

10th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



THE TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Gn 3:9-15, 2 Cor 4:13-5:1; Mk 3:20-35)

May and June have been called a “liturgical love feast,” with observances that should help us recognize the persistent love of God. On May 19 (Pentecost), we received the Holy Spirit, Who pours the love of God into our hearts. The following Sunday we celebrated the Blessed Trinity. Last week on June 2, we celebrated the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. Out of love, Christ gave us the gift of Himself. He is always available to us, ready to listen and ready to support. Then this past Friday, June 7, we commemorated the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. In the revelations of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, Jesus promised, “Sinners shall find My Heart the source of an infinite ocean of mercy. I will console them in all their troubles.” What we hear in the Word at every Mass should be a source of inspiration and affirmation about the love of God toward us

This weekend’s readings invite us to reflect on the nature of sin, the power of faith, and the importance of being part of God’s family. Adam and Eve were certainly aware of God’s love. In the reading from the Book of Genesis, when they “hear” that God is in the garden, they know full well that He wants to be with them. It is difficult for us to conceive of how intimate and close God was to that first couple. What made them “afraid” of God was sin, something that probably makes all of us afraid of the Lord at times. Ever since Adam, we as humans have tended to run from God’s presence and we surely do not always wish to listen to His Word.

In the reading from Paul’s letter to the Corinthians, we are encouraged to have faith and to trust in the promise of eternal life. Paul reminds us that even in the face of suffering and trials, our faith in Christ gives us the strength to persevere and hope for the glory that awaits us in Heaven.

In the Gospel passage from Mark, we see Jesus confronting the religious leaders who accuse Him of being possessed by demons. Jesus uses this opportunity to teach about the power of unity and the importance of being part of God’s family. He declares, “Whoever does the will of God is My brother and sister and mother.”



President Abraham Lincoln is often given credit for saying “A house divided against itself cannot stand.” This was the theme of a speech he gave when he was nominated for the United States Senate in 1858. However, we see it in today’s Gospel reading, “And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand.” Jesus is quoted as saying that in all three Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and

Luke). Lincoln was a man familiar with scripture, and he knew that Jesus said this. He also knew it was likely that most of his audience knew that.

Jesus gave this answer to the Pharisees in all three instances in the Bible, including today’s reading. It was a response the Lord made when accused of being the agent of Satan. It is a logical thought because we all know that if any community finds itself divided, it will run into problems, including our parish, here at All Souls. Success and cohesion, whether in a family or in an organization or the Church itself, is reliant upon congruency. The theme of the prayer we recite at the end of each Mass here at All Souls is Unity.

We face divisions in many ways in daily life all the time. It does not matter whether it is a sports team, a government, a family, or our own minds, things must work together to accomplish goals. God expects unity among believers because, once conflict enters the picture, the whole organization becomes weaker. That is part of what stewardship demands of us. There are times when each of us must put our personal preferences aside for the good of the group. That is never easy to do, but to be the kind of community we wish to be and need to be, it is necessary. Psalm 133 says, “How good and pleasant it is when God’s people live together in unity.” Indeed!

As we reflect on these readings this weekend, let us remember that sin will always be present in the world, but through our faith in Christ, we have the power to overcome it. Let us strive to do the will of God and to be united as one family in Christ. May we find comfort in the promise of eternal life and have the courage to stand firm in our faith, even in the face of adversity.

Let us pray for the grace to recognize our sins, seek God’s mercy, and strive for holiness in our lives. May we always trust in the promise of salvation and remain steadfast in our faith, knowing that we are beloved children of God and members of Christ’s family.

Be There When God Moves

July 17-21, 2024, tens of thousands of passionate Catholics will experience an outpouring of grace on a scale this generation has never seen. This historic moment is called the 10th National Eucharistic Congress. 
