THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD Thank You Note and Happy New Year 2025

My Dear Family of Faith All Souls Parish,

I am deeply moved and genuinely grateful for your thoughtful Christmas gifts. Your generosity has touched my heart and brought so much joy to my holiday season. The care and consideration you put into selecting these wonderful presents truly reflects the spirit of Christmas and our loving relationship. Each gift will serve as a beautiful reminder of your kindness and our special bond.

As we bid farewell to the past year 2024 and welcome 2025, I want to wish you abundant blessings, joy, and prosperity in this current year. May the New Year bring you countless moments of happiness, good health, and successful endeavors in all aspects of your life. May your days be filled with peace, love, and wonderful opportunities, and may all your dreams and aspirations come to fruition.

Speaking of the Christmas season, I would like to share a beautiful reflection on the Epiphany, which we celebrate this weekend. The Epiphany is the original feast of Jesus' birth. Eastern Christians celebrated the birth of Jesus on January 6 years before Christians in Rome began to celebrate the birth of Jesus on December 25. Because Epiphany was already well established as a major feast by the time the Roman Church began the December 25 celebration, the Roman Church could not ignore it, so they centered on the coming of the magi as the theme for the feast of the Epiphany. This extended the Christmas celebration for several days, which is appropriate because Christmas is too wonderful an event to limit to only one day.

The word Epiphany comes from a Greek word that means "coming to light" or "appearing." The shepherds who lived in the area of Bethlehem had already had their epiphany when the angels announced the birth of Jesus to them. Today we commemorate God's revelation of the coming of his Son to the magi. magi is a term that described priests of a pagan cult and experts in astrology, interpretation of dreams, and various other occult arts. Their primary job would be to act as advisors to the rulers of the people of Persia (ancient people who lived in modern-day Iran). As advisors to the king and his court, they would have studied the stars for messages from the gods. As pagans, they remind us that Christ's saving light is meant for people of every race and every nationality. If we understand Epiphany as a general word indicating God revealing Himself to anyone, then Epiphany does not end with the magi's visit. God continues to reveal Himself to all people. Some people respond to the revelation, and some do not.

That is the point St. Matthew makes for us in today's Gospel. The magi searched for Christ and found Him. The same opportunities to find our Lord were available to Herod and the Jewish high priests, but they didn't find Him, either because they were uninterested, or they had hostile intent. Herod wanted to find Him to kill Him, and the high



priests, although they knew where the Messiah was to be born, couldn't be bothered going there themselves to look for Him. Christ can be found by anyone whose intent to find Him is honest and who doesn't give up the search. Christ wants us to know Him, that's why He

came to us, and He came a long way to make it possible for us to find Him. We have to go part of the way too. He will not disappoint us if we really want to know Him. Holy Scripture is filled with subtleties we sometimes miss. Matthew tells us that "on entering the house they saw the Child with Mary His mother." Joseph is not present, and there is a reason for that. He was not, as we know, the true father to Jesus. The magi presented gifts to Jesus, not to His mother or His parents. When we give to Jesus today, we do not do it directly, but to the Lord's people through the parish and other charities.

Finally, these visitors worshiped the Lord ("They prostrated themselves and did Him homage."). We, too, need to worship the Lord; we, too, need to acknowledge His holiness and His kingship. Worshiping is more important than the gifts, but we are reminded in this Gospel that both are significant.

Once again, thank you for your wonderful gifts and for being such a blessing in my life. May the light of Christ continue to guide your path throughout the New Year, just as the star guided the Magi to the Savior.

Every mother who has ever lost sight of her child in a crowd, even for a few seconds, knows the panic.

I think of Mary living with that level of anxiety for three straight days. I doubt she slept, but I'm sure Joseph forced her to lie down at night, imploring her to think of her health, to rest while he kept on searching the streets of Jerusalem. I imagine her lying there, eyes open and staring at the ceiling. Mary, full of grace. Mary, spotless of sin. Weeping in the dark, whispering, "Where is he?"

It's an experience that we all have at one point or another. Running through the world, desperate and confused, just trying to find God and failing so miserably that we wonder if He's purposefully eluding us.

If Mary couldn't even find Him, do we stand a chance?

Why didn't Mary think to look in the temple? She had wisdom beyond anyone else who ever lived, at least when it came to Jesus. But I think God purposefully dropped a veil over her reasoning for these three days, so that He could show us it's okay to lose our way.

He isn't eluding us. In fact, He's trying to make it easy. He's staying put, in one place, the very place we should know to look. But the streets of our life are so crowded and loud, so full of distraction.

The Christmas season is about God revealing to us who and what and where He is. He has told us. The question is, have we listened? ©LPi



Plenary Indulgence for the Observance of the Jubilee of Hope Holy Year

December 29, 2024 – December 28, 2025

Pope Francis has granted special Indulgences to the faithful who observe and take part in the celebration of the Jubilee of Hope.

By participating in any Pilgrimage to the designated Jubilee pilgrimage sites, and while fulfilling the usual conditions (see below), one may gain this special Indulgence. The Pilgrimage could be by an individual, or it could be a group of the faithful from the parish. For example, a parish might organize a group to go to a particular site for the celebration of Mass, or they might organize a group to go together to a particular site for a visit.

WHAT MUST ONE DO IN ORDER TO RECEIVE THE SPECIAL PLENARY INDULGENCE?

In order to gain this special Indulgence, a Catholic is required to make sacramental Confession before or after visiting a designated Jubilee pilgrimage site (it may be fulfilled by celebrating the sacrament at the site during the parish's regularly scheduled times), receive the Eucharist at Mass before or after visiting a designated Jubilee pilgrimage site (it may be fulfilled by participating in Mass during the site's regularly scheduled times). In addition a person is to make a profession of faith and offer prayers for the Holy Father's intentions.

In addition to and in conjunction with fulfilling these conditions, one may then take part in any of the following observances of the Jubilee of Hope.

Make a pilgrimage to Holy Name Cathedral, or any one of the designated Jubilee pilgrimage sites and there participate in Mass, or the Sacrament of Penance, or take part in another liturgy or devotion (e.g., a liturgy of the word, the Liturgy of the Hours [Morning Prayer or Evening Prayer], the Stations of the Cross, the Rosary).

One may also gain the Plenary Indulgence by visiting one of the designated Jubilee pilgrimage sites and there, for a suitable period of time, engage in Eucharistic adoration or meditation before the tabernacle, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith (Nicene or Apostles' Creed), and invocations to Mary, the Mother of God.

Sites designated in the Archdiocese of Chicago can be found on the Archdiocesan Jubilee of Hope website (pvm.archchicago.org/jubilee-2025)

Those who for various reasons cannot participate in a Pilgrimage or visit, particularly the sick and people who are elderly and alone, e.g., confined to the home, those incarcerated, can obtain the Jubilee indulgence, under the same conditions if, united in spirit with the faithful who take part in person, they recite the Our Father, the Profession of Faith and invocations to Mary.
