


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

This Week's Family Enrichment Night Topic with Fr. Ferdinand: The Social Gospel of Hope for All

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME: Choosing Between God and Money

The readings for this weekend challenge us to reflect on the relationship between faith, justice, and stewardship. They call us to integrity in our dealings, compassion in our prayers, and undivided loyalty to God. Together, they form a powerful reminder that our faith must shape both our spiritual life and our daily actions.

Late one night, a robber wearing a ski mask jumped into the path of a well-dressed man, stuck a gun in his side, and demanded, "Give me your money." Indignant, the affluent-looking man said, "You can't do this. I'm a United States Congressman!" "In that case," replied the robber, "Give me MY money."

In our first reading (Amos 8:4-7), the prophet Amos speaks directly against those who exploit the poor and manipulate systems for personal gain. He condemns dishonest merchants who reduce measures, inflate prices, and cheat the vulnerable. Amos reminds us that God sees every act of injustice, and He will not forget the suffering inflicted on the weak.


This passage is strikingly relevant today. We live in a world where economic systems often favor the powerful, where corruption and greed can leave the poor voiceless. Amos calls us to examine our own lives: Do we contribute, even indirectly, to systems of injustice? Do we prioritize profit over people? God demands integrity, fairness, and compassion in all dealings.

In the second reading (1 Timothy 2:1-8), Paul urges the community to pray for all people, including leaders and those in authority. His vision is of a community marked by peace, godliness, and dignity. Prayer, then, is not only personal but also social. It shapes the world we live in.

Paul's instruction is especially important in times of division and unrest. Instead of withdrawing from society, Christians are called to intercede for it. Prayer for leaders does not mean blind approval of their actions but a plea that they govern with justice, wisdom, and concern for the common good. True worship, Paul reminds us, is expressed in lifting "holy hands without anger or argument," showing that faith is inseparable from charity and unity.

The parable of the dishonest steward (Luke 16:1-13) is one of the most challenging in the Gospels. The steward, facing dismissal, acts shrewdly by reducing the debts of his master's clients, ensuring he will have friends to welcome him later. Surprisingly, the master commends his shrewdness—not his dishonesty, but his foresight and resourcefulness.

Jesus uses this to teach that the "children of light" must also be wise and discerning in how they live. If people can be so clever in securing worldly advantages, how much more should we be intentional and prudent in pursuing eternal life? The Gospel ends with a stark truth: "You cannot serve both God and mammon." Wealth, while not evil in itself, can easily become a rival master. The question is not whether we possess money, but whether money possesses us. We do have to give this man in the Gospel credit for his ingenuity. And, in fact, Jesus does just that by saying, "The master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently. For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light."



What do we learn from this curious parable to help us avoid the worldly thinking condemned in our First Reading and give ourselves away as Jesus did, as is described in our Second Reading? We know this "bad steward" was clever and energetic. He put thought, prudence, and creativity into the plans he made for his self-serving ends and carried out his plans with great success.

What if we put that kind of effort into our own tasks as good stewards of all God's gifts to us? Into our ministries, into the ways we could make more time for prayer as individuals, as couples, as families, and as a parish? What if we got as creative as the "bad steward" in the use of our finances so that we could give more generously to the poor and the advancement of God's kingdom on the earth? That's our lesson and our challenge. We are called to be forward-thinking, savvy, and good stewards of all that our good God has given us. Let's start thinking that way!







Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Recently, Pope Leo spoke to seminarians who had gathered from all around the world for the Jubilee. He invited them to be witnesses of hope. Indeed, the men who are preparing for ordination in the Archdiocese of Chicago are witnesses of hope to us. In the future, they will serve our children, grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Some of our seminarians are in the pre-seminary spiritual year at Bishop Quarter House in the city. Others are completing their college studies at the University of St. Thomas in Saint Paul, Minnesota. Finally, those in the last four-year phase of preparation are being formed at Mundelein Seminary.

Supporting vocations to the priesthood is a task that belongs to all of us in the Church. I want to invite you to express that support in four ways:

- Pray for vocations and our seminarians in preparation
- Encourage those seminarians serving in your parish
- Urge young men to give their lives in service as priests, and
- Make a financial contribution to support our programs of priestly formation.

Prayer, encouragement, recruiting and financial support—all these actions express our gratitude to God for the gift of priestly ministry. These actions also build for the future of our Church and for our children and grandchildren. I would note that given that our seminarians need to invest themselves totally in formation, they are not able to work. Thus, it is up to us to cover the costs not only for their education but other expenses such as health insurance and other personal support.






