

## OUR VISION


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

## THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Today we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast is rather unique in that it honors a doctrine rather than an event. What we are commemorating today is a central reality of our Christian faith, that God is Trinitarian in nature — three distinct persons — Father, Son and Holy Spirit — in one God.

The Church calls this truth a mystery, as indeed it is. It is not a mystery in the sense that it is a question that must be answered, but rather in the sense that the depths of this truth are far beyond our human comprehension. Some have said that “mystery” in this context is “not a wall to run up against but an ocean in which to swim.” Again, this is not just a theological puzzle, but the very heart of who God is and how God relates to us.

Our first reading (Proverbs 8:22-31) gives us a poetic vision of God’s Wisdom, present from the very beginning. Wisdom speaks, saying, “The Lord created me at the beginning of his work... I was beside Him, like a master worker, delighting in the human race.” Early Christians saw this Wisdom as a foreshadowing of Christ, the Word of God, through whom all things were made.

This passage shows us that God’s work is not cold or distant. From the very start, God’s Wisdom delights in creation, especially in humanity. God’s relationship with us is marked by joy, closeness, and love. The Trinity is not a mathematical problem, but a living relationship—a communion of love that overflows into creation.

St. Paul (Romans 5:1-5) tells us what this relationship means for our lives. “We have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ... and God’s love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit.” Here, we see the Trinity at work: the Father sends the Son to bring us peace; the Holy Spirit pours God’s love into our hearts.

Paul reminds us that our faith is not just about believing certain things but about living in a relationship with the Triune God. Even when we face difficulties, “suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope.” This hope does not disappoint, because the Holy Spirit is with us, filling us with God’s love.

In the Gospel (John 16:12-15), Jesus tells His disciples that the Spirit will guide them into all truth. Jesus says, “All that the Father has is Mine. For this reason, I said that He [the Spirit] will take what is Mine and declare it to you.” Here, Jesus reveals the unity and cooperation within the Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Spirit share everything, working together for our salvation.

The Spirit does not speak on Its own but takes what belongs to Jesus and makes it known to us. This means that

the Holy Spirit continues to reveal God’s love and truth to us, leading us deeper into the mystery of God’s life.

What then should be the response of us as Christian stewards to this sublime mystery? All we can do is worship.

And offer our lives back to God in total gratitude for calling us to live in the richness of such unfathomable love. This week let’s reinvite God into the midst of our lives and make sure the way we spend our time and energy each day shows Him our profound gratitude for His many gifts to us, but above all the gift of Himself in the Trinity — Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The Trinity is not just a doctrine to be believed, but a mystery to be lived. God is a communion of persons, and we are made in God’s image. This means we are called to live in loving relationships—with God and with one another.

- The Father invites us into His creative love.
- The Son brings us peace and reconciliation.
- The Holy Spirit fills us with hope and guides us in truth.

*Next weekend is Corpus Christi, and we will have a procession. I wanted to enlighten you about the meaning of this procession. It is a public act of worship in which the consecrated Eucharist—the Body of Christ—is carried outside the church and through the streets, often accompanied by prayers, hymns, and adoration. For us it will be immediately after the 10:30 a.m. Mass. This procession is a way for Catholics to honor and proclaim their faith in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It is also a visible sign of bringing Christ into the world, showing that Jesus is with us and blessing our communities. The procession reminds us that we are called to carry Christ’s love and presence beyond the church and into our daily lives. Amen.*

**Question:** *Why is it so important that we register at All Souls? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?*

**Answer:** *Registration is the official way we join a parish community.* Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering at All Souls is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
