
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: The Deaf Hear and The Dumb Speak

Our readings today offer us a message of hope — God is with us and wants to heal us. Both the first reading and the Gospel present us with profound physical healings. In our first reading (Is 35:4-7A), the prophet Isaiah speaks to a weary people who have returned to their homeland after exile. Isaiah proclaims a confident message from the Lord, “Here is your God...He comes to save you... Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared.”

The Gospel (Mk 7:31-37) brings to light the deep compassion of our Lord and the transformative power of faith. In this passage, Jesus encounters a man who is deaf and has a speech impediment, and through a simple yet intimate interaction, He restores both his hearing and his ability to speak. People brought the man to Jesus and begged for his healing. Jesus took the man off by himself, touched his ears and his tongue, then proclaimed, “Be opened!” Immediately he was healed.

The prophecy in the first reading and the story in the Gospel overwhelm us with comfort and peace because we have a compassionate God who sees our physical needs. Yet if we reflect further on these readings, we see that God uses these moments of physical healing as opportunities to restore something much deeper — our souls. Often-times, we are blind and deaf to God in our lives. We miss countless opportunities to see God working in our day-to-day moments — through our loved ones, our community, or even a stranger. We miss the quiet voice of Jesus in our hearts, telling us to choose Him instead of sin, respond in love instead of anger, or care for someone else in a moment instead of ourselves.

The miracle has great relevance for us, not because we are deaf or dumb (which happily most of us are not), but precisely because we have the gifts of hearing and speech. The fact that we have these gifts doesn't mean we use them well. Many people are very poor listeners. And many others have difficulty expressing themselves. A fate even worse than being born deaf is to have ears and yet fail to hear. Worse again is to have ears and refuse to hear, or to have a tongue and refuse to speak. So, we need the Lord's healing touch if we are to use these two precious gifts well.

Our senses are precious and vital. We must experience God with our senses too—with our eyes, our ears, our

tongues, and especially our hearts. The miracle is not so much about the physical healing of a man who was deaf and dumb. Rather, it's about the opening of a person's ears so that he may be able to hear the word of God; and the loosening of his tongue so that he may be able to profess faith in Jesus. A person could have perfect hearing, and yet not hear the word of God. And a person could have perfect speech and be unable to make an act of faith.



Then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, “Ephphatha!”—that is, “Be opened!” And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly. — Mk 7:34-35

Hence, it comes as no surprise that the ceremony of touching the ears and the tongue made its way into the rite of Baptism from early times and is still there to this day. The minister touches the ears and mouth of the person being baptized and says, “The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the dumb speak. May He soon touch your ears to receive His word, and your mouth to proclaim His faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father.” We need to be able to hear the word of God. Then we need to be able to profess that word with our lips. Finally, we need to put it into practice in our lives. When heard and acted on, the word of God is like seed falling on good soil; it makes our lives fruitful.

As we continue our journey of faith, may our hearts be opened—our ears

to listen to the cries of the world, and our mouths to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ. Let us remember that in every healing, in every relationship restored, God is calling us toward wholeness, unity, and community. May our prayer today be for open hearts and minds, ready to embrace God's grace and to share it with those around us. Amen.
