
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.



PENTECOST SUNDAY: A New Language Is Born

Today, we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost—the birthday of the Church, the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and filled them with power from on high. Pentecost is not just a historical event; it is a living reality for us. The Spirit who came upon the apostles is the same Spirit who comes to us today, breathing new life, unity, and mission into the Church. Let us reflect briefly on the meaning of Pentecost using the three readings the church provides this weekend.

In the first reading (Acts 2:1-11), we hear the dramatic account of the coming of the Holy Spirit. The apostles were gathered in one place, fearful and uncertain. Suddenly, there was a sound like a mighty wind, and tongues of fire rested on each of them. They were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different languages.

What was this new language? It was the language of peace rather than of war; the language of cooperation rather than of competition; the language of forgiveness rather than of vengeance; the language of hope rather than of despair; the language of tolerance rather than of bigotry; the language of friendship rather than of hostility; the language of unity rather than of division; the language of love rather than of hate.

Through the gift of the Spirit, people of different languages learned to profess one faith, to the praise and glory of God. That is the real miracle of Pentecost, and it is a miracle which, thankfully, still happens and we still need it to happen more often. What is the significance of this moment of the Spirit coming upon Jesus' disciples?

- **Unity in Diversity:** People from every nation heard the apostles speaking in their own languages. The Spirit breaks down barriers and unites people of all backgrounds. Where there was once confusion and division (as at the Tower of Babel in the Old Testament), now there is understanding and unity in the Spirit.
- **Empowerment for Mission:** The apostles, once afraid, are now bold. The Spirit transforms them from timid followers into courageous witnesses. Pentecost is the moment the Church is sent out to proclaim the Good News to all nations.


In the second reading; (1 Cor 12:3b-7, 12-13), St. Paul reminds us that there are Many Gifts, but One Spirit. St. Paul continues to tell us that the Holy Spirit is the source of all the gifts in the Church. "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit." Each of us has received gifts—charisms—for the good of the whole community.

- **Unity in the Body of Christ:** Though we are many, we are one body in Christ. The Spirit baptizes us into one body, whether Jew or Greek, slave or free. Our differ-

ences are not obstacles, but opportunities for the Spirit to work in diverse and beautiful ways.

- **The Common Good:** Our gifts are not for ourselves alone. The Spirit gives them "for the common good." Pentecost challenges us to use our gifts to build up the Church and serve the world all around us.

In the Gospel (John 20:19-23), the risen Jesus appears to the disciples, who are locked away in fear. He says, "Peace be with you." Then He breathes on them and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them."



- **The Gift of Peace:** The first gift of the Spirit is peace—shalom. In our troubled and anxious world, the Spirit brings the peace that only Christ can give.
- **The Power to Forgive:** The Spirit empowers the Church to continue Jesus' mission of reconciliation. We are called to be instruments of forgiveness and healing in a world wounded by sin and division.

What does Pentecost mean for us today?

- **Open Your Heart:** Like the apostles, we must open our hearts to the Holy Spirit.

Invite Him to fill you with His gifts and His fire.

- **Embrace Unity:** Let us celebrate our diversity and work for unity in our families, our parish, and our world.
- **Live the Mission:** The Spirit sends us out to be witnesses—to proclaim the Gospel not just with words, but with our lives of love, service, and forgiveness.

Let us pray: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in us the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit, and You shall renew the face of the earth. Amen.



As we near the end of the fiscal year on June 30, we are happy to announce that we have accomplished a feat that has not been achieved at All Souls in a very long time.

We paid our monthly Archdiocesan assessment of \$17,600 every single month of FY25 without ever dipping into our savings!



That number is pretty intimidating, isn't it? When we think of our own monthly household expenses, what comes to mind is the mortgage, utilities, tuition, etc. Parishes in the Archdiocese of Chicago are all required to go above and beyond monthly operating expenses like these and contribute a monthly assessment to support the broader mission and operations of the archdiocese. This assessment helps fund professional services, property insurance, employee healthcare, ministries, and administrative functions that benefit all parishes.

We were able to accomplish this feat this year due to responsible cost-cutting (thank you, Fr. Mark and Janice Summerrise) and YOUR weekly contributions (thank you, loyal supporters). This is yet another reason for continued financial vigilance and sustained giving over the summer months. We are so grateful to our generous parishioners and visitors for your contributions—you are rockstars!

Each year, the Women's Center sees over 5,000 expectant mothers in their three locations, one of which is located at Our Lady of Knock in Calumet City. They estimate to have saved over 40,000 babies and their mothers from abortion since opening in 1984.






