
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY

TIME: Authority as Service

This weekend's readings convey how deeply God understands our weaknesses and sufferings and how we are called to imitate Him through humility and service. Each year, October is not only dedicated as a month of the Rosary but has traditionally been a powerful period of reflection and mobilization for our Church's missionary efforts. I write on behalf of the missionary men and women spreading the Gospel in 1,150 mission territories, to humbly and boldly seek your support and offer a profound opportunity to renew our commitment to the Great Commission: go, make, baptize, and teach.

World Mission Sunday is celebrated globally on the second-to-last weekend of October and serves as a clarion call to mobilize faith, resources, and action in introducing the Gospel to our brothers and sisters living in the furthest reaches of our world. Importantly, it is the only collection mandated by the Code of Canon Law. As the theme for this year's World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis has chosen, "Go and invite everyone to the banquet," inspired by the parable of the wedding banquet in Matthew 22:9. This theme calls us to reach out and welcome all to the feast of God's love, echoing the inclusivity and urgency of the king's invitation. Our mission is to reflect this divine hospitality, bringing joy, compassion, and hope to everyone we encounter, especially in territories where the Gospel has not yet been received, has been only recently embraced, or is courageously upheld in the face of persecution.

Some people like to be in charge. Whether it is the first person to accept a new project at work or school, or the enthusiastic teammate who readily volunteers to organize an event, or the generous individual who always offers to assist, there are people all around who raise their hand and jump in when help is needed. But being in charge presents certain temptations. Sometimes, to really get things done the leader has to be firm in setting expectations and correcting coworkers if everyone is not pulling their weight. This might lead the boss to act with impatience or rudeness. At other times, the leader might fall into the trap of thinking that good was accomplished only because of them, and not due to the joint effort of the whole team working together as one unit. We are reminded in the Gospel reading at today's Mass (Mark 10:35-45) that Jesus is okay with someone stepping up and being in charge, but He is also very concerned that this person, the generous leader-volunteer, be aware of their attitude about responsibility. Quite simply, to the Christian, authority and leadership are not about being served by others or being the boss, but about being of service *to* others.

As mentioned above, the Church celebrates World Mission Day yearly on this weekend, highlighting the important

role of missionary organizations and mission-oriented individuals in sharing the Good News of God's Kingdom and working in cooperation with God to make the Kingdom more visible. This year the Holy Father encourages us to consider how the work of the Missions is one of invitation and hospitality, not about force, control, or status. The missionary is effective when mission work lovingly and generously offers to share God's gifts with persons and communities who might not be aware of those gifts. It is fundamentally an invitation into a better, fuller life within the earthly setting we find now—and ultimately into the fullness of God's life in the Kingdom.

On World Mission Day we pay special attention to the organizations and individuals who do this work in places of dire need. But, in truth, each one of us is called to be a missionary. Christ asks each of us to share with others our love and commitment to discipleship within the specific circumstances of our own lives. The deeper our commitment to discipleship, the more passionate our desire to share it with others can be. But in all this, we should take to heart the truth of the scriptures today. It is good to step up and take responsibility, but not in ways that "lord it over" others. Responsibility and authority in Christ are not about issuing commands or bullying. True Christian leadership is service of one another in response to the real earthly and spiritual needs of the world.

Today, let us recall that we have a loving God who completely understands us and sympathizes with us. He is waiting for us to call on Him for mercy and strength. Yet, let us also recall that our God challenges us to be imitators of Him by becoming humble servants for God and neighbor. Let us make it our daily mission to do the will of God. It will look different for each one of us.

So, if we exist for mission, what is the mission of the Church? The answer to this question is found in the Great Commission we referenced above. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of The Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." Mt.28:19-20

Of these four imperatives that Jesus gave his nascent Church—go, make, baptize, teach—we find in the original Greek that one of them is a finite verb and three are participles. A finite verb is always the grammatical hinge of a sentence, and participles are verbal nouns that, although they qualify a sentence, ultimately make sense only in reference to the finite verb. So, it is with the Great Commission. One of these verbs is the grammatical center of the sentence and thus, also, the theological center.

So, which of the four verbs is the hinge of the Great Commission, and therefore, the heart of our purpose, the very task that gives us our identity?

To Go? — To Make? — To Baptize? — To Teach?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,




