

## **Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Rejecting the Messenger (Mark 6:1-6)**


Today, our Gospel reading from brings us a compelling and somewhat surprising narrative. It describes Jesus' visit to His hometown of Nazareth, where He faces skepticism and rejection. Let us delve deeper into this passage to uncover its profound messages. The Gospel begins with Jesus returning to His hometown with His disciples. He begins to teach in the synagogue on the Sabbath, and many who hear Him are amazed. They recognize the wisdom in His teachings and are astounded by the miraculous works attributed to Him. However, their amazement quickly turns into skepticism and disbelief. They begin to question, "Isn't this the carpenter? Isn't this Mary's son and the brother of James, Joseph, Judas, and Simon? Aren't His sisters here with us?" And they take offense at Him.

A traveling circus was staying on the outskirts of a village when a fire broke out in one of the tents. The manager sent the clown, who was already dressed up for his act, into the nearby village for help. There was a danger that the fire would spread across the fields of dry stubble and burn the village too. The clown hurried there and asked the people to come out quickly to help quench the fire. But the people didn't take him seriously. They thought it was a brilliant piece of advertising on the part of the circus management. He tried his best to make them understand that there really was a fire. But the harder he tried, the more they laughed at him. Finally, the fire reached the village and burned it to the ground. The main reason the villagers didn't listen to the man was that they looked upon him as a clown. This made it virtually impossible for them to recognize the truth of what he was telling them.

Something similar happened to Jesus when He returned to His native village. The people of Nazareth refused to listen to Him because Jesus was too familiar to them. The message never had a chance because they rejected the messenger. In fact, they tried to do away with him. What truth did Jesus tell His fellow villagers that was so threatening they wanted to kill Him? He pointed out to them that as they were God's chosen people, one would expect to find some faith among them. Yet He found more faith among the pagans (the Gentiles). He went on to suggest that the Gentiles would take their place in the Kingdom. For this they wanted to kill him. The people of Nazareth could not reconcile Jesus' extraordinary wisdom and miraculous powers with the ordinary person they had known. To them, He was simply a carpenter, a familiar figure from their community. Their familiarity with Jesus bred a kind of contempt, preventing them from seeing Him for who He truly was—the Son of God, the Messiah sent to save.

Jesus responded to their disbelief with a poignant observation, "A prophet is not without honor except in his own town, among his relatives, and in his own home." This was a lament, a reflection on the tragic reality that those closest to us can sometimes be the most resistant to recognizing our true potential and worth. Because of their lack of faith, Jesus was unable to perform many miracles there, except to lay His hands on a few sick people and heal them. The Gospel concludes with the striking statement that Jesus "was amazed at their lack of faith." What can we learn from this encounter?

First, the passage challenges us to examine our hearts for any bias or prejudice that might hinder our faith. Like the people of Nazareth, we can be tempted to dismiss God's work in our lives because it comes in familiar or unexpected forms. We might look at our own circumstances, background, or the people around us and think, "How can anything extraordinary come from this?" Yet, God often chooses the ordinary to reveal His extraordinary power.



Let us also reflect on the warning against becoming too familiar with the sacred. Sometimes, we can become so accustomed to the presence of Jesus in our daily routines—through prayer, scripture, and the sacraments—that we forget the awe and wonder of His divine nature. This Gospel invites us to renew our sense of reverence and openness to God's work in our midst.

Additionally, this passage teaches us about the role of faith in experiencing God's miracles. Jesus' inability to perform many miracles in Nazareth was not due to a lack of power on His part, but rather a lack of faith on the part of the people. Faith is the channel through which God's grace and power flow into our lives. When we approach Jesus with a heart full of faith, we open ourselves to the transformative work He desires to accomplish in us. Moreover, this reading calls us to extend grace and openness to those around us, recognizing that God's calling and gifting can be present in the most unexpected individuals. We are challenged to look beyond the familiar and to see each person as a potential vessel of God's grace.

As we reflect on this narrative, let us ask ourselves: Are there areas in our lives where we have become complacent in our faith? Are we limiting God's work by clinging to skepticism or familiarity? Are we recognizing the divine potential in those around us, or are we dismissing them because we think we know them too well? Today, let us renew our faith in Jesus, approaching Him with open hearts and a willingness to be amazed by His transforming power. Let us also celebrate and encourage the gifts and callings within our community, recognizing that God often works through the familiar to bring about His extraordinary purposes.

May we never cease to marvel at the wonders of our Lord and may our faith always be fertile ground for His miraculous works. Amen.

## RE & Faith Formation

Dear All Souls Parish Family,

You may have recently heard the Religious Education program at All Souls referred to as the Faith Formation program, and be thinking, “Here we go again, changing the name of Sunday School one more time.” Yes, “Sunday School” has gone by many different names. I still hear people calling it CCD or Catechism classes, and for the past several years, it has been known as Religious Education. But as our program has adapted and grown, it is now more appropriate for us to refer to it as Faith Formation. Let’s examine why!

### **Religious Education vs. Faith Formation**

Each of those previous titles you have heard was relevant at the time it was used. **CCD**—or Confraternity of Christian Doctrine—focused on doctrine, or the set of beliefs held by the church. **Catechism** studied the actual catechism of the Catholic Church. Both CCD and Catechism essentially focused on the same thing: what the Catholic Church believes. Many of you might remember the Baltimore Catechism with its question-and-answer approach to teaching the Church’s beliefs. Just a couple of the 499 questions covered in the Baltimore Catechism:

Q: “Who made us?” A: “God made us.”

Q: “What is a sacrament?” A: “A sacrament is an outward sign instituted by Christ to give grace.”

**Religious Education** is education or learning ABOUT our religion. It combines the doctrine or catechism with church history, lives of the saints, prayers, and other topics relative to the Catholic Church. In short, Religious Education’s focus is to learn as much as you can about God and His Church.


What then is Faith Formation? **Faith Formation** is developing one’s faith or, in other words, building your relationship with God. A Faith Formation program focuses more on *knowing* God than just *knowing about* God. Prayer, scripture, and living lives that give glory to God the Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit are integral parts of this approach. Doctrine, history, and the saints are not abandoned, but rather, they are used to help us develop our love for and relationship with God. It is not just good enough to know

the Lord’s Prayer, we must also understand exactly what we are praying for (I’ll go into more depth about this in a later article).

So this next school year, we plan to help our students and their parents build solid, informed relationships with Christ and God. But Faith Formation is not something we do for only a couple of years and then take a break until we are ready to prepare for another sacrament. It is a life-long journey. Like any relationship, we need to constantly work on ours with God. We need to be willing to put in the time and effort to have a strong and healthy bond. I look forward to helping our students and families build and strengthen their relationships with God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.


