

**SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
Martha and Mary**

This weekend's readings are full of inspiration for living a stewardship way of life, and all three invite us to reflect on the virtue of hospitality, the mystery of Christ within us, and the balance between action and contemplation in our lives as disciples.

In our first reading (Genesis 18:1-10a), the Hospitality of Abraham, we encounter Abraham sitting at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. Three mysterious visitors appear, and Abraham rushes to welcome them. He bows, offers water to wash their feet, and prepares a generous meal. Abraham's hospitality is immediate, wholehearted, and generous. What is striking here is not only Abraham's kindness but also the outcome of his hospitality: the visitors promise that his wife Sarah will have a son within the year—a promise of blessing and new life. In welcoming the strangers, Abraham welcomes God himself, and his openness brings forth God's blessing.

This story teaches us that hospitality is not just a social custom; it is a sacred encounter. When we welcome others, especially the stranger or the needy, we open ourselves to God's presence and grace. As the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us, "Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels." (Hebrews 13:2) This is the quote we have had on our bulletin for a while as we reflect on our Vision and Mission. Each time you pick up our Church bulletin you are reminded of the virtue of being a hospitable Christian.

In our second reading this weekend, St. Paul (Colossians 1:24-28) speaks of his own suffering for the sake of the Church. He says, "I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake...for the sake of His body, which is the Church." Paul sees his hardships as a way of sharing in Christ's redemptive work.

But Paul also reveals a profound mystery: "The mystery hidden from ages and from generations past. But now it has been manifested to His holy ones...which is Christ in you, the hope for glory." The heart of the Christian life is not just following rules or traditions, but welcoming Christ into our hearts. Christ dwells within us, giving us hope, strength, and the promise of glory. This mystery calls us to recognize the presence of Christ not only in ourselves but in every person we meet. When we practice hospitality, patience, and love, we welcome Christ Himself.

In the Gospel (Luke 10:38-42), Jesus visits the home of Martha and Mary for one of the most famous dinner parties ever thrown. Martha is busy with the work of hospitality—preparing, serving, and making sure everything is in order.

Mary, on the other hand, sits at Jesus' feet, listening to His words. Here we receive a reminder about the proper use of the gift of time, another fundamental aspect of a stewardship way of life. We are told that Martha, as a good steward, welcomes Christ in but then becomes "burdened with much serving" while her sister and fellow hostess choose to simply sit with Jesus, listening to Him speak. Martha, feeling overwhelmed, asks Jesus to tell Mary to help her. But Jesus gently responds, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, and it will not be taken from her."

This scene is not about choosing between work and prayer, but about the priorities of the heart. Martha's service is good and necessary, but she is distracted and anxious. Mary, in contrast, is attentive and present to Jesus. She embodies the attitude of a true disciple: listening to the Lord, making space for His word, and resting in His presence.



All three readings this weekend, together, teach us about welcoming God.

1. Hospitality: Like Abraham, we are called to open our hearts and homes to others, for in them we encounter God.
2. The Mystery of Christ in Us: As Paul teaches, Christ dwells within us and our community. We are temples of His presence.
3. Attentiveness to God: Like Mary, we are called to make time to listen to Jesus, to be present to Him, and to let His word shape our lives.

We live in a world that often values busyness and productivity. We can easily become like Martha—so caught up in doing that we forget to be present to the Lord. Jesus invites us to find balance, to serve others with love, but also to sit at His feet, to pray, to listen, and to receive.

Let us ask ourselves:

- How do I welcome God into my daily life?
- Am I open to the presence of Christ in those around me, especially the stranger or the one in need?
- Do I make time to listen to Jesus in prayer, or am I always busy and distracted?

This week, let us strive to be both Martha and Mary: active in service, but rooted in prayer; generous in hospitality, but attentive to the Lord's voice.

May we, like Abraham, welcome God with open hearts. May we, like Paul, recognize Christ dwelling within us and in others. And may we, like Mary, choose the better part—resting in the presence of Jesus, who is our hope and our glory. Amen.
