
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: How Much Is Enough?

This weekend's Word of God invites us to reflect deeply on the meaning of life, the pursuit of wealth, and the true riches that endure. All the readings challenge us to look beyond the fleeting and superficial, and to set our hearts on what is eternal. These scriptures remind us why we live the way we do, make the choices we make, and leave other things aside. Let's face it, if we truly embrace this way of life, there will be people who find our choices downright foolish. Today, we will see what God thinks. Spoiler alert: turns out Christian stewards are not the fools!

The first reading (Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23) sets a somber tone. The author, often called Qoheleth, looks at all human endeavors and declares them "vanity"—a chasing after wind. He observes that people labor with wisdom, knowledge, and skill, yet must leave all they have to others. The fruit of our toil, he says, brings anxiety and restlessness. Even at night, our hearts do not find rest. Essentially, the writer asks what is the point of constantly "stressing out" about things that won't last anyway? That's no way to live! Christian stewards, you and I, already know this. We live for a higher purpose — we live for our God and for the things that matter to Him. Our time, talents, and treasure have an everlasting focus because we recognize that these things are all gifts from God, and we use them in gratitude to give Him glory.


In the second reading (Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11), St. Paul gives us the antidote to vanity: "Seek what is above, where Christ is." If we have been raised with Christ, our hearts must be set on heavenly things, not earthly things. Paul calls us to put to death whatever in us is earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed—that last one he calls idolatry. In this letter, St. Paul reminds us how to make decisions so that we can best use the gifts we have been given. In making decisions about our use of time, talent, and treasure, he gives us this advice: "Think of what is above, not of what is on earth." He adds, "Take off the old self with its practices and put on the new self which is being renewed for knowledge in the image of its creator." This is precisely what is taking place within us as we embrace the spirituality of stewardship. We find ourselves living in a continuous process of sloughing off our selfishness (the "old self") and living more for God and others.

To many people in our materialistic world, setting priorities that are not focused on earthly goals such as wealth, status, and power is foolish and naive. But look at what Jesus has to say about priorities in today's Gospel passage from

Luke. He makes it clear that life is not about "stuff." "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

In the Gospel, Jesus is confronted with a request to settle a family inheritance dispute. Instead of getting involved, He

warns: "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." He then tells the parable of the rich fool, a man whose land produces a bountiful harvest. The man decides to tear down his barns and build bigger ones to store his grain, thinking he can then "eat, drink, and be merry." But God says to him, "You fool! This night, your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong? Jesus concludes: "So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."



So, what matters to God, we may ask? Dear friends, the message is clear: Life is not about possessions, but about being rich toward God. The world tells us that happiness comes from having more—more money, more things, more comfort. But Jesus tells us that true life comes from a relationship with God and with others, from love, generosity, and self-giving. To be "rich in what matters to God" means to live for others, to share what we have, to use our gifts in service. It means to recognize that everything we have is a gift, entrusted to us for a time, to be used for God's glory and the good of all.

This weekend and beyond, let us try to look into ourselves and apply our God given gift of life in the following ways:

- **Examine your heart:** What do I treasure most? Is there anything I am clinging to that keeps me from God?
- **Practice generosity:** Give of your time, talents, and resources to those in need.
- **Cultivate gratitude:** Thank God daily for what you have, rather than focusing on what you lack.
- **Seek what is above:** Make time for prayer, the sacraments, and acts of charity.

As we go through this weekend and beyond, let us ask the Good Lord to free our hearts from greed and anxiety. May we set our minds on things above, and become truly rich—not in possessions, but in love, faith, and generosity. Then, when our time comes, we will hear the Lord say, "Well done, good and faithful servant; enter into the joy of your master." Amen.:





Most people think that you need special training or skills to be a catechist, or that you need to have been a teacher. All anyone really needs is their Catholic faith and a willingness to share that faith with others. You do not need a degree in education or any special training ahead of time, just your willingness to share your love of God with others. If you have that, you are qualified to be a catechist. We will help you with everything else.

However, we still need more help! We are currently in need of catechists for our Confirmation 1 class on Sundays and our 6th grade class on Mondays, as well as a couple of aides to be present in the classroom with our younger catechists. 
