
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

**FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:  
The Good Samaritan**

Today's readings invite us to reflect deeply on the nearness of God's word, the supremacy of Christ, and the practical challenge of loving our neighbor; this weekend's readings tell us that to live as good stewards means to follow God's commands and to live our lives as a gift in service to others.


In the first reading (Deuteronomy 30:10-14), Moses addresses the people of Israel. He tells them that God's commandment is not far away or mysterious. It is not up in heaven or beyond the sea, but "The word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart for you to observe." This is a profound reminder: God's will is not hidden from us. God does not ask us to do the impossible. His law is accessible, understandable, and within our reach. We are called not just to know God's word but to let it dwell in our hearts and guide our actions. The law of love is written on our hearts, and God gives us the grace to live it out.

In our second reading (Colossians 1:15-20), we see God's instruction made even more explicit, in the very person of His Son, Jesus Christ. The Father has sent His own Son to demonstrate how to obey Him and to give us a living example of how we should live our lives as a gift. As St. Paul says, "Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God." This passage reminds us of the centrality of Christ in our faith. He is not just a wise teacher or a good man—He is God made visible. He is the head of the body, the Church, and through His cross, He reconciles all things to Himself. Our faith, our actions, our very lives, must be rooted in Christ, Who reveals to us the fullness of God's love and mercy.

In the Gospel, a scholar of the law asks Jesus, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus responds by asking him what is written in the law. The man answers correctly: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart... and your neighbor as yourself." But then, seeking to justify himself, he asks, "And who is my neighbor?"

Jesus answers with the parable of the Good Samaritan—a story we know well, but one that always challenges us. A man is robbed and left half-dead. A priest and a Levite, both respected religious figures, see him but pass by on the other side. But a Samaritan, someone despised and considered an outsider by the Jews, is moved with compassion. He cares for the wounded man, tends his wounds, and ensures he is looked after. At the end, Jesus asks, "Which of these three was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" The answer is clear: "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus then says, "Go and do likewise."

These three readings converge on a powerful message:



1. God's law is near and within us—we are called to live it out.
2. Christ is the center—the One who reveals God's love and mercy.
3. Love of neighbor is the heart of the law—and our neighbor is anyone in need, regardless of their background, race, or religion.

The Good Samaritan challenges us to move beyond boundaries and prejudices. It is easy to love those who are like us, those who agree with us, those who are part of our group. But Jesus calls us to a radical love—a love that sees the suffering of others and responds with compassion and action. We are called to be Good Samaritans in our world today. Who are the wounded on the side of our roads? They may be the poor, the lonely, the marginalized, the sick, the refugee, or even someone in our own family or parish who needs our time and care.

Let us ask ourselves these few questions this weekend and beyond:

- Do I see the needs of others, or do I pass by?
- Are there prejudices or fears that prevent me from reaching out?
- How can I be Christ's hands and heart to those around me this week?

Let us remember, as Moses said, that God's word is near us. Christ himself is with us, and through His grace, we can love as He loves.

May we allow the word of God to dwell in our hearts, may we recognize Christ in every person we meet, and may we go and do likewise—showing mercy, compassion, and love to all our neighbors. Amen.





### What is EUCHARISTIC ADORATION and why is it important?

- Eucharistic adoration is a way to deepen one's personal relationship with Jesus Christ by spending time in prayer and adoration before the exposed Eucharist.
- It allows for a more intimate experience of Jesus' presence than is possible during Mass.
- It is a source of peace, comfort, and spiritual renewal, and also an opportunity to express love, gratitude, and adoration to Jesus.
- There are no strict rules about what to do during adoration, but it is a time for quiet reflection and prayer. Some might pray the rosary, meditate on scripture, read spiritual books, or simply sit in silence.



The key is to focus on the presence of Jesus and allow oneself to be near Him.

**Did you know that we have EUCHARISTIC ADORATION in the St. Ann Day Chapel every Monday and Thursday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.?**

This means that twice a week there is a chance for you to spend a few minutes or a few hours with the Eucharist, right here at All Souls! When the Eucharist is exposed, it should not be left unattended. Would you be willing to take an hour-long shift watching over the Eucharist? There is a sign-up sheet in the Narthex, or you may call the office at 708-895-6700. We also sometimes need substitutes for regular attendants if you are available to fill in. Thank you!

## RE & Faith Formation

We have wrapped up another session of our Faith Formation Program, my first full year, and it was both a challenge and a pleasure. To begin, we changed the focus of our program from teaching mainly about the Catholic religion, to helping our students grow in their faith and begin to develop relationships with God. We could not have accomplished this without the hard work of the catechists, volunteers, parish staff, and our spiritual leader, Fr. Mark Kalema, as well as the support of the parents. Part of this transition included purchasing new textbooks and sacramental preparation books, and having to rethink not only what we taught, but how we taught it. In the end, I think we did a very good job.

Here are some of our numbers for this past year:

- 154 students
- 17 catechists & 4 additional volunteers (aides, substitute teachers, etc.)
- 35 students receiving Reconciliation and Eucharist for the 1<sup>st</sup> time
- 45 students receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation
- 1 student fully initiated at the Easter Vigil

We modified the sacramental preparation aspects of our program to better prepare students to not only receive the sacraments, but also to become more active members of the parish community. In particular, our Confirmation prep classes saw a lot of changes. New books were implemented for both first and second-year students; all students were expected to choose both saints and sponsors to help them on their journey; and the students were encouraged to sign up for specific ministries. The results included one new music minister, four student lectors, about a dozen regular helpers in the Art & Environment Ministry, and more than two dozen student ushers. I am very pleased that many of these students have decided to try to continue in these ministries.

We also added many different prayer experiences for our students this year. We added Stations of the Cross to the hallway in school, which many of our classes visited and prayed over this year. We welcomed guest speakers for our Confirmation


classes. The students making Confirmation this year and their sponsors spent a special day of reflection at the Carmelite Monastery and Shrines in Munster.

Next year we hope to offer even more of these experiences. Some ideas include having an instructional liturgy to increase understanding of the Mass, taking our students to Adoration, and creating a dedicated prayer space in the school where the catechists can take their classes.

That being said, we would really welcome additional help for the coming year. Please consider being a catechist, aide, or other volunteer. Please pray for our students and their families, and if you have school-age children, please enroll them in our All Souls RE/FF. The program is designed to help all kids grow in their faith, not only to prepare for the sacraments. Registration is now open, and the forms can be found on the All Souls website OR you may pre-fill your family's information at <https://form.jotform.com/251535237881158>. You can sign up in the parish office during regular business hours, and we will have additional registration opportunities available on Sundays in August (see page 6 of the bulletin for dates and times).

I look forward to continuing my work with the All Souls community.


