

AUGUST 15

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

This feast day commemorates Mary's body and soul taken directly to heaven.



AUGUST 22

The Queenship of Mary

This feast day recognizes Mary as the "Queen of Heaven and Earth" and celebrates her special role in salvation.

**NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
Watchful Servants**

Most people have flown on a plane in their lifetime. Before the flight takes off, one of the attendants says something like, “We’d like your attention for a few moments while we show you some of the safety features of this aircraft...” The attendant then shows you how to fasten the seat belt and advises you to keep it fastened during the flight. You are told the number and location of the emergency exits. And how, in the event of a sudden loss of cabin pressure, an oxygen mask will be lowered in front of you. You are told that under your seat, there is a life jacket for use in the event of having to ditch into the ocean. The idea behind all this is to help the passengers prepare for the unexpected. But few pay attention to what the attendant is saying. If anything, the exercise serves only to further unnerve the nervous.

In the Gospel, Jesus gives us some instructions regarding the flight of life—a flight in which all of us are involved. He tells us to be prepared for the unexpected. Like faithful servants, we should keep ourselves in a state of readiness/preparedness, not out of fear, but in trust and hope. As life goes on, we become increasingly aware of how fleeting it is, and how precarious is the hold we have on it. We are not made of stone but of very fragile material. Life can be taken away from us in the wink of an eye. However, the brevity and fragility of life bring home to us how precious the treasure we carry in earthen vessels is.

Jesus was aware of the uncertainty of life. His parable emphasizes the fact that death can come at any moment. It isn't that God tries to catch us unawares like a thief breaking into a house. That would be unthinkable. Death, not God, is the thief that robs us of life.

The uncertainty of life should not prevent us from enjoying the present. We would all like to arrive at the end our lives with our plans carried out and our work done. But we don't know if we will have that chance. What we do have is an opportunity to be faithful to our responsibilities and commitments daily, like the servant Jesus spoke about. Then we can go forward into the unknown as Abraham did, trusting in God's gracious and loving care.

Once upon a time there was a court jester who for many years had helped to amuse the king and the royal court. But then he committed an indiscretion and was sentenced to death. Before the sentence was carried out, the king summoned him and said to him, “In view of the many happy moments you gave me over the years, I will allow you to choose the method by which you are to die.” The jester thought for a moment and then replied, “Your Majesty, if it's all right by you, I choose to die by old age.” The king was so amused at his answer that he granted him his request. Most of us would make the same choice, but we don't know if we'll get it.



We are servants of the Lord and of one another. Blessed are those servants who are faithful and responsible. The faithful servant doesn't fear the master's return. He (she) welcomes it. Any time is a bad time for the unfaithful servant. Any time is a good time for the faithful servant. “We are not called to be successful, only to be faithful.” (*Mother Teresa*)

What do these readings mean for us today?

- Remember God's faithfulness: Reflect on how God has been present in your life. Let gratitude for His past blessings strengthen your trust in Him for the future.
- Live by faith, not by sight: Like Abraham, step forward in trust, even when the future is uncertain. Faith is not about having all the answers but about trusting the One who does.
- Be vigilant and generous: Don't let the distractions or anxieties of this world lull you into spiritual sleep. Be ready to meet the Lord at any moment—whether in the final coming or in the daily opportunities to love and serve.
- Use your gifts wisely: Ask yourself, “How am I using what God has entrusted to me? Am I building treasures in heaven by acts of love, mercy, and justice?”

May we remember His faithfulness, step forward in trust like Abraham, and live each day in watchful readiness, using our gifts for God's glory and the good of others. Let us pray for the grace to be found faithful and vigilant when the Lord comes, so that we may one day share fully in the joy of His Kingdom. Amen.






Praying for Non-Violence in our Hearts-Schools-Family-Streets




