

## OUR VISION


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.



## **SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER: Divine Mercy Sunday**

Today, as we gather to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, we are invited to reflect more deeply on the boundless ocean of God's mercy, a mercy that is vividly portrayed in the readings of this blessed Second Sunday of Easter. The message of Divine Mercy is not only a call to trust in God's infinite love but also a call to extend that same mercy to others. Let us explore the richness of this weekend's readings and uncover the profound message they hold for each one of us.

In the first reading (Acts 5:12-16), we witness the early Church in its vibrant infancy, where the apostles perform many signs and wonders among the people. The apostles, filled with the Holy Spirit, become instruments of God's mercy, healing the sick and casting out unclean spirits. This passage reminds us that the Church is called to be a vessel of God's mercy in the world. Just as the apostles brought healing and hope to those around them, we too are called to be agents of God's mercy, bringing healing and hope to a world in desperate need.

The second reading (Rev 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19) presents us with a vision of the risen Christ, clothed in majesty and power. John, the beloved disciple, encounters the glorified Jesus, who reassures him with the words, "Do not be afraid." This encounter is a powerful reminder that God's mercy is not only about forgiveness, but also about the assurance of His presence with us. In moments of fear and uncertainty, we are invited to turn to the risen Christ, who stands among us, offering His peace and mercy.

The Gospel reading (Jn 20:19-31) provides a profound encounter between the risen Jesus and His disciples. This Gospel reading is often referred to as the story of "Doubting Thomas," but the passage involves so much more than merely the encounter with the skeptical apostle. It is rich with lessons of Christ's mercy to all, including an encouraging word from our Lord, especially for us, His modern-day disciples.

While Thomas traditionally takes a bad rap for his doubts, we see that none of the Apostles were at their best when Christ first appeared to them after His resurrection. They were in hiding, cowering behind a locked door because they were afraid of what the Jews might do to them for their association with Jesus. They were paralyzed by fear and doubt. But Jesus appeared right in their midst despite the lock on the door. Was it to rebuke them for their lack of faith? To chide them for abandoning Him when He needed them most? To call them out for being so wimpy? Quite the contrary. He comes on a mission of mercy. He comes to offer them peace and the restoration of their relationship with Him.

On the evening of that first day of the week, Jesus appears to His disciples, who are gathered in fear behind locked

doors. His first words to them are, "Peace be with you." With this simple greeting, Jesus offers them His mercy, dispelling their fears and doubts. He then breathes on them, imparting the Holy Spirit and granting them the authority to forgive sins. This moment marks the institution of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a sacrament of mercy where we experience the healing and forgiveness of God.

The encounter with Thomas further illustrates the depth of God's mercy. Thomas, who was not present at Jesus' first appearance, struggles with doubt and demands tangible proof of the resurrection. When Jesus appears again, He



invites Thomas to touch His wounds, saying, "Do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas' response, "My Lord and my God!" is a profound act of faith, and Jesus' gentle rebuke, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed," extends a blessing to all of us who believe without seeing.

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, we are reminded that God's mercy is a gift freely given to all who seek it. It is a mercy that meets us in our doubts and fears, offering us peace and forgiveness. It is a mercy that calls us to be merciful to others, to forgive as we have been forgiven, and to love as we have been loved. As we reflect on these readings, let us open our hearts to the Divine Mercy of God. Let us trust in His love and allow His mercy to transform our lives. May we become instruments of His peace and mercy in the world, bringing healing and hope to all we encounter.

In the words of St. Faustina, the Apostle of Divine Mercy, let us pray, "Jesus, I trust in You." Amen.



**Gospel:** The resurrected Jesus' first words to his disciples are "Peace be with you." How could you be a peacemaker this week with a family member or neighbor?






## Parish Prayer Tree

Our 4th grade through high school students are also invited to become altar servers and have the chance to serve more frequently once they are trained (call the office FMI).

We sincerely hope that our families will attend Mass and participate from the pews every week, not only on Family Mass Sundays. Your friends are invited, too!

## RE & Faith Formation

### ***EVERYONE IS INVITED TO THE TABLE!***

In just a couple of weeks, 35 of our students will receive the Holy Eucharist for the first time. This is a wonderful time for these children, not for the new clothes they will wear or the party they will have afterwards, but rather for the great opportunity to be closer to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Yes, the first reception of communion is a time to celebrate, but so is every other time we receive the precious Body and Blood throughout our lives. Let's review what all of this really means.

To begin, the celebration of the Eucharist is the central purpose of the Mass. We should look forward to attending this celebration and should treat it as such. When we dress to go

to church, we should dress for the divine meal to which we have been invited, not for what we will be doing after. We are going to the house of God, not the park, a sporting event, or anything else. Let's take the time to prepare properly.

And since we are on the subject of time, we should also think about the limited time we have to share in the presence of God, to hear His Word, to share at His table. We have such a small amount of time to be with God in His house, we should try to arrive early and not leave until the celebration has ended, after the final song has concluded.

The music of the liturgy is a beautiful prayer in which we should all participate. The songs are not meant to be a concert for us to sit back and enjoy, we are not merely being sung to. This is a time for us to also raise our own voices in praise. And even though our choir does an excellent job leading us in song, it is not appropriate to applaud. We do not clap after we pray the Creed or the Lord's Prayer, likewise, we should not applaud after the prayers that we sing.

The Eucharist is meant to be shared by all. Only grave sin should keep someone away from receiving the Eucharist. But even if we cannot physical-

ly receive the Eucharist, we may still participate. All are invited to walk in procession and approach the table of the Lord to receive a blessing from the priest or Eucharistic Minister. Go forward and pray that you might one day be able to receive Christ again in the Holy Eucharist.

If you are receiving communion, please take the time to acknowledge the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. As Catholics, we believe that we are not receiving bread and wine, but rather Christ Himself, freely given as a sacrifice for our sins so that we might have eternal life. Walk forward and bow before the Lord. When the minister says, "The Body of Christ" or "the Blood of Christ," respond with "Amen," which means "I believe."


Next, extend your hands, raised to make a throne for the Lord to sit upon, or open your mouth and extend your tongue slightly. Respectfully receive Christ in the Eucharist and consume it immediately;

do not walk away with Christ in your hands. Return to your seat and kneel in a prayer of thanksgiving to God for the Gifts He has given us. If possible, join in the prayer being sung by the choir or cantor. And most importantly, remember the presence of Christ within you as you go forward and leave the church to live a life that gives honor to God.

I invite you all to join the children and their families on Saturday, May 10 at 10:00 a.m. to celebrate this sacrament. The celebration of the Eucharist is meant to be done communally, so please share in the love of Christ with these children and show them that we are all one Church, the body of Christ.


