
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

**TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY OF THE YEAR:  
Places at the Table**

Today's readings remind us of a chief virtue that characterizes the Christian steward: humility. This is a virtue widely thought of as a form of self-abasement. But that understanding is off the mark. Humility is simply the awareness of who (and Whose) we truly are.

Our Old Testament wisdom writer introduced our theme for today with the words: "My child, conduct your affairs with humility..." (Sirach 3,17)

One of my favorite stories on humility is about one of our former presidents (I can't remember which one). He decided to visit a nursing home, and as he was going from one person to another, one patient seemed unimpressed that he was talking to the president. So he asked the patient, "Sir, do you know who I am?" The patient answered, "No, but if you ask the nurse at the desk, she'll be able to tell you."

Humility is the most misunderstood virtue. Most people equate it with thinking of themselves as worthless. In our modern-day society, when we are told that if we don't value ourselves, then no one else will, humility is not a virtue most of us care to cultivate. We would prefer to leave that virtue to the people in monasteries. Well, I'm here to tell you that demeaning ourselves is not a virtue, and it's also not what humility means.

I think the best way of understanding humility is to think of the Latin word from which it comes. It comes from "humus" which means "earth." For me, the best definition of humility is someone who has their feet on the ground, someone who knows who they are and where they stand in relation to God and the rest of creation.

There was a time when human beings thought our planet was the center of the universe and everything else in space revolved around us. We're a lot humbler now in that regard, because we have a better concept of our place in this universe. Whether we're any humbler in other ways is questionable. I'm sure we all know people who still think the universe revolves around them. The point I'm making is that humility is grounded in reality. And a person who is truly in touch with reality is a great person.

Jesus was invited to the house of a leading Pharisee for a meal. When he arrived, He felt that He was being spied upon by the Pharisees. So He decided to do a little spying on them in return. The sight that met His eyes was not an edifying one. The Pharisees were very religious people and

set themselves up as models. Yet here they were scrambling for the places of honor, showing just how proud, vain, and selfish they really were. They were there not to honor their host, but to honor themselves. There can be no true spirituality without humility. Jesús says, "Those who humble themselves will be exalted."

Each Sunday, we are invited to a banquet—the banquet of the Eucharist. Here, Jesus is the host, and we are His guests. Here, there are no special places—you can sit where you wish. Here, privilege, status, and rank have no meaning. Differences don't count. This is because before God, all of us are equal. It's not that we are reduced to the same common denominator. Rather, it is that all of us are raised up. We are like people on a mountain top. On a mountain top, to speak of first and last places, or higher and lower places, would be silly. The same applies to the house of God. Here, every place is a place of honor. Entering here makes everyone equal. When we cross this threshold, privilege blows away like smoke. We have to first be humbled to be elevated. We should carry this spirit out into life with us afterwards.



*"Do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited...and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place." — Lk 14:8bc, 9*

Once, a mayor invited all the people of the town to a banquet. Among those who showed up was a man of great distinction by the name of Daniel. Daniel was a great scholar and a wise man. Yet he was very humble and didn't like being honored. When he arrived, the mayor naturally invited him to sit at the top table. Daniel thanked him but said he would prefer to sit among the poor at the table nearest the door. And that he did. When other distinguished guests arrived, the mayor invited them to sit wherever they liked. Naturally, they chose to sit at the top table. The banquet hall filled up, and eventually, the only place left was one at the bottom table. Then, at the last minute, another distinguished man arrived. The mayor had no option but to take him to the vacant seat. "But this is the bottom table," the man protested. "No, this is the top table," the mayor replied. "I don't understand," the man said. "Wherever Daniel sits is the top table," the mayor answered.

The moral of the story: it's not the place that honors the guest, but the guest that honors the place. We don't know in what place Jesus sat during that meal, but wherever it was, that was the place of honor. The banquet is a symbol of the Kingdom. We shouldn't be concerned about seeking a place of honor in the Kingdom. We should consider it a privilege to be invited at all. In any case, in the Kingdom, every place is a place of honor.



### HAVE YOU HEARD?

As you may be aware, St. Ann Parish has carried a loan for the church building ever since its initial construction in 1996. When St. Ann, St. James, and St. John merged to form All Souls, the Archdiocese of Chicago graciously forgave the existing debt incurred from assessment defaults. But the Archdiocese Assessment was the only debt covered under the Renew My Church Forgiveness Agreement. The capital debt—that is, the debt incurred from the diocese lending the parish funds to build the Church—was not included in the RMC Agreement. Over the years, that capital debt has accrued interest, leaving us with a substantial financial obligation of \$4,298,612.47. Yes, you read that right—over four million dollars!

For several years, we've been working closely with the Archdiocese of Chicago to seek relief from this capital debt—our only viable path forward. After numerous meetings, Zoom calls, and conversations, we're thrilled to share that an agreement has finally been reached. The parish has committed to paying \$350,000 toward the principal, and in turn, the Archdiocese of Chicago has written off the remaining capital debt.

As of the new fiscal year 2025-2026, All Souls Parish carries zero debt related to the church building—a major milestone in our journey! This kind of financial milestone doesn't just lift a burden—it opens doors for future ministry, outreach, and growth.

Thank you for your continued support and prayers—let us go rejoicing!
