
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

## SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY

**TIME: Ask, Seek, Knock**

Today's readings invite us to reflect on the nature and power of prayer, as well as the boundless mercy of God.

In our first reading (Gen 18:20-32), we witness Abraham's remarkable conversation with God. God reveals to Abraham that He is about to judge the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah for their grave sin. But Abraham, moved by compassion, dares to intercede for the people. He respectfully and persistently negotiates with God, asking if the cities might be spared for the sake of fifty, then forty-five, then forty, and so on, down to ten righteous people. Each time, God patiently listens and agrees. This passage reveals two important truths: first, that God is approachable and listens to our prayers; and second, that we are called to intercede for others, to bring their needs before God with trust and humility.

In the second reading (Colossians 2:12-14), St. Paul reminds us of the foundation of our relationship with God: we have been buried with Christ in baptism and raised with Him through faith. Our sins, which once separated us from God, have been forgiven. The record of our debt has been canceled by the cross. This is the greatest act of mercy and love. Because we are reconciled with God through Christ, we can approach Him confidently in prayer, knowing that He loves us as His own children.

In the Gospel (Luke 11:1-13), the disciples ask Jesus, "Lord, teach us to pray." Jesus responds by giving them the Lord's Prayer, the Our Father. This prayer is simple, yet profound. It teaches us to approach God as our loving Father, to seek His will, to ask for our daily needs, forgiveness, and protection from evil. Jesus goes further, telling a parable about a friend who persistently asks for bread at midnight, and assures us, "Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you." He encourages us to be persistent and confident in our prayers, trusting that God, who is far more loving than any earthly parent, will give us what is truly good—above all, the gift of the Holy Spirit.

What do these readings mean for us today? First, they remind us that prayer is not just a ritual or a duty, but a living relationship with a God who listens and cares. Like Abraham, we can approach God with honesty and persistence, bringing our needs and the needs of others before Him. Like the disciples, we can ask Jesus to teach us how to pray, to deepen our trust and openness to God's will.



Second, these readings challenge us to be people of mercy. Abraham interceded for sinners; Jesus teaches us to pray for forgiveness and to forgive others. Our prayer should move us to compassion and action for those in need.

And finally, we are encouraged to persevere in prayer, even when answers do not come immediately or in the way we expect. God's timing and wisdom are perfect. He gives us not always what we want, but what we truly need—His presence, His Spirit, His love.

Let us, then, renew our commitment to prayer: to pray with faith, persistence, and humility; to intercede for others; and to trust in the goodness of our Heavenly Father, who delights in giving us every good gift. May our prayer transform us, and through us, bring God's mercy and love to the world. Amen
