



My Family of Faith,

Every November, our annual parish financial report appears in the church bulletin. It's mainly to account for our Stewardship and show how we have shared our treasures so far. Our Director of Operations/Business Manager, Janice Summerrise, gives us a concise overview of our financial report for the fiscal year 2023-2024 on the page opposite.

Sharing our time, talent, and treasure is the cornerstone for any faith community to stand firm and accomplish the discipleship mission of the church here on earth. That sharing from all of you helps the community to participate in the creative work of God in His world. It's a very humbling thought that God takes our small efforts and creates something marvelous from them.

If we read the Gospels carefully, we find generosity in all of them. We see that those great figures who made the Church as we know it today are those who shared their gifts generously. During this coming Advent, December 1 and beyond, we will hear again and again Mary's response to God when the angel appeared to her. We see an incredible act of faith in Mary's surrender and generosity. The Magi, traveling from afar with gifts for the Christ Child, were generous too. The centurion begging Jesus to cure his servant was generous. The first 12 apostles' leaving everything to follow Jesus was an incredibly generous gesture. And then there is Jesus Himself. His first miracle in Cana was not a miracle of need; it was a miracle of abundance and generosity. Through His life, Jesus served people by teaching them, feeding them, healing them, providing spiritual leadership, and comforting them. Finally, in His suffering and death on the cross, Jesus laid down His life for us in the ultimate act of generosity. The Gospels are a story about the triumph of generosity.

This annual report would not be what it is without your generosity. Generosity is at the heart of the Christian life, just as it is at the heart of the Gospel. For it is often through our generosity that we are able to bring the love of God to life for others in very real and tangible ways.

Some of our highlights over this past year:

- We realized forgiveness of the loan comprised of the monthly Archdiocese invoices that had accumulated over the years dating since year 2000. The school debts were also forgiven.
- The capital debt, which is the loan for the building of the Church nearly 30 years ago, will remain on our books as the Archdiocese continues to work with us.
- Our Religious Education program remains strong at just around 150 students. We are grateful to those who have volunteered to be catechists to these children and share their faith with them.
- I want to also highlight our parishioners' generosity this fiscal year: the fundraising for the furnace and the boiler in the former school which raised over \$100,000.00; and contributions to the Annual Catholic Appeal which surpassed our goal of \$33,036.02, raising \$40,794.00 and yielding \$7,757.98 to our All Souls account.

Thank you all for your continuing stewardship. You have generously shared to keep our doors open and keep All Souls shining in the community of Lansing and beyond. We are at our best when we use the gifts that God gave us. Let us continue to be bold and be Catholics.

Thank you again to each and every one of you for all you do. May the good Lord continue to bless the work your hands.






