
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.


**EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
God Foresees What We Cannot**

As we gather today on this Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, our readings invite us to delve into the themes of integrity, transformation, and the authenticity of our Christian witness. These scriptures challenge us to reflect on how our inner lives are manifested in our words and actions, and how the hope of resurrection empowers us to live with purpose and conviction. On this eve of Lent, let us pray for the grace to see our lives from God's eyes.

Our first reading (Sirach 27:4-7) offers profound wisdom on the power of speech and the integrity of one's character. The imagery used—sifting with a sieve, firing a kiln, and cultivating a tree—illustrates how our words reveal the true nature of our hearts. Just as a sieve separates the husks from the grain, our speech can distinguish between wisdom and folly. Sirach reminds us that our words are not just mere expressions but are reflections of our inner selves. They have the power to build up or tear down, to heal or to harm.

In our daily lives, we are constantly faced with opportunities to speak. Whether in conversations with family, friends, or colleagues, our words can be instruments of grace or tools of division. This reading invites us to cultivate a heart of wisdom, ensuring that what flows from our mouths is consistent with the love and truth of God.

In the second reading (1 Corinthians 15:54-58), St. Paul addresses the Corinthian community with a message of hope and victory. He speaks of the transformation that will occur at the resurrection, when mortality is swallowed up by immortality, and death is defeated. This passage is a cornerstone of Christian hope, reminding us that we are promised eternal life through Christ's resurrection.



Paul's words encourage us to remain steadfast and immovable in our faith. He assures us that our labor in the Lord is not in vain. This assurance empowers us to live with purpose, knowing that our efforts to live out the Gospel have eternal significance. In a world where we often face challenges and discouragement, this message is a powerful reminder of the ultimate victory we have in Christ.

In the Gospel reading (Luke 6:39-45), Jesus presents a series of teachings that emphasize the importance of self-awareness and authenticity. He uses the parable of the blind leading the blind to caution against hypocrisy and the dangers of judging others without first examining ourselves. The call to remove the "plank" from our own eye before addressing the "speck" in our neighbor's eye is a call to humility and self-reflection.

Furthermore, Jesus speaks about the tree and its fruit, teaching that a good tree produces good fruit, and a bad tree produces bad fruit. This metaphor invites us to examine the fruits of our lives—our actions, behaviors, and relationships—as indicators of our spiritual health. It challenges us to align our inner selves with the values of the Gospel, ensuring that our lives bear witness to God's love, mercy, and justice.

As we reflect on these readings, we are invited to consider the integrity of our own lives. Are our words and actions consistent with Christ's teachings? Do we embody the hope and transformation promised by the resurrection? Are we producing good fruit that reflects the love and grace of God?

Let us pray for the grace to cultivate hearts of wisdom and integrity, to speak words that build up and encourage, and to live lives that bear witness to the transformative power of the Gospel. May we remain steadfast in our faith, confident in the victory of Christ, and committed to living as authentic disciples. Amen.





LENT BEGINS

WHAT IS LENT? PRAYING FASTING ABSTINENCE

The 40-day period from Ash Wednesday and before Easter Sunday. It is marked by praying, fasting, abstinence, and other acts of penance.

WHAT IS FASTING? One meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed one full meal.

WHAT IS ABSTINENCE? Abstinence is refraining from eating meat. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl.

DAYS OF FAST? Ash Wednesday, Good Friday

DAYS OF ABSTINENCE? Ash Wednesday, All Fridays of Lent, Good Friday

WHO ARE REQUIRED? Catholics from age < 18 to 59 > The sick are excused from fasting

WHO ARE REQUIRED? Mandatory for everyone older than 14 years old

Franciscan Father Ed Shea is the third of eight children from St. Giles Parish in Oak Park. A 1974 graduate of Fenwick High School and a 1978 graduate of the University of Notre Dame, Father Shea joined the Franciscans in 1980 and was ordained a priest in 1987. Father Ed has spent most of his priesthood in parish work, including four years as the priest-president for the St. Giles Family Mass Community in Oak Park, IL and five years as the pastor of St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Joliet, IL. For six years he was pastor of St. Joseph Parish, a predominantly Hispanic

community in Chicago's famous Back of the Yards neighborhood. Father Ed has served on his Provincial Council and as Director of Vocations and Formation for the Franciscans in the Midwest. Father Ed has also preached internationally — in Mexico and Central America and even in Tanzania, Africa. After 12 years at St. Peter's in downtown Chicago, Father Ed has moved to a new Franciscan Inner City Mission in the Diocese of Gary, Indiana where he continues to be involved in a lot of bilingual ministry in the Gary/Chicago area and beyond. A Franciscan priest who loves to sing and tell stories, more than anything he thrives on celebrating the sacraments of the Church. A true follower of St. Francis, Father Ed finds reasons to rejoice often in the goodness of God's presence in our world.
