
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (Corpus Christi): Jesus Feeds His People

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi. On this day, the Church invites us to contemplate the great Gift of the Eucharist: The very word, Eucharist, means “thanksgiving” or “gratitude,” and so this feast is especially meaningful to all of us who are striving to live as grateful stewards of all God’s blessings to us. Surely the Eucharist is the greatest of all blessings because it is not only from God, but also is God — the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Through the readings of this weekend, we are drawn into the mystery of God’s love that nourishes, unites, and transforms us.

Our first reading (Genesis 14:18-20) takes us back to the mysterious figure of Melchizedek, king of Salem and priest of God, Most High. Melchizedek brings out bread and wine and blesses Abram, giving thanks to God for victory and blessing him. This brief encounter is full of meaning. Melchizedek’s offering of bread and wine is a foreshadowing of the Eucharist, where Christ, our eternal High Priest, offers Himself under the forms of bread and wine for our salvation.

Melchizedek’s blessing reminds us that every good thing comes from God and our response must be gratitude and worship. Just as Abram received the blessing and gave a tenth of everything, we too are called to offer ourselves—our lives, our gifts, our hearts—in thanksgiving to God.


In the second reading, (1 Corinthians 11:23-26), St. Paul recalls the words and actions of Jesus at the Last Supper: “This is My body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of Me... This cup is the new covenant in My blood.” These are not just words from the past, but a living reality every time we celebrate the Eucharist.

Paul reminds us that the Eucharist is both a memorial and a proclamation. When we gather around the altar, we remember and make present the sacrifice of Christ. We proclaim His death and resurrection until He comes again. The Eucharist is the heart of our faith, the source and summit of our Christian life. It is here that Jesus gives Himself completely to us, so that we may become one with Him and with each other.

The Gospel (Luke 9:11b-17) tells the story of Jesus feeding the multitude with five loaves and two fish. The disciples are overwhelmed by the needs of the crowd, but Jesus tells them, “Give them something to eat yourselves.” When they bring what little they have, Jesus blesses, breaks, and gives

the bread and fish to the people. All are satisfied, and twelve baskets are left over.

This miracle points to the Eucharist in several ways. First, it shows Jesus’ compassion for the people—He cares for their physical and spiritual hunger. Second, it reveals the power of God to take what is small and multiply it beyond our imagination. Third, the actions of Jesus—taking, blessing, breaking, and giving—are the same actions He performs at the Last Supper and in every Mass.



The miracle also teaches us about our role. Jesus invites the disciples to participate in His work. He asks them to bring what they have, and He transforms it. In the same way, we are called to bring our lives, our gifts, and our needs to Jesus, trusting that He will bless and multiply them for the good of all.

The Eucharist is not just a private devotion, but a call to unity and service. When we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we become the Body of Christ in the world. We are sent out to feed the hungry, to care for the poor, to bring hope to the lonely, and to

work for justice and peace.

This weekend, Catholics all over the world have a Procession with the consecrated Eucharist in a monstrance. For our Parish, this will take place after the 10:30 Mass. This procession is a way for Catholics to honor and proclaim their faith in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It is also a visible sign of bringing Christ into the world, showing that Jesus is with us and blessing our communities. The procession reminds us that we are called to carry Christ’s love and presence beyond the church and into our daily lives.



Do You Have a Special Prayer Intention?

The Prayer Intention Book is located in the northeast corner of the Narthex, to the right of the doors as you are entering church.





Life Line Screening is a preventive health screening service that offers non-invasive tests to assess the risk of cardiovascular disease, stroke, and other chronic conditions, primarily for adults aged 40 and older. We are considering hosting a Life Line Screening at All Souls/St. Ann in October, where you would be able to be assessed for all of the following at a cost of less than \$200 (insurance does not cover this--it is out of pocket to the participant).

- Cardiovascular Disease Risk: Tests to assess heart health and detect conditions like atrial fibrillation
- Stroke Risk: Screenings to evaluate the risk of stroke and other vascular issues
- Chronic Disease Screening: Tests for diabetes, liver function, kidney function, and certain types of cancer
- Bone Density Testing: To assess bone health and risk of osteoporosis

Many preventive tests are not covered by insurance or Medicare unless symptoms are present, so this is a great opportunity to be proactive with your health. We do want to make certain that enough of our parishioners and friends want to take advantage of the opportunity before we jump in. Whether or not you would want to participate, will you please answer a quick survey to tell us? Thank you in advance!





I. Strengths (Good News)

- a. Quality candidates, stability with numbers of new seminarians over the past seven years, retention is strong
- b. Strong number of Latino discerners attending events
- c. Projected new seminarians for 2025: Seven
- d. Growth in lay supporters
- e. One new seminarian from Asian/Pacific Islander community and one new seminarian from the Black Catholic community
- f. Over the past 10 years, Vicariate I has given the most seminarians

II. Weaknesses (areas for growth)

- a. Overall number remains low: 31 seminarians
- b. No new candidates from Polonia in over 10 years
- c. No new Latino candidates since 2022

III. Opportunities

- a. Growth with candidates for college seminary
- b. Increased mentoring of the discerners at parish level
- c. More consistent promotion vocation at the parish level


IV. Threats

- a. Pace of life for priests and discerners
- b. Fear of commitment for candidates
