

2ND SUNDAY OF LENT





THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT Transfiguration

As we gather on the Second Sunday of Lent, our journey through this sacred season invites us to deepen our faith and trust in God's promises. In last week's Gospel, we followed Jesus into the desert, where He fasted and prayed. This week, He leads us up a mountain to witness His Transfiguration. Why both of these experiences? He is preparing us to go with Him in a few short weeks to a hilltop, Golgotha, where He will lay down His life for our sake — and finally to take us to an empty cave where He triumphed over sin and death once and for all.

In our first reading (Genesis, 15:5-12, 17-18), we witness a pivotal moment in the life of Abram (soon to be Abraham). God calls Abram outside and invites him to look at the stars, promising that his descendants will be as numerous as the stars in the sky. Despite Abram's advanced age and the barrenness of his wife Sarai, Abram believes in the Lord, and it is credited to him as righteousness.

This passage reminds us of the power of faith and trusting in God's promises. Abram's faith is both intellectual assent and a deep, abiding trust in God's faithfulness. The covenant God establishes with Abram is a testament to His unwavering commitment to His people. As we journey through Lent, we are called to reflect on our own faith. Do we trust in God's promises, even when circumstances seem impossible? Are we open to the covenant relationship God offers us?

In the second reading (Phil 3:17-4:1), St. Paul urges the Philippians to imitate him and others who live according to the example of Christ. He contrasts those who set their minds on earthly things with those whose citizenship is in heaven. Paul encourages the community to stand firm in the Lord, reminding them that their ultimate transformation will come when Christ returns.

This passage challenges us to examine our priorities and the focus of our lives. Lent is a time to detach from worldly distractions and realign our hearts with the values of the Kingdom of God. Are we living as citizens of heaven, or are we too often consumed by the concerns of this world? Paul's words inspire us to persevere in faith, knowing that our true transformation awaits us in Christ.

In the Gospel (Luke 9:28-36), we are given the magnificent account of the Transfiguration of Jesus. Peter, James, and John accompany Jesus up the mountain, where He is transfigured before them, His face and clothing shining with divine glory. Moses and Elijah appear, speaking with

Jesus about His impending departure. Overwhelmed by the experience, Peter suggests building three tents, but a cloud envelops them, and a voice from heaven declares, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

The Transfiguration is a powerful revelation of Jesus's divine nature and a foretaste of the glory that awaits us. It serves as a reminder that Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets, represented by Moses and Elijah. The voice of the Father calls us to listen to Jesus, to heed His teachings, and to follow His example.

As we reflect on this Gospel, we are invited to consider our own mountaintop experiences—those moments when we have profoundly encountered God's presence. These experiences sustain us, especially during times of trial and darkness. Lent is an opportunity to seek out these encounters with God, to ascend the mountain through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and to allow ourselves to be transformed by His grace.

Continuing our Lenten journey, let us take to heart the lessons of today's readings. Like Abram, may we trust in God's promises and embrace the covenant relationship He offers us. Like the Philippians, let us set our minds on heavenly things, living as citizens of the Kingdom. And like the disciples at the Transfiguration, may

we open our hearts to the glory of Christ, allowing His light to transform us.

May this Lent be a time of deepening faith, renewed hope, and profound love as we prepare to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of our Lord. Amen.






There are two categories to choose from. You can demonstrate your talents and creativity by submitting an Essay that is 500-1500 words **OR** by expressing yourself through Poetry. Poetic entries should be 300 – 1000 words. **The contest is for students in grades 5 through 8 who attend Catholic Schools or who are active members in a Catholic church.** Parent permission is required to participate.


