

## THE SOLEMNITY OF ST. PETER AND ST. PAUL

Our celebrations this month have spanned from June 8, Pentecost, the birthday of the Church, to June 15, the Most Holy Trinity, to June 22, Corpus Christi, to today's Solemnity, when we celebrate the lives and faith and service of Sts. Peter and Paul.

On June 29 in the year 258, Pope Sixtus VI celebrated the two together at the St. Sebastian Catacombs in Rome, and that is why we commemorate them together on this date. It is worth noting that throughout the St. Sebastian Catacombs, prayers are carved on the walls by early Christians, which begin "Petrus et Paulus." These two mainstays of our Catholic Church are almost considered as one in terms of their total impact, and they have been for centuries.

The readings for this Solemnity touch on the significance of both Sts. Peter and Paul and expand our understanding of how deep their influence was on the Church as well as on those of us who are among the faithful of that Church.

In our Gospel reading (Mt 16:13-19), we witness a pivotal moment in Peter's journey. Jesus asks His disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" After hearing various responses, He poses the more personal question, "But who do you say that I am?" It is Peter who boldly proclaims, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." This profession of faith becomes the foundation of Peter's mission. Jesus responds, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it."

Peter's journey wasn't without struggles. He was impulsive, sometimes fearful, and even denied Jesus three times. Yet Christ chose him, transformed him, and entrusted him with the keys of the kingdom. In our first reading (Acts 12:1-11), we see God's miraculous intervention to free Peter from prison, showing how God protected His chosen vessel despite Herod's persecution that had already claimed the life of James.

Our second reading (2Tm 4:6-8) presents Paul's powerful testimony near the end of his life. "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." These words from 2 Timothy reveal a man who had given everything for the Gospel. Paul, once a persecutor of Christians, became one of the most zealous proclaimers of Christ after his dramatic conversion. Paul acknowledges that "the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed." His life became a living sacrifice, as he describes it, "I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come." Despite facing opposition, imprisonment, and countless hardships, Paul remained steadfast in his mission to bring the Gospel to the Gentiles.

What makes this feast so powerful is that we celebrate these two apostles together, despite their different back-

grounds, personalities, and even occasional disagreements. Peter was a fisherman who knew Jesus personally during His earthly ministry, while Paul was an educated Pharisee who encountered the risen Christ in a vision on the road to Damascus. They had different approaches and sometimes differed in opinion, yet they remained united in the essential truth of the Gospel.

Their relationship teaches us that unity doesn't require uniformity. As one homily beautifully expresses it, "It is always possible through God's grace to walk hand in hand even if we don't always see eye to eye." They show us that the Church can accommodate different perspectives while maintaining communion in the essential truths of faith.

Saints Peter and Paul challenge us to examine our own faith and commitment. Do we, like Peter, boldly confess Christ as the Son of the living God? Do we, like Paul, pour ourselves out in service to the Gospel? Their lives remind us that faith is not passive but active—it requires courage, perseverance, and sometimes sacrifice.

These saints also remind us of the importance of unity in the Church. Despite our differences of opinion or approach, we must "remain as one and show a united front. Unity and Communion are at the center" of our faith. Their example calls us to overcome our differences through mutual respect and love, united by our common faith in Christ.

As we celebrate these "wings of divine knowledge who soared above the ends of the earth," these "hands of the grace of the Gospel," let us ask for their intercession. May Saints Peter and Paul help us to grow in faith, to proclaim the Gospel fearlessly, and to work for unity within the Church. Like them, may we fight the good fight, finish the race, and keep the faith, so that we too may receive "the crown of righteousness" that the Lord has prepared for all who have loved His appearing.

Saints Peter and Paul, pray for us! Amen.



## THE SALE OF THE ST. JAMES PROPERTY IN SAUK VILLAGE

Now that it is finalized, we can announce the details of the sale of the former St. James church/school, parish hall, and convent. The property was sold to Community Consolidated Schools District 168 of Sauk Village on December 16, 2024 for \$1,400,000.00. After real estate commissions and fees of \$78,771.00 to McColly and Bennett Real Estate (All Souls' representative in the sale), we closed at \$1,321,229.00. The Archdiocese Real Estate department was also part of the process on the legal side, charging us \$24,000 for their services. The parish ultimately received \$1,297,229.00, which was deposited in the Archdiocesan Bank as per our diocesan policy.

We all share a desire to be faithful stewards of our financial resources. As a parish, we're making great strides toward long-term financial stability—working toward the goal of sustaining our operations without dipping into savings. At present, we've placed the funds into a six-month CD that matures in August. When it does, our intention is to reinvest in the market to achieve the best possible return. We're actively consulting with the Archdiocese Bank and the Archdiocesan Financial Office, and we'll be meeting with our All Souls Finance Council to determine the most prudent path forward.

Please know that we at All Souls are fully committed to managing these finances responsibly. For the first time in many years, we have true savings in the bank—and that's a hopeful sign of a strong and promising future.

## Did You Notice the Large Donation to the St. Vincent de Paul Society in This Week's Money Matters?

Special thanks to the generous donor who recently contributed \$5,000 to SVdP (see page 5). Did you know that one of the most tax-savvy ways you can make a donation is through a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from a retirement fund? If you're age 70½ or older, you may transfer up to \$100,000 per year directly from your traditional IRA to a qualified charity, such as SVdP or All Souls. This transfer counts toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and is excluded from your taxable income, which can be a big win come tax season.

Here's how it works:

- The donation must go directly from your IRA custodian to the charity—you can't withdraw the money yourself first.
- It only applies to IRAs, not 401(k)s or other retirement plans. However, you can roll over funds from a 401(k) into an IRA and then make a QCD.
- You won't get a charitable deduction for the gift, but since it's not counted as income, it can help reduce your overall tax burden.

If you're thinking long-term, you can also name a charity as a beneficiary of your retirement account in your estate plan. This can reduce the tax burden on your heirs while supporting a cause you care about.






Life Line Screening is a preventive health screening service that offers non-invasive tests to assess the risk of cardiovascular disease, stroke, and other chronic conditions, primarily for adults aged 40 and older. We are considering hosting a Life Line Screening at All Souls/St. Ann in October, where you would be able to be assessed for all of the following at a cost of less than \$200 (insurance does not cover this--it is out of pocket to the participant).

- Cardiovascular Disease Risk: Tests to assess heart health and detect conditions like atrial fibrillation
- Stroke Risk: Screenings to evaluate the risk of stroke and other vascular issues
- Chronic Disease Screening: Tests for diabetes, liver function, kidney function, and certain types of cancer
- Bone Density Testing: To assess bone health and risk of osteoporosis

**Many preventive tests are not covered by insurance or Medicare unless symptoms are present, so this is a great opportunity to be proactive with your health.** We do want to make certain that enough of our parishioners and friends want to take advantage of the opportunity before we jump in. 
