the baby that is their own. We are Christ's, even more than a child is to a parent. He created us, brought us forth into the world, and sustains our lives each day. Evil persists in our world so Jesus willingly laid down His life for us at Calvary so that we might be saved. He is our Shepherd, whether we remain in His flock or go astray. Whether we accept His care, protection, and guidance or not, He is our Good Shepherd. But just as a baby is happiest in the arms of a parent, so too are we happiest in the flock of our Shepherd. And just as sheep go astray or try to test their boundaries, we also stray from God, test our limits and even follow false shepherds.

Let us look inward and examine our hearts for the times we might have stopped faithfully praying or coming to Mass each week, or let money, status, or anything else rule our lives. Thankfully our Shepherd is a Good Shepherd, and He laid down His life for us knowing every sin we will ever commit. Therefore, let us examine our hearts and return to our flock. We don't even need to find the way. He is right there always waiting to guide us home.

So, what does this mean for us as followers of Christ? First, it means we are never alone. No matter what we are going through, no matter how difficult or painful our circumstances may be, Jesus is with us. He is our Good Shepherd, guiding us through the darkest valleys and leading us towards the light. Second, it means we are called to listen to His voice. In the noise and confusion of our world, we must learn to recognize the voice of our Good Shepherd. We must make time for prayer, reading the Scriptures, and silent contemplation to hear His voice guiding us. Finally, it means we are called to follow Him. To follow Jesus, the Good Shepherd, means to love as He loved, to serve as He served, to lay down our lives for others as He laid down His life for us.

As we continue our journey through the Easter season, let us remember that we are the sheep of the Good Shepherd. May we listen to His voice, follow His lead, and strive to love and serve others as He has loved and served us. Amen.




Draw a picture of yourself as a little lamb and Jesus as your good shepherd.


