
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

### THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT: First Scrutiny

This weekend here at All Souls Parish, as we gather to celebrate the Third Sunday of Lent, we also observe the First Scrutiny for our Elect, those preparing to enter fully into the life of the Church through the sacraments of initiation.

Our readings today beautifully illuminate the journey of conversion, a journey that our elect are undertaking and one that we are all called to embrace.

In our first reading (Ex 17:3-7), we encounter the Israelites in the desert, grumbling and thirsting for water. Their physical thirst is a powerful symbol of a deeper spiritual thirst—a longing for God's presence and guidance. In their desperation, they question, "Is the Lord in our midst or not?" Despite their doubts, God provides for them, bringing forth water from the rock. This moment of divine intervention is a call to conversion, inviting the Israelites to trust in God's providence and to turn their hearts towards Him.

In our second reading (Rom 5:1-2,5-8), St. Paul speaks of the peace and hope that come from being justified by faith. He reminds us that "while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." This profound truth underscores the transformative power of God's love—a love that invites us to conversion, to turn away from sin and to embrace the new life offered through Christ. It is a reminder that God's grace is always at work, drawing us closer to Him, even in our moments of weakness.

Our Gospel reading (Jn 4:5-42) presents the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well. Here, we witness a profound moment of personal conversion. The Samaritan woman, initially focused on the physical water, is gradually led by Jesus to recognize her deeper spiritual thirst. Jesus reveals Himself as the source of "living water," offering her the gift of eternal life. Through this encounter, the woman's heart is transformed, and she becomes a witness to her community, inviting others to come and see the Messiah.

These readings collectively call us to reflect on our own journey of conversion. Like the Israelites, we may find ourselves in moments of doubt and questioning, yet God invites us to trust in His presence. Like the Samaritan woman, we are called to recognize our spiritual thirst and to open our hearts to the living water that Christ offers.

For our elect, this time of scrutiny is a sacred opportunity to examine their lives, to identify areas in need of healing and transformation, and to deepen their commitment to Christ. As a community, we stand with them, praying for their strength and openness to God's grace.

Let us all be inspired by these readings to renew our commitment to conversion, to turn away from sin, and to embrace the abundant life that God desires for each of us.

### WHAT ARE SCRUTINIES

So, some people—especially the young ones who have not had chance to attend Mass where the elect or Catechumens are present and being blessed during Mass—might be asking themselves what are Scrutinies? I want to use this opportunity to briefly explain what these Rites are and what the Scrutiny is. The Scrutinies are a series of rites that are part of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) in the Catholic Church.

Presently, these rites are known as The Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA). They are celebrated during Lent, typically on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays, and are intended for those people known as "the elect" preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil.

The purpose of the Scrutinies is to help the elect examine their lives and to encourage repentance and spiritual growth. Each Scrutiny involves prayers of intercession and exorcism, aiming to strengthen the elect in their journey and to purify their hearts and minds. These rites are deeply rooted in the themes of conversion and renewal, preparing the elect to receive the sacraments of initiation.



The prayers of the Scrutinies are designed to support the elect in their spiritual journey and to prepare them for baptism. While the specific wording can vary, the prayers generally include the following elements:

1. Intercessions for the Elect: These prayers ask for God's grace and protection over the elect, seeking strength and guidance for them as they prepare for baptism.
2. Prayer of Exorcism: This prayer asks God to protect the elect from evil and to free them from any obstacles that might hinder their spiritual growth. It emphasizes the power of Christ to overcome sin and darkness.
3. Blessing of the Elect: This prayer asks for God's blessing upon the elect, that they may be filled with the Holy Spirit and continue to grow in faith, hope, and love.

The prayers are often accompanied by the laying on of hands by the priest or deacon, symbolizing the Church's support and the invocation of the Holy Spirit. The Scrutinies are a powerful reminder of the Church's role in nurturing and guiding those who are preparing to enter fully into the Christian community.

### WHY DO THE ELECT LEAVE CHURCH BEFORE MASS?

In OCIA, the Elect—those preparing for baptism—are often dismissed after the Liturgy of the Word during Mass.

This practice has deep roots in the early Church and serves several important purposes:

1. **Focused Catechesis:** The dismissal allows the Elect to engage in a more focused and intimate reflection on the Scriptures they have just heard. This time is used for breaking open the Word, where they can discuss and understand the readings in the context of their faith journey.
2. **Spiritual Preparation:** The period leading up to their full initiation into the Church is a time of intense spiritual preparation. By leaving before the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the Elect are reminded of their journey towards full communion with the Church, in which they will fully participate once they are baptized, confirmed, and receive the Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.
3. **Community Support and Prayer:** The dismissal is also a reminder to the entire congregation of their role in supporting and praying for the Elect. It emphasizes the communal aspect of the faith journey, highlighting that the Elect are not alone but are accompanied by the prayers and encouragement of the Church community.
4. **Anticipation and Desire:** By not participating in the Eucharist until they are fully initiated, the Elect develop a deeper longing and appreciation for the sacraments. This anticipation can lead to a more profound experience of the sacraments when they finally receive them.

Overall, the dismissal is a meaningful tradition that underscores the transformative journey of faith the Elect are undertaking and the community's role in supporting them.

I hope this brief explanation will help as a reminder to all of us to know our role as Christian disciples in this journey of the Elect wherever we are.





### **PRAYER REQUEST**


Last weekend we began our tradition of asking the All Souls parishioners to pray for the students and adults who will be making their First Communion and Confirmation this spring. As in years past, symbols bearing the names of those making the sacraments have been made available in the Narthex for people to take home. The intent is that each First Communicant and Confirmand will have someone praying for them as they finish their preparations for the sacraments. This year, however, you might have noticed something a little different. In addition to the names of those receiving the sacraments, we have also indicated on the doves the saint that each student chose so that you may pray to the saint as well. Also, this year you

will find a second dove and chalice on which you should write your own name so that the child can pray for you in return. If you have not picked up a dove or chalice from the table in the Narthex, we invite you to do so and include our students in your prayers.

First Communion will take place this year on Saturday, May 10 at 10:00 a.m. Confirmation will follow the next weekend on Sunday, May 18 at 3:00 p.m., with Bishop Robert Fedek presiding. Please keep praying for the students until they make their sacraments, and join us for these special liturgies to pray for them one last time.


