## THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: The Two Great Commandments

Today's Gospel (Mark 12:28-34) presents us with a pivotal moment in Jesus' ministry—a conversation that distills the essence of our faith into two profound commandments. A scribe, genuinely seeking wisdom, approaches Jesus with a question: "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus responds with words that resonate through the ages, providing a foundation for the Christian life.

The rabbis and Jewish religious leaders at the time of Jesus would often discuss which of their 613 laws was the most important. They asked Jesus' opinion and as usual, Jesus went straight to the heart of the matter. Jesus was not saying that the others did not count or were unimportant. He was saying that love is the spirit behind all of them. If we follow the command of love, we will keep the others, if we keep the others without love, we are legalists, or as Paul says in his famous 13th chapter of 1 Corinthians, "If I have not love, I am nothing."

Jesus was asked for one commandment, but he gave us two, to show that the two are inseparable. Part of the problems people have today is that they have forgotten the first part of this commandment. That's why they have problems with the second. Failure to love is a great failure in a Christian. Often, alas, it is not even seen as a sin. Sin is recognized when it means harming a neighbor, but not when it means failing to love, or withholding love. In answering the question Jesus begins by quoting the Shema, a central prayer in Jewish tradition: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." This commandment calls us to a deep and holistic love for God, one that permeates every aspect of our being. It invites us to prioritize our relationship with God, making it the cornerstone upon which everything else is built. Then, He seamlessly links this with a second commandment: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." In doing so, He teaches us that love for God is inseparable from love for our neighbor. These two commandments are not mutually exclusive but are intrinsically connected, forming a dynamic and living expression of our faith.

As we reflect on these commandments, we are called to examine our own lives. Are we loving God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength? Do we seek to deepen this relationship through prayer, contemplation, and worship? Are we striving to love our neighbors as ourselves, looking beyond differences to see the image of God in each person

we encounter? In our fast-paced world, these commandments serve as a reminder to focus on what truly matters. They challenge us to set aside divisions, prejudices, and distractions, and to cultivate a spirit of compassion, empathy, and generosity. When the scribe acknowledges Jesus' wisdom, Jesus tells him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." This declaration is an invitation to all of us. By living out these commandments, we draw closer to God's kingdom, embodying the love that transforms lives and communities.

There is a story about a poor man who went from house to house begging for a little money or a crust of bread, but no one showed him any compassion. Many a door was slammed in his face, and he was turned away with insults. Little wonder that the poor man grew despondent. One wintry day, as he was trudging through the slippery streets, he fell and broke his leg. A passer-by took him to the hospital.

When the people of the town heard that a poor stranger had been taken to the hospital suffering from a broken leg, they felt very sorry for him. Some went to comfort him; others brought him good things to eat. When he left the hospital, they furnished him with warm clothes and gave him a tidy sum of money. Before the poor man left town he wrote to his wife, "Praise God, dear wife. A miracle happened: I broke my leg!" Most people would sooner help one who has fallen than help keep him from falling.

As we move forward in our spiritual lives, let us remember that the path to holiness is one of love—love for God and love for neighbor. In embracing this path, we fulfill not only the greatest commandments, but also our true purpose as disciples of Christ. Amen


