


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.



FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Sending Out 72 Disciples

This weekend, the Word of God invites us to reflect on the profound themes of comfort, mission, and the true source of our joy as disciples of Jesus. The readings from Isaiah, Paul's letter to the Galatians, and the Gospel of Luke together paint a picture of what it means to be a people sent by God, rooted in His love, and rejoicing in what truly matters.

The first reading (Is 66:10-14c) is a beautiful image of God's nurturing love for His people. Jerusalem is depicted as a mother, comforting her children, nourishing them, and bringing them peace. "As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you," says the Lord. This is a powerful reminder that God's love is not distant or abstract, but tender and intimate. He draws us close, especially in times of sorrow or distress, and He promises to restore and renew us.

In our journey of faith, we all experience moments of struggle, doubt, or fatigue. But God invites us to come to Him, to be consoled, and to find our strength in His unfailing love. The peace and joy that flow from God are not dependent on our circumstances, but on His presence with us.

In the second reading (Gal 6:14-18), St. Paul boldly declares, "May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ." For Paul, the cross is not a symbol of defeat, but of victory—victory over sin, over the world, and over all that separates us from God. He reminds us that our true identity is not found in external things, but in being a new creation in Christ.

How often are we tempted to take pride in our achievements, our status, or our possessions? Paul invites us to shift our focus: let the cross be our only boast. It is through the cross that we are reconciled to God, that we receive mercy, and that we are called to share that mercy with others. The mark of Christ is not just something we carry on the outside, but something that transforms us from within.

Finally, in the Gospel (Lk 10:1-12, 17-20), St. Luke presents us with the sending of the 72 disciples. Jesus sends them out, two by two, to prepare the way for Him. He tells them, "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few." The mission is urgent, the task is great, but Jesus does not send them alone. He gives them authority, He instructs

them to travel light, and He tells them to bring peace wherever they go. Notice how Jesus prepares His disciples: He warns them that not everyone will welcome them, but He assures them that their peace will return to them. When the disciples return, they are filled with joy, amazed at the power they experienced. But Jesus gently redirects their joy: "Do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

Here, Jesus teaches us a vital lesson: our deepest joy is not in what we accomplish, but in who we are in God's eyes—beloved children, called and chosen, our names written in heaven. So, what does this mean for us today?



- First, let us allow ourselves to be comforted by God, to rest in His love, and to draw strength from His presence.
- Second, let us boast only in the cross, remembering that our worth and our mission come from Christ's sacrifice.
- Third, let us go forth as joyful disciples, sent to bring peace, healing, and hope to a world in need.

May we never forget that our greatest joy is not in our successes, but in belonging to God, in being part of His family, and in sharing His

love with others. Let us pray for the grace to be comforted, transformed, and sent forth—so that through us, others may experience the peace and joy of Christ. Amen.
