

#### **FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER: Good Shepherd Sunday, Vocation Sunday, and Mother's Day Weekend**

The image of Jesus as the Shepherd of the Father's flock is one of the most beautiful images we have of Him. And we owe it to Jesus himself. This is how He described himself and His mission. Jesus is no hireling. The hireling doesn't own the sheep and runs away when he sees a wolf approaching. Jesus is the Good Shepherd. The sheep belong to Him, and He is ready to die for them.

This weekend, the Church invites us to celebrate three beautiful themes: Good Shepherd Sunday, Vocation Sunday, and, in many places, Mother's Day. Each of these themes is deeply connected to the love, guidance, and care that God has for us, His people. Let us open our hearts to God's Word and reflect on what it means to be led by the Good Shepherd, to discern our vocations, and to honor the loving shepherds in our own lives, especially our mothers.

***The Voice of the Good Shepherd*** In today's Gospel (John 10:27-30), Jesus says, "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow Me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish. No one can take them out of My hands." What a powerful promise! Jesus, the Good Shepherd, knows each of us personally. He calls us by name. He leads us, protects us, and promises us eternal life. The image of the shepherd was very familiar to Jesus' listeners. Shepherds lived with their sheep, cared for them, and even risked their lives for them. The sheep, in turn, learned to recognize the shepherd's voice and trusted him completely.

Today, Jesus invites us to listen for His voice amid the many competing voices in our world. The voice of the Good Shepherd is the voice of love, truth, and mercy. He calls us to follow Him, not just as individuals, but as a flock—a community. He assures us that nothing can separate us from His love: "No one can take them out of my hand."

***The Universal Call—A Multitude from Every Nation*** The second reading (Rev 7:9, 14b-17) gives us a glimpse of the heavenly vision: "I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb." This is the destiny of the flock of the Good Shepherd—a destiny open to all people. The Lamb, who is Christ, becomes the Shepherd who leads us to springs of life-giving water. "God will wipe away every tear from their eyes." This vision reminds us that the Church is universal. The call of the Good Shepherd is for everyone. No one is excluded. And as we gather for the Eucharist, we are united with this great multitude, joining our voices in praise and thanksgiving.

***The Mission of the Church—Witness and Perseverance*** In the first reading (Acts 13:14, 43-52), we see Paul and Barnabas proclaiming the Word of God. They face both acceptance and rejection. Some people are filled with joy and the Holy Spirit, while others stir up opposition. Yet, the

apostles remain faithful to their mission, undeterred by obstacles. This is the story of the Church throughout history. The message of the Good Shepherd is not always welcomed. Sometimes, following Christ requires courage and perseverance. But the Church continues to grow, as more people hear the Shepherd's voice and join the flock.

This weekend is also Vocation Sunday. We are invited to pray for and reflect upon the vocations God is calling us to—priesthood, religious life, marriage, single life, and all forms of service. Each of us has a unique role in God's plan. The Good Shepherd calls each of us by name and invites us to follow Him in a particular way. Let us pray for those discerning their vocation, especially for young people. Let us support them with our encouragement and prayers. The Church needs shepherds—priests, deacons, religious sisters and brothers—who will guide the flock with the heart of Christ. The world needs Christian families, built on love and faith, where children can learn to recognize the voice of the Shepherd.

On this Mother's Day weekend, we give thanks for our mothers, grandmothers, and all those who have shown us the love of a shepherd. Mothers are often the first to teach us about God, to nurture us, to comfort us, to lead us in faith. Their sacrifices and tenderness reflect the care of the Good Shepherd. Let us honor our mothers, living and deceased, and all women who have been spiritual mothers to us. Let us pray for mothers who are struggling, for those who are alone, for those who have lost children, and for those who long to be mothers. May they know the comfort and strength of the Good Shepherd.

So, how do we respond to the voice of the Good Shepherd?

- By listening—setting aside time for prayer, Scripture, and silence, we can hear His voice amid the noise of the world.
- By trusting—believing that the Shepherd will lead us, even through the valleys of life, and that nothing can snatch us from His hand.
- By following—living out our vocation with generosity, courage, and love, serving others as Christ serves us.
- By belonging, committing ourselves to the community of the Church, supporting one another, and welcoming new members into the flock.

Dear family of faith, today the Good Shepherd calls each of us by name. He invites us to listen, to trust, to follow, and to belong. He asks us to pray for more shepherds, to support one another in our vocations, and to honor those who have shepherded us, especially our mothers.

May we always recognize the voice of the Good Shepherd, and may we follow Him with joy, knowing that He leads us to life, and that nothing can ever separate us from His love. Amen.

All Souls will again participate in the Baby Bottle Project to benefit the Women's Centers of Greater Chicagoland, a non-profit organization that assists mothers and families experiencing crisis pregnancies by offering emotional, financial, material, and spiritual support through counseling, clothing and monetary provisions, prayer, and other aid. Each year, the Women's Center sees over 5,000 expectant mothers in their three locations, one of which is located at Our Lady of Knock in Calumet City. They estimate to have saved over 40,000 babies and their mothers from abortion since opening in 1984.



Please take a Baby Bottle home with you from the Narthex this weekend, May 10-11, fill it with your spare change, and return it Father's Day weekend, June 14-15.
