Fifth Sunday of Easter: The Vine and the Branches (John 15:1-8)

Our readings today teach us what it means to bear fruit as disciples of Christ. We hear in each of them that good effects will be produced in our lives from the Lord. In our first reading, (Acts 9:26-31); we hear about Saul and the other apostles who were preaching the Good News of Jesus Christ and defending the faith. These disciples knew that they were doing the will of God by the good effects of their work, as it states, "The church throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria was at peace," and again, "It was being built up and walked in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers." We must take note that the work they were doing was "with the consolation of the Holy Spirit." It was not their work alone, but the work of God. They spread the Good News in His name and with the aid of the Holy Spirit.

If we take this reading and apply it to our lives today, we must ask ourselves, "How is God bearing fruit in my life?" and "Have I invited the Holy Spirit to work in my life?" The reality is that the more we try to produce good effects in our lives, the more we will become disappointed if all we are relying on is our own efforts. It is only by inviting the Holy Spirit into our everyday moments that we will see goodness poured out.

Jesus clearly tells us how to do this in our Gospel, as He says, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." We can remain in Christ by staying faithful to His commandments and frequently receiving the sacraments. And our day-to-day moments should reflect those commitments.

Jesus has tried to tell us how are connected to Him and how we should remain in Him in many ways. I would like to note five statements where Jesus uses metaphors that tell us how important it is that we remain united with Him. Notice each of these begins with the words: "I am." Last Sunday, we heard him tell us "I am the good shepherd." "I am the light of the world." "I am the bread of life." "I am the resurrection and

the life." And the fifth one we heard today: "I am the true vine." If we had time, we could reflect upon how vital each of these items is: shepherds for sheep, light and food for us, and the vine for one of its branches. Since vines and branches are the theme of today's gospel, let us stay with that image for just another few minutes.

Quite simply, a vine is an organic structure that is nurtured by the rain and the sun; it is fed by the sap that flows through the stem and the branches; it grows and produces fruit. Jesus tells us He is the true vine, drawing life from the Father and communicating that life to all those who remain united with Him. In other words, there is a mysterious, living connection between each of us and Christ, and a mysterious and living connection uniting us with one another through our union with Christ

St. Paul used a similar metaphor when he wrote that we are the body of Christ. He tells us Christ is the head of the body and we are the limbs. We are feet, hands, arms, legs, etc. through whom Christ lives in the world today. We are united with Christ and with each other through the Spirit. Pope Pius XII wrote an encyclical called The Mystical Body of Christ describing this union. This is not a connection we can examine under a microscope or test for in any other way, other than the test Jesus gave us when He said, "By their fruits you will know them." The way we live our lives shows whether we live in Christ or not.

Jesus assures us, "If you remain in Me and My words remain in you, ask for whatever you want, and it will be done for you." This is not a promise of material prosperity but of spiritual abundance. If we remain connected to Jesus, if we allow His words to dwell in us and guide our actions, then our lives will bear much fruit, and our deepest, truest desires will be fulfilled.

So, let us take to heart Jesus' words in today's Gospel. Let us strive to remain in Him, as branches on the vine, allowing ourselves to be pruned and shaped by God's loving hand. And let us trust in Jesus' promise that if we do this, we will bear much fruit, fruit that will last.

May God bless us all on this Fifth Sunday of Easter, and may we continue to grow in our love and understanding of Him. Amen.



I join the many retired religious who benefit from your generosity as they remember you in their daily prayers. Your faithful support is received with profound and heartfelt gratitude.


