
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

15TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



**FIFTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME:  
Working for Christ: He Sent Them Out.**

Our readings today provide examples of people who trusted in the Lord. They remind us to live our day-to-day lives in total surrender to His care.

- In the first reading, the prophet Amos is told to leave Bethel and flee to the land of Judah after pointing out the errors in Bethel to the priest, Amaziah. Amos replies to Amaziah's hostile order with, "The LORD took me from following the flock, and said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'" Just because we live our lives doing what the Lord asks of us, doesn't mean every day will be perfect. There will be hard days when we might be led to rejection or suffering because of what we believe.
- In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus sent the apostles out. Christianity is always like that. It is never something to be kept to oneself. It always involves outreach to others. Without that element, it would not be Christianity. And it has been proved repeatedly that every person is capable of sacrifice.

As we gather this week, we are invited to reflect on a profound and inspiring connection between today's Gospel reading from Mark 6:7-13 and the extraordinary witness of the Uganda Martyrs. This passage of Scripture details Jesus sending out His twelve apostles, giving them instructions for their mission. These instructions, and the spirit behind them, resonate deeply with the lives and witnesses of the Uganda Martyrs, whose faith and courage we commemorate today At All Souls Parish.

In the Gospel, we see Jesus sending out His apostles two by two, granting them authority over unclean spirits, and entrusting them with minimal provisions—no bread, no bag, no money, only a staff, sandals, and a single tunic. This symbolic gesture underscores the apostles' reliance on God's providence, the importance of simplicity, and the focus on their mission to proclaim repentance, cast out demons, and heal the sick. Similarly, the Uganda Martyrs, led by St. Charles Lwanga and his companions, accepted their missionary calling with profound faith and courage. Living in the late 19th century, these young men encountered severe persecution under the rule of Kabaka Mwanga II. Despite the real and imminent threat to their lives, they remained steadfast in their commitment to the Gospel. Jesus sent His apostles to proclaim a message of repentance, calling people to turn back to God. The Uganda Martyrs, by their lives and words, did precisely this. Amid a culture that often contradicted the values of the

Gospel, they stood firm, refusing to renounce their faith or participate in actions that went against their beliefs. Like the apostles, their mission was clear: to witness to the truth of Christ, even unto death.

Jesus's instructions for the apostles to take nothing for their journey but a staff and sandals signifies a profound reliance on God. The Uganda Martyrs similarly relied on God's strength and providence. Stripped of safety, security, and the comfort of worldly assurances, they placed their trust entirely in Divine Providence. This total surrender allowed them to face their trials with remarkable courage and joy, knowing that their true reward was not earthly but eternal.

Jesus sent the apostles out in pairs. There is power and support in community, in companionship on the journey. The Uganda Martyrs, too, found strength in their solidarity. They supported and encouraged one another amidst persecution, drawing strength from their shared faith and commitment. This bond was a crucial source of their steadfastness and courage, enabling them to stand firm even in the face of brutal execution.

Jesus prepared His apostles for the reality of rejection. "If any place will not welcome you or listen to you, leave that place and shake the dust off your feet as a testimony against them." The Uganda Martyrs experienced rejection from their own king and the societal structures around them. Yet rejection did not quench their zeal; it only solidified their resolve. They chose to witness Christ through their faithfulness and resilience, undeterred by the hostility they encountered.

The apostles went out, casting out many demons, and anointing and healing the sick. The Uganda Martyrs, through their ultimate sacrifice, brought spiritual healing and renewal to their land. Their blood became the seed of faith, leading to a flourishing Christian community in Uganda and inspiring countless others across the globe.

Dear friends, as we reflect on the lives of the Uganda Martyrs, this weekend and beyond, considering today's Gospel, let us be inspired by their faith, courage, and commitment to their mission. May their example challenge us to proclaim the Gospel boldly, rely on God's providence, support one another in community, embrace the reality of rejection with grace, and bring healing to a broken world through our witness. May we be true disciples of Christ, like the Uganda Martyrs and the apostles, courageously living out our faith in every aspect of our lives. May the Uganda Martyrs intercede for us and may their unfaltering witness inspire us to greater fidelity and zeal in our journey of faith. Amen.




