
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

THE SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Values of The Kingdom

This weekend, we are presented with readings that challenge us to live out our faith with courage, grace, and profound love.

In the first reading (1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23), we see a powerful example of mercy and restraint. David had the opportunity to harm Saul, who sought his life, yet he chose to spare him, expressing that it is not his place to harm the Lord's anointed. David's actions display a deep trust in God's justice and timing, showing us that true strength lies in mercy, not vengeance.

Paul's letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor 15:45-49) speaks of the transformation from the physical to the spiritual, contrasting Adam, the man of dust, with Christ, the man of heaven. As followers of Christ, we are called to transcend our earthly limitations and embody the spiritual nature modeled by Jesus. We are invited to reflect the heavenly image, not merely as a future hope, but as a present reality.



Finally, in the Gospel of Luke 6:27-38, we hear Jesus' radical call to love: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you." This passage challenges us to redefine our understanding of love and justice. Jesus calls us to an extraordinary standard of compassion and forgiveness, urging us to love without expecting anything in return, to show kindness to the undeserving, and to forgive generously.

How do we take what Jesus says in this weekend's Gospel literally? Turn the other cheek? Perhaps exaggerated. When Jesus was struck in the face, He didn't turn the other cheek, but instead asked, "Why did you strike me?" He stood up for himself, but He didn't retaliate and hit back, and that's the point. We don't have to become a doormat to be a good

Christian, but we cannot fight violence with violence. If we do, rather than being an agent of love, we're just adding to the amount of violence in this world.

Pray for those who persecute you. I think this is one of the most helpful lines in the Gospels. I pray for people who cut me off on the expressway. I feel they probably need the prayer, and it keeps me from getting angry.

Jesus said, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." The Golden Rule. But it must be understood correctly. For example, if I love wine and decide I'm giving all my friends wine for Christmas (because that's what I would like my friends to do for me), but a couple of my friends are alcoholic, I'm not doing them a favor.

Do we have to simply let people take advantage of us? Is this what being a Christian means? Not really. It means living in the faith that whatever good we do will come back to us. "The measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you." It is with God's love that we are to love.

These readings collectively point to the transformative power of love and mercy. They challenge us to reflect on how we treat others, especially those who may wrong us or are difficult to love. In a world often marked by retaliation and bitterness, these teachings remind us that we are called to be different, to live as citizens of God's kingdom.

Let us draw strength from David's example and courage from Paul's teachings, striving to embody Christ's radical love in our daily lives. By doing so, we not only honor God, but also participate in the transformation of the world around us, becoming instruments of peace and reconciliation.

As we reflect on these passages, may we remember that true justice is found not in retribution but in mercy, not in holding grudges but in forgiveness. Let us commit to living out this divine love, knowing that as we give, we will receive, and as we forgive, we will find forgiveness ourselves. May God guide us in this endeavor, now and always. Amen.






