
TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Will You Also Leave?

Today, we are blessed to reflect on powerful readings from Joshua, Ephesians, and the Gospel of John. These texts challenge us to consider our commitments, our relationships, and the profound trust we place in God, especially when His words may be difficult to accept.

In our first reading (Jos 24:18), we find the Israelites gathered at Shechem, reflecting on their journey. Joshua, their leader, confronts them with a pivotal command, “Choose this day whom you will serve.” This moment is not merely about choosing which deity to worship, but about making a conscious and deliberate decision to commit to God despite the challenges and uncertainties ahead. The Israelites proclaim their allegiance to the Lord, testifying to His faithfulness in their history—the miracles, the deliverance from Egypt, and the promise of the land. They recognize that their identity and future rest in the covenant relationship with God.

This theme of commitment carries over into our second reading (Eph 5:32), where Paul speaks about relationships, particularly marriage. He emphasizes mutual submission in love, reflecting the relationship between Christ and the Church. Paul’s analogy illuminates that, just as Christ loved the Church and gave Himself up for her, so too should spouses love one another selflessly. This is not sentimental love but a robust commitment to each other, grounded in sacrificial love. It challenges us to cultivate relationships that mirror the love and unity of Christ and the Church, a love that is faithful and unyielding. Here, we see a beautiful intertwining of the first reading’s call to choose and the second reading’s call to love. Our commitment to God and one another must be rooted in the same fidelity and love God shows us.

Finally, in the Gospel (Jn 6:68), we encounter Jesus’ disciples wrestling with His teaching about the Bread of Life.



Many are grappling with the profound implications of His words, saying, “This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?” Jesus is laying the foundation for His gift of the Eucharist, a teaching that is radical and transformative. Despite the difficulty of the message, Peter responds with a declaration of faith: “Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.”

Many are grappling with the profound implications of His words, saying, “This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?” Jesus is laying the foundation for His gift of the Eucharist, a teaching that is radical and transformative. Despite the difficulty of the message, Peter

responds with a declaration of faith: “Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.” Peter’s response highlights a crucial point: in moments of uncertainty and challenge, we must anchor ourselves in faith. He recognizes that even when the teachings of Jesus are hard to understand or accept, there is no other source of truth and life but Him. Peter’s declaration invites us to reflect on our own faith journey. When faced with difficult truths or moments of doubt, do we choose to walk away, or like Peter, do we affirm our commitment to Christ, trusting in His promise of eternal life? Our relationship with Jesus invites us into a deeper understanding of trust, love, and commitment.

So today, as we reflect on these readings, let us ask ourselves the following questions:

Who or what are we choosing to serve? Joshua challenges us to be intentional about our commitments—whether to God, to our loved ones, or to our communities. May we reaffirm our dedication to Him, recognizing that in Him, we find our true purpose.

How can we express love in our relationships? Paul’s call to sacrificial love encourages us to foster nurturing relationships that reflect Christ’s love and commitment. This may mean making sacrifices or extending grace to those around us, embodying a love that is willing to serve and uplift.

In challenging moments, do we turn to Jesus for strength? Like Peter, we should always remember that when life presents us with tough decisions or hard teachings, Jesus remains the source of our wisdom and strength. He holds the words of eternal life, and our faith in Him can sustain us through any trial.

As we approach the altar today and always, let us bring with us our commitments, our relationships, our struggles, and our faith. May this Eucharist strengthen us to choose rightly, love deeply, and trust fully in the One who is our Bread of Life. Amen.
