

**NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
Food for the Journey**

Last weekend's Gospel ended with Jesus telling us, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to Me will never hunger, and whoever believes in Me will never thirst." (John 6:24-35) This is one of the important "I am" statements in John's Gospel. Throughout, Jesus uses these statements to help us know who He is: "I am the light of the world," "I am the vine, you are the branches," "I am the good shepherd," "I am the way the truth and the life." Then we have those two words standing alone. When Jesus came to His apostles walking on the water, they were frightened and Jesus said simply, "I am. Do not be afraid." The Greek words are usually translated, "It is I" but the literal translation of "Ego eimi" is "I am." It recalls the name God gave to Moses, Yahweh, which is often translated, "I am who am." Unlike the rest of creation, God depends on no other being to be. God is being itself. Jesus said the same of Himself, "ego eimi," or "I am."

In last week's Gospel, the topic of manna came up. Manna is the bread that God gave His people in the desert as they made their way to the Promised Land. Jesus told them God was giving them something superior to this manna. God wanted to give them the true bread from heaven that gives life to the world. Then Jesus identified Himself as that bread of life. He asked His listeners to believe in Him and through their belief they would never be hungry or thirsty. In other words, all their needs would be satisfied. It was on that idea that last Sunday's Gospel ended. Today's Gospel continues, telling us the people murmured. They questioned how He could have come down from heaven. They knew His parents; they knew Him when He was growing up. The murmuring is reminiscent of God's people in the desert on their way to the Promised Land. They didn't have faith that God would care for them. It's this lack of faith the people show in today's Gospel. They wouldn't believe that Jesus could do all these things he promised. Having faith is the key to understanding today's Gospel, which focuses on Jesus, who is given to us by the Father. He is the bread that nourishes us with eternal life. Our response to His coming to us is faith.

Our readings today continue to educate us on the Eucharist. We hear in our first reading about the prophet Elijah who is fleeing for his life through the desert. He cries out to God to take his life. Yet an angel appears to him giving him food to nourish and sustain him on his journey to freedom. In different ways, we can all relate to the prophet Elijah as he "flees for his life." We might feel like we are fleeing for our lives by running from a problem that is causing us stress, fighting an illness, or just barely making it through the week. Or we might feel like we are stranded in a desert—empty of energy, trapped with no way out or spiritually quenched.

Just as the angel reminded Elijah, in these moments of despair or desolation, we are called not to give up but to get up and keep going. And thankfully we do not need to keep going on our own — we have Food that will nourish us and give us strength on our journey to freedom. This food is not food that perishes, but food that continues to sustain us. Jesus tells us in our Gospel that He is this Food that sustains us: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven...and the bread that I will give is My flesh for the life of the world." This bread He refers to is His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity that we receive. This bread becomes the flesh of Christ Himself. And in consuming Him, we receive every grace we need to live forever in eternal life. We are strengthened in virtue and united more closely to Christ. This is the Food that will fill us as we journey through this life.

Mistakenly we often take the Eucharist for granted. Maybe we come to Mass to "check the box" instead of actively partaking in this intimate exchange, or we receive Jesus in the Eucharist and then forget about Him the second we leave the church after Mass. To receive all that God wants to give us in the Eucharist, we must do our part in being receptive to His grace and living out active discipleship in our day-to-day lives. As St. Paul tells us in his letter to the Ephesians, "So be imitators of God, as beloved children..." Let us approach the Lord acknowledging His Divine Presence and be open to all the graces He desires to pour out on us. Then we must go forth, being attentive to the moments that the Holy Spirit is calling us to act as He acts — in total love and sacrifice. "All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting and reviling must be removed" from us. We are called to be "kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ."

These are big requests. But they are made easier when we actively live out our call to discipleship each day of our lives and not just once a week at Mass. We must carry what we receive each week into our day-to-day moments. We can start simply by incorporating daily prayer into our lives and seeking ways to serve others throughout our day. If we give God that, He will cause us to flourish.

The Eucharist affects our lives more than we can comprehend. We are receiving God Himself. Let us strive to receive Him reverently and with open hearts. And as we exit our church this week, and always, let us not forget Who we are carrying in our hearts all week long. And as we continue to reflect on Jesus' words, let us consider: What does it mean to let Christ nourish us? How often do we come to Him in prayer, Scripture, and the Eucharist? Are we open to being led by the Father closer to Christ, away from doubt, and into deeper faith? Let us pray for the grace to recognize the Bread of Life in our midst, to accept His invitation to come and be fed, and to share that nourishment with a world in need. May our lives become a testament to the fullness we find in Christ, the one who gives His flesh for the life of the world. Amen.





CONSIDER JOINING THE ARCHDIOCESAN PASTORAL COUNCIL

What's APC?

The Archdiocesan Pastoral Council (APC) is a consultative body to the Archbishop of Chicago and is broadly representative of our local Church. It draws members from the laity, religious, and clergy. The role of the APC is to advise the Archbishop of Chicago, provide communication between him and local lay leaders, and support the archdiocesan process of renewal.

Other APC delegates are appointed representatives from each of the six vicariates (pastoral areas of the archdiocese) as well as lay organizations, deacons, Presbyteral Council, Archdiocesan Women's Committee, Youth Council, pastoral associates, directors of Religious Education, sisters, brothers, and religious priests.

The APC meets five times a year with the archbishop, who typically seeks input from the APC on important issues concerning the archdiocese as well as universal Church.

In between the five APC meetings, APC members attend their respective deanery meetings and the meetings of any other local Church groups with which they are affiliated.
